At the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of this Province of Nova-Scotia, begun and holden at HA-LIFAX, on the fixth Day of June 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEOR GE the Third of Great Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, &c. And there continued by feveral Prorogations until the Firft Day of November 1784, in the Twenty Third Year of His faid Majefty's Reign, being the Thirteenth Selfion of the Fifth General Affembly convened in the faid Province.

CAP. I.

AN ACT for more effectually raifing a Duty of Excise on Wine, Rum and certain other enumerated Articles, and for preventing Frauds in the Collection of the Revenue.

HEREAS the Duties of Excise beretofore collected within this Province, and the Mode of collecting the fame, bas been found inconvenient, and the Monies arising therefrom infufficient to pay off the Debts, and support the Expences of this Government; for Remedy whereof

I. Be it Enasted by the Governor, Council and Affembly, That from and after the First Day of January, which shall be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty sive; the following Duties of Excile shall be paid on the several Article herein after enumerated, which shall be fold or expended within this Province, viz.

- On all Rum and other diffilled Spirituous Liquors, Three Pence per Gallon.
- On all Porter, Ale or Strong Beer, Five Shillings per Hogshead of Sixty Three Gallons.

Freporters &c. to render Account on Oath to Collectors in 24 Hours after Importation of enumerated Articles, under Penalty of L.100.

Any of the aforefaid Articles, Value exceeding f.5 without Certificate from Collectors, of Account being rendered and found in Cullody of any Perfon, to be coudemnes, the Perfon to Sorfeit f.50.

Mafters and Owners of Veffels in 24 Hours after Arrival in any Port, &c. to make Report of his Loading to the Collector of the Diftrict, on Oath.

Neglecting or Breaking Bulk without Collectors Permit and acting contrary thereto, On all bottled Ale, Porter, Cyder or ftrong Beer, Six Pence per Dozen.

On all Wines in Cafks or Bottled, Three Pence per Gallon.

On all refined Sugar, One Penny per Pound.

On all Tea of every Kind, Two Pence per Pound.

On all Playing-Cards, one Shilling per Pack.

Which faid feveral Duties shall be paid and collected in Manner and under the Rules and Regulations herein after mentioned and expressed; (except the Produce and Manufactures of Great-Britain or Ireland, and legally and directly imported therefrom,) that is to fay, that after faid First Day of January, all Merchants, Distillers, and other Perfons whatfoever, importing or receiving any of the faid herein before enumerated Articles, he or they shall in Twenty four Hours after Importation or Receipt thereof, render an Account on Oath to the Collector of Impost and Excise for the District wherein fuch Merchant, Diftiller or other Person shall live, specifying in-fuch Account the Quantity of each of the faid enumerated Articles fo by him imported or received, specifying the Kind of Packages in which the fame is contained, and the Marks and Numbers" thereof, under the Penalty and Forseiture of One Hundred Pounds to be recovered. and applied in Manner and Form herein after mentioned, and all and every of the faid Articles herein before enumerated, if the Value thereof does exceed Five Pounds, which shall be found in the Custody or Possession of any Person or Persons whatsoever, within this Province, without a Certificate from the faid Collectors that an Account thereof has been rendered to fuch Collectors as aforefaid, fuch Articles fo found shall be liable to be taken in Custody condemned and diffributed in Manner hereafter mentioned, and the Person or Persons in whofe Cuftody the fame shall be found, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty Pounds each, to be levied and applied as herein after mentioned.

