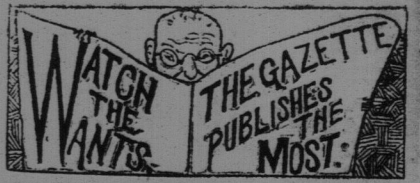

Apprehension of European Powers. Indications of a Russian Scheme of Attack—Likely to Develop itself in the Autumn—An Agreement Between the Czar and the French.

London, March 27, 1891. Lord Salisbury, before starting for St. Rome, held a long conference with Lord Knutsford and Mr. Currie, the permanent secretary of the foreign office.

Something occurring behind the scenes of European diplomacy sharpens apprehension that the final move in the game pending war will not be long delayed. Apart from the removal of the concentration of troops on the Russian Asiatic frontier and the Czar's demonstrative friendship for President Carnot, his reported that an agreement has been reached between the French and Russian governments in regard to the simultaneous mobilization of troops and other movements in the event of war.

The question of Belgian neutrality is intimately associated with England's interests. It is required that the agreement with King Leopold comes up in Parliament. The presence of Lord Knutsford at the conference with Lord Salisbury was not probably due to the relations of Newfoundland with other dominions in France. Questions of which notice has already been given in the House of Commons, to be answered after the Easter recess, demand that the governments explain whether or not the fisheries treaty has become a mere paper.

The matter of amalgamating with the Dominion of Wales is also being considered.
