

ATTORNEY GENERAL IS ON THE JOB

Takes Hand in Matter and Orders Police Officers to Do Their Duty.

Attorney General Byrne has called the Chief of Police to account for not doing his duty in reference to the enforcement of the Prohibition Act and the Chief of Police has reported 57 the Council as follows:—



The suggestion has been made that one of the new type of enotor cars in operation in Ontario might be tried out here and we feel sure it would be a success.






