Of the London victims, twenty-nine were men ,thirteen women, and two children. The oldest man was seventy-nine, and the oldest woman eighty-four. There was one young man of nineteen, and two children were aged thirteen and fifteen months. In many cases the coroners' juries ex-pressed the opinion in their verdicts that death was accelerated by self-neglect. Some of the victims had described themselves to the guardians as "homeless," and several were found in the streets in a more or less moribund condition. Thirty-seven of the victims in the prov-inces were men, fourteen women, and five children.