II. And be it further Enacted, That all Mafters or Owners of Velfels, having on Board thereof any of the faid enumerated Articles, shall in Twenty-four Hours after the Arrival of fuch Vessel in any Port, Harbour or Creek within this Province, make Report of fuch of the faid enumerated Articles as shall be loaden on Board such Vessel. to the Collector of Impost and Excise for the District wherein such Port, Harbour or Creek shall lie, and shall also report to such Collector the Number of Packages in which fuch enumerated Articles shall be contained, and the Marks and Numbers thereof as well as the Names of the Perfon or Perfons to whom the fame shall be configned, which Report shall be made on Oath, and if such Master or Owner shall neglect to make such Report, or shall on any Account break Bulk before he or they shall have made the fame and obtained a Permit from faid Collectors to unload, or shall act contrary to the Tenor of fuch Permit, or after any of the faid enumerated Articles shall have been

been landed at the Wharf or Landing where fuch Collector fhall appoint, fhall fuffer the fame to be removed or carried away before the fame fhall be guaged or weighed, and Permit obtained from the faid Collectors for the Perfon to whom fuch Articles fhall be configned to remove the fame, the Veffel out of which any of the faid enumerated Articles fhall be fo clandefinicy landed, fhall be liable to be taken into Cuftody, condemned and distributed in Manner herein before mentioned.

III. And be it also further Enasted, That all Diftillers shall on the first day of each and every Month deliver to the faid Collector within whose district such Distill House shall lie, an Account in writing and upon Oath of all Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors remaining in his Possession, and on the first day of each and every Month or within three Days after shall render an Account on oath to faid Collectors of all Rum and other diffilled Spirituous Liquors by them diffilled during the Month then last past, under the Penalty of One Hundred Pounds, to be recovered and applied as herein after mentioned, and if the Business of such distill House shall be carried on under the Direction of a Foreman, then the faid Foreman shall render in monthly Accounts in the Manner herein before directed, and on Failure thereof shall be subject to the same Penalty, that the Owner in such Cafe would be fubject to, and fuch Distiller shall be subject to all the Laws and Regulations herein after mentioned, relative to Stockholders.

IV. And be it further Enected, Thaton Report of all the faid enumerated Articles and every Part thereof being made, and Account rendered to the Collectors of Impost and Excise, as herein before specified, the Collector or Collectors shall grant a Permit in the Form herein after specified to the Master or Owner of such Vessel, to break Bulk and unload at fuch Wharf or Landing, as fuch Collector shall think most convenient to the Importer, and shall cause such of the said enumerated Articles as shall be loaden on Board fuch Vessel to be guaged or weighed, and on the Importer or Person to whom such Goods shall be configned, giving good and fufficient Security to fuch Collectors that he or they shall and will at the End of every three Months render an Account on Oath of the Quantity of fuch enumerated Articles as he or they shall have disposed off, and shall pay to faid Collectors the Amount of the Duties for so much of the faid enumerated Articles as he or they shall have, and in Case after the enumerated Articles fo imported, shall be guaged and weighed as aforefaid, no Person shall appear to give the Security and receive the Permit herein before specified, then it shall and may be lawful for faid Collector or Collectors to caufe the same to be stored in some safe Place, and there kept until some Person lawfully authorized, shall appear to give faid Security, receive such Permit and pay the Charges of Storeage, and if no Perfon

Or after any Articies thall have been landed at the Wharfe &c. where Collectors thail appoint or thall remove the fame without being gauged or weighed, Veffel liable to be condemned.

Diffillers fhall deliver to the Collectors every Month and Account of all Rum &c. remaining in their Hands, on Penalty of £100.

Any Foreman of a Diftill House having the Care thereof liable to the like Penalties.

On Report of all Articles and Accounts rendered to Collectors. Collectors to grant Permits in Form to . be specified, to Maflers and Owners of luch Veffel to unload at fuch Wharfe as the Collectors shall think most convenient to the Importers, and caufe faid Articles to be gauged and weighed, Importers &c. to give good Security to the Collectore, and account on Oath every 3 Months of the Quantity of Articles disposed of and pay Amount of Duties for fo much as he or they shall have. After Articles imported fhall be gauged and weighed,

if noPerfon thall appear to give Security or reserve Permits. Collectors to caufe the fame to be Morad. If no Perfon appears to coinply with fuch Regulations, it that! be lawful for Colleft irs at the End of 6 Months to fell the fame at Auction & after Deduction of Duties, &c. to pay Proceeds into the Treafury, To remain there for the Owner, Collectors not to juffer any Transfer from the Stock of une Stockholder to another, the original Stockholder always to be accountable for the Duties quarterly.

