LANDING BY STEAMER

TO BUILDERS.

The Government will propose to give five thousand a mile subsidy, to be paid fully or in part, in money. The funds will come from a sum in the hands of the Dominion, and to be paid on final adjustment of our claims from money on hand in the Provincial Treasury of from Provincial Debitures. He would prefer cash subsidy, or cash and Debitures. There will, no doubt, be considerable realized from Crown Land sales to go to a railway fund. Without going further into the matter just now, he thought the scheme would meet the approval of the House and people.

After the resolutions were adopted in the House on Monday, it was voted that the House go into committee on Tuesday next. At half-past two the House adjourned till Monday, as members go to Woodstock to-morrow.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.
February 28, March 1—afternoon.
A bill to incorporate the St. John Industrial School was committed—Hon. Mr. Seely in the chair.
Hon. Mr. McFarney proposed an additional section giving corporate powers to any body associated for like purposes. The amendment was opposed by the Hon. Messrs. Young and Seely, on the ground that it would impair the bill in the Assembly. They would support a similar bill from any other deputation.

Hon. Mr. McFarney strongly urged the amendment, and was supported by Hon. Messrs. Hanington and Chandler. School matters and many other things were drawn into the discussion. The amendment was carried by one. The Committee then reported progress.