Not necelfary to take Permits to transport any Quantity of Articles, un-lefs they exceed £5. Value and Dutics having been paid, &c. If they shall exceed £5. After 4 Junuary next and be found in the Cuftody of any Perfon without Permit, fuch Articles with the Vessein, Boars, Carts, &rc. in or on which the fame shall be laden, shall be liable to be condemned and the Perfons in whole Cullody the fame shall be found forfeit f.50. Not to extend to Perfons who have millaid their Permit and fhall duly prove the fame.

Collectors previous to fettling Stockholders Accounts may fend proper Officers to their Warehoules, &c.

Perfon shall appear and comply with fuch Regulations, it shall and may be lawful for the Collector or Collectors of fuch District at the End of Six Months, to fell the fame at public Auction, and after Deducting the Duties, Storage and other Expence, to pay the Proceeds into the Treasury of this Province, there to remain for the right Owner, and it shall on no Account whatsoever be lawful for faid Collector or Collectors to fuffer any Transfer to be made from the Stock of one Stockholder to that of another, but the original Importer, Confignee or Diftiller to whole Stock Account any of the faid enumerated Articles shall be entered in the first Instance as aforefaid, shall be always held accountable for the faid Duties of Excife, at the End of every Quarter of a Year, and shall pay the fame for fo much of his faid Stock as shall have been confumed or otherwise disposed off during that Period, 1 and no Stockholder shall have any Credit allowed to him in a Settlement of his Stock Account for any of the faid enumerated Articles charged to his Account, which he or any other Perfon may . export to any of the Out Ports within this Province; but the Perfor or Perfons to whole Account fuch Articles were originally entered, shall be answerable as tho' such Articles exported to faid Outports were confumed within the Diffrict wherein fuch Stockholder fhall refide.

V. And be it further Enacted, That there shall be no Necessity for any Person, to take a Permit, to transport either by Land or Water, any Quantity of the faid enumerated Articles, unless the fame shall exceed the Value of Five Pounds, provided the Duties hereby appointed to be paid thereon, shall be paid or fecured before the Removal of fuch Articles, and if any of the faid enumerated Articles, exceeding the Value of Five Pounds, shall after the Fourth Day of January next, be found in the Custody of any Person or Persons whatfoever, within this Province, without a Permit for the fame, or on which the faid Duties have not been paid or fecured, fuch Articles together with the Vessels, Boats, Carts, Waggons, Horfes or Trucks, in or upon which the fame may be loaden shall be liable to be taken into Custody, condemned and distributed in Manner herein after mentioned, and the Person or Persons in whose Custody the fame shall be found, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty Pound's each, to be levied and recovered in Manner after mentioned, provided nothing in this Claufe shall extend to affect any Person who may have lost or millaid his or their Permit, but upon fuch Perfon, making due Proof of the fame, he or they shall be exempted from the Penalties specified in this Clause.

VI. And be it further Enacted, That it shall and may be hawful for the faid Collectors, previous to settling Accounts with the several Stockholders, to send proper Officers to the Warehouse, Cellars or Stores of the several Stockholders within his District, and it shall and may be lawful for such Officer or Officers to guage and weigh the se-

veral enumerated Articles in the Cuftody of fuch Stockholder, and to make Report of the Quantity thereof to fuch Collector, or in Cafe fuch Stockholder or any Perfon shall interrupt or prevent such Officer or Officers from doing faid Duty, he or they shall forfeit and pay for every Offence the Sum of Ten Pounds each, to be levied and recover, ed as herein after mentioned, and every Stockholder shall in Ten Days after the End of every three Months attend the faid Collectors. and fettle their Stock Account in his Office on Oath; and shall pay immediately to fuch Collectors the Duties of Excife, appointed by this Law, deducting only One and a half, per Cent. on the Sum fo be paid in Lieu of all Waste Loss or Leakage that may arise on such Stock, during faid three Months, and in Cafe fuch Stockholder, shall neglect or refuse to fettle Accounts as aforefaid and pay the Sums fo due, his or their Bonds, shall immediately be put in Suit against him or them and fuch Stockholder over and above the Sum or Sums recovered on fuch Bonds, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Ten Pounds for each and every Neglect or Refusal, to be recovered and disposed off as herein after mentioned.

VII. And be it further Enasted, That in Cafe any of the faid enumerated Articles being refhipped or exported out of this Province to any other Country not within its Jurifdiction, that the Master of the Vessel and the Stockholder from whole Stock fuch of the faid enumerated Articles shall be so reshipped or exported, shall first take a Permit from the faid Collectors to authorize fuch Exportation, and after fuch of the faid enumerated Articles fo to be exported shall be loaden on Board the Ship or Vessel so to carry the same away, that then the Master of fuch Vessel and the faid Stockholder shall make and subscribe the following Affidavit before the faid Collectors, out of whofe Diffrict fuch Exportation is to be made,

Which Affidavit, when made, shall be filed in the faid Collectors Office, and so much of the faid Stockholders Stock, as shall be specified in fuch Affidavit, and Permit shall be put in Suspence, and no Part of the faid Excise Duties shall be demanded thereon for nine Months, and if any Time before the Expiration of the faid nine Months, the Stockholder fo exporting, shall produce an authentic Certificate from the Collectors in Chief of the Duties or Cuffoms for the Kingdom. Province or Country, to which fuch Exportation shall be made that the Articles specified in such Affidavit, have actually been landed within fuch Collectors District, that then it shall and may be lawful for the faid Collectors of Impost and Excile to give fuch Stockholder Credit

Articles refhipped or exported out of the Province, Mafter of the Veffel and Stockholder shall first take a Permit to authorize luch Exportation, and after fuch Articles shall be loaden ön Board the Veffel, the Mafter and Stockholder to fubicribe a Oath Sefore Collectors.

Which shall be filed with the Collectors. and fo much of faid. Stockholders Stock as specified in faid Oath. No Part of laid Excife Dutles shall be demanded for Nine Months, if hefore the Expiration of faid 9 Months, the Stockholder fo exporting fhall pro-duce a Certificate from the Collector of the Kingdom, &c. to which fuch Exportation has been made, and landed.

Then the Collectois may give fuch Stockholder Credit for Amount of the Duties exported. On neglect of producing faid Certificate to fland charged with and liable to pay full Amount of Duties on the Artieles exported. The Perfon or Perfons in whole Cuftody the fame shall be found to forfeit £.50. for erch Offence.

Storekeeper of his Maj's. Carcening Yard, Contractor or Agent, importing Rum, &c. for the Uie of faid Yard or Navy to enter the fame with the Collectors on Failure to fuffer the like Penalties imposed on other Persons by this Act.

Storekeeper or Contractor or Agent purchafing Rum &c. from any of the Stockholders for the Ule of Navy, &c. the Commillioner of the Yard or Officer commanding the Navy to certify to the Governor and Council the neceffly to purchale and Quantity acceffary. The Governor with Advice of Council, Credit for the Amount of the Excise Duties on the Articles fo export_ ed, and in Cafe fuch Stockholder shall neglect to produce such Certificate or Certificates before the Expiration of faid nine Months, that then and in fuch Cafe fuch Stockholder shall stand charged with, and be liable to pay the full Amount of the Excise Duties on such Articles fo exported, in as full and ample aManner, as if the fame was confumed within this Province, and if any Veffel or Veffels shall be found relanding of any of the faid feveral enumerated Articles in any Part of this Province after the fame shall have been cleared out for Exportation as aforefaid, fuch Vessel or Vessels with all the faid feveral Articles on Board thereof, shall be taken into Custody, condemned and distributed in Manner here after mentioned, and all Perfons aiding or affifting in Landing the same, shall forfeit and pay on Conviction the Sum of One Hundred Pounds, to be levied and disposed off in Munner here after mentioned, and if any of the faid enumerated articles shall after Exportation thereof be found in the Custody of any Person or Persons within this Province, fuch Article or Articles shall on due Proof thereof be taken intoCustody, and condemned and distributed inManner herein after mentioned, and the Perfon or Perfons in whole Cuftody the fame shall be found, shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty Pounds each for every Offence, to be levied and distributed in Mannes herein after mentioned.

VIII. And be it further Enabled, That if the Storekeeper of his Majefty's Careening Yard, or the Contractor, or his or her Agent, for supplying his Majesty's Navy, shall import into any Part of this Province, any Rum or other distilled Spirituous Liquors for the Use of his Majesty's Careening Yard or Navy, fuch Storekeeper and Contractor, or his or her Agent shall enter the same with the Collector of Impost and Excise in the Manner and Form herein before directed for Perfons importing any of the faid enumerated Articles into this Province, and on Failure of complying with all or any of the Regulations herein before specified as necessary to enable him or them to become Stockholders within this Province, for fuch Importation, fuch Storekeeper or Contractor shall be liable to pay and suffer all the Penalties and Impositions laid or imposed on any other Person by this Act, and in Cafe it may be neceffary for the Storekeeper of his Majesty's Careening Yard, or Contractor, or his or her Agent for fupplying his Navy, to purchase from any of the Stockholders of this Province any Rum or other distilled Spirituous Liquors for the Use of faid Yard or Navy, that it shall and may be lawful for the Commissioner of the faid Yard for the Time being, or the Commanding Officer of the Navy for the Time being, to certify to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, and the Council of this Province, the Neceffity there is to make such Purchase, and the Quantity necessary to be bought, and it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief, with the Advice of His Majefty's Coun-

Council to grant a Licence under Hand to fuch Storekeeper or Contractor, to make fuch Purchases, and after fuch Purchase shall have been made, it shall and may be lawful for the faid Storekeeper or Contractor, or his or her Agent, by Memorial, to inform the faid Go. vernor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief and Council, of the Quantity fo by him bought from any Stockholder within this Province, and it shall and may be lawful, if it shall appear to the faid Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, that no unfair Practice has been used in such Purchase to give Licence under hisHand to the Collectors of Impost and Excise to give Credit to such Stockholder in the Settlement of his Stock for the Amount of the Excise Duties on such Rum or other distilled Spirituous Liquors fo purchased from him, and the Amount thereof shall be charged to the Stock Account of fuch Storekeeper or Contractor or his or her Agent. and the faid Storekeeper and Contractor and his or her Agent shall fettle their Stock Account Quarterly with the Collectors of Impost and Excise, in the Manner herein before specified, for other Stockholders to fettle the fame, and shall fuffer their faid Stock to be guaged whenever the faid Collector shall order the fame to be done, and fuch Store keeper or Contractor on fuch Quarterly Settlement shall produce an Account of the Manner in which the Quantity of Rum or other distil. led Spirits which faid Stock shall be deficient, have been disposed off, which Account shall be rendered on Oath by faid Storekeeper or Con_ tractor, or his or her Agent, and fuch Storekeeper or Contractor or hi or her Agent shall produce Certificates from the faid Commissioner or the Commander of fuch Ship or Ships of War, to whom the feveral Ar. ticles contained in faid Account have been delivered, and the faid Collectors shall give the Stock Account of such Storekeeper or Contractors Credit for the Amount of the Duties of faid Rum or other Spirits, the Disposal of which shall be so accounted for and certified, and if there shall be any Part of the Difficiency of fuch Stock, which the faid Storekeeper or Contractor or his or her Agent shall be unable to Account for as aforefaid, fuch Storekeeper or Contractor, or his or her Agent shall be compelled to pay the faid Excise Duties on such Dificiency in fuch Manner and Form and under fuch Penalties as any other Stockholder within this Province would be compelled to pay the fame, and in Cafe fuch Storekeeper or Contractor or his or her Agent shall refuse or neglect to account Quarterly with faid Collectors. or to fuffer their Stock to be guaged or weighed, fuch Storekeeper or Contractor and his or her Agent shall be liable in every Shape to pay fuch Penalties as any other Stockholder in this Province would in fuch Cafe be liable to pay.

Credit for Amount of Duties. Any Deficiency of fuch Stock, Storekeeper, &c. to

pay the Dutics under like Penalties of all other Stockholders ; in Cafe Storekeeper &c. Inall refuse or neglect to Account Quarterly and faffer their Stock to be gauged of weighed, to be liable to the same Penalties as other Stockholders in this Province. If any Rum &c. be removed or thipped on Board any Ship or Veffel by fuch Contractor, &c. without Permit obtained from faid Collectors, or Rum &c. after iffued to any of his Majefty's Ships or Artificers in the Careening Yard, or shall be brought an Shore or out of the Walls of laidYard and offer'd for Sale, faid Ruin, &c. to be taken into Cuitedy and condemned; and all Perfons offering faid Rum for Sale or who fhall aid or affitt to forieit f. 160. each.

All Caufes on Breach of this Act, may commence by Bill, Plaint &c. in his Majefty's Supreme or Inferior Court., Defendants in fuch Suits may plead general lilue, may have a Special Jury to try laid Issues, in Case Verdict shall be found again#Defend ntor Claimant they shall pay all taxed Cofts. Any Perfon whofe Tellimony may be necessary for either Party on Trial &c. Judges may take Depositions de bene effe . Notice being first given to the Adverie Party, Depolition to be fealed up and ufed as Evidence. AllFines &L. recovered one half to be for the Province and remainder for thePro--fecutor after deduction of Expences Profecution to be in 12 Months from Time of Offence committed.

No Stockholder fhall be a Retailer or fhall fell a Quantity lefs than 3 Gallons, under a Penalty of £.20. without first obtaining

IX. And be it further Enasted, That if any Rum or other distilled Spirits shall be removed from Place to Place, or shipped on Board of any Ship or Veffel by fuch Contractor or his or her Agent or Storekeeper without Permit first obtained from the faid Collectors, or if any Rum or other distilled Spirits after it has been issued to any of his Majefty's Ships or Artificers in his Majefty's Careening Yard, shall be brought on Shore again or brought without the Wall of faid Yard; and Sold or offered for the Confumption of any Perfon or Perfons whatfoever, within this Province, the whole of fuch Rum or other diftilled Spirits shall be taken intoCustody, condemned and distributed in Manner herein after mentioned; and all Perfons concerned in felling or offering any of faid Rum or other diftilled Spirits as aforefaid; or who shall be aiding or affisting or privy thereto, shall forfeit and pay each the Sum of One Hundred Pounds for each and every Offence to be levied and distributed in Manner herein after mentioned.

X. And be it further Enasted, That all Caufes on Trials for Forfeitures and Penalties on a Breach of this Act or any Part thereof, shall and may commence by Bill, Plaint or Information in his Majefty's Supreme Court or Inferior Courts of Common Pleas within this Province, and his Defendant or Defendants in fuch Suits may plead the general Issue, and may on Motion have a Special Jury according to the usual Practice of faid Court; to try faid Isfue or Isfues; and in Cafe the Jury shall find a Verdict against the Defendant or Claimant, he or they shall pay all Costs to be taxed, and in Case that any Person or Persons whole Testimony may be necessary to be used for ekther Party on Trial, shall or are obliged to leave the Province, it shall and may be lawful for the Depositions of fuch Witnesses to be taken de bene elle before one of the Judges of faid Superior or Inferior Courts for any Part of this Province; Notice being first given to the Advetse Party, and such Depositions shall be fealed up by such Judge, and used and admitted as evidence to the Jury on fuch Trial; and the Money arifing from all Penalties and Forfeitures adjudged under this Law, after Deducting any extraordinary Expences of Profecution not taxed against the Defendant, shall go and be applied one Half to his Majesty for the Use of this Province, and the other Half to him who shall feize or inform and fue for the fame, and all Profecutions in Pursuance of this Act. shall be commenced within Twelve Months from the Time of the Offence committed.

XI. And be it further Enasted, That no Stockholder of Rum, Wine, Porter, Ale, Beer or Molasses, or distilled Spirituous Liquors, within this Province shall be a Retailer thereof, or shall sell or vend a less Quantity of such Liquors than three Gallons under a Penalty of Twenty Pounds for each and every Offence, to be recovered and applied as aforesaid, without such Stockholder first obtaining a Shop or Tavern Licence,

Licence, and shall then fell or retail in such Shop no less a Quantity

than one quart under the Penalty of Twenty Pounds, to be levied and applied as aforefaid, nothing in this claufe to be contained to extend to prevent any Stockholder from fupplying his Servants or Labourers with any Quantity of faid Liquors; provided the fame shall have paid the Duty required by the feveral Laws of this Province.

XI. And be it further Enalited, That when any Ship or Veffel, having any of the herein before enumerated Articles on Board, shall arrive within the Diffrict of any Collector or Collectors of Impost and Excise within this Province, fuch Collector or Collectors, if fuch Ship or Vessel, shall break Bulk within his District shall immediately take proper Steps as herein before directed, to ascertain the Quantity of fuch enumerated Articles, and shall on no Account suffer faid Vessel, or any of the faid enumerated Articles to depart out of his Cuftody until the Importer thereof, or some other Person on his Behalf shall enter the fame to his Stock Account, and shall give good Security, as herein before specified faithfully to Account for the Disposal thereof, and to perform every other Matter and Thing required by this Act, and the Excise Duties on all faid enumerated Articles shall be secured in the Diffrict wherein they shall be first imported, and the Stockholder to whole Account the fame shall be first placed, and his Bondseman shall be the only Person to Account for the Disposal thereof, and no Person shall be admitted to open a Stock Account with any of the faid Collectors, unless the enumerated Articles, fo to be entered to his Account shall exceed the Value of Hundred Pounds.

An Act for more effectually raifing a Revenue within this Province, for the Support of its Government.

HEREAS the Revenue beretofore raifed within this Province, bas been found inconvenient and infufficient; We do therefore grant unto His Most Excellent Majesty, bis Heirs and Successfors for the public Use of this Province, and the Support of the Government thereof, the Rates and Duties bereaster mentioned.

I. Be it Enacted by the Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the first Day of January, which will be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-five, there shall be paid on the several Articles herein after enumerated, which shall or may

' Which faid Rates and Duties shall be paid and collected in the Mander and Form herein after mentioned, that is to fay, all Rates and Duties arising to his Majesty by Virtue of this Act, shall be paid at the Time of Entering the feveral Articles herein before enumerated, if the Sum to be paid on Account of faid Rates and Duties by any one Perfon out of any one Cargo shall not exceed the Sum of Twenty Pounds, and in Case the Amount of such Rates and Duties so to be paid by any one Perfon as aforefaid, shall exceed the faid Sum of Twenty Pounds, then it shall and may be lawful for the Collector or Collectors of fuch Rates or Duties, to give fuch Perfor Six Months Credit for the Payment thereof, on his Procuring one good and fufficient Bondíman, to join with him in a Bond or Obligation to fuch Collector or Collectors, and his or their Successors in Office. for the Use of this his Majesty's Province, in double the Amount of fuch Sum To to be credited, the Condition of which Obligation shall be, that fuch Perfons to bound, their Heirs, Executors or Administrators shall well and truly pay to fuch Collectors or their Succeffors for the Ufe aforefaid, in Six Calender Months, from the Date thereof, the full Amount, of fuch Sum or Sums fo to be credited without any Abatement or Deduction on any Account whatfoever, and in cafe the Perfor or Perfons, importing any of the feveral Articles herein before enumerated into any Port, Harbour or Creek within this Province, shall after Entry thereof refuse or neglect to pay or fecure the Payment of the feveral Rates or Duties herein before mentioned, or to caufe the fame to be pakl or fecured, it shall and may be lawful for the Collector br Collectors to take into Custody for much of the faid Articles fo fubject to the faid Rates or Duties herein before mentioned, as shall be fufficient to pay and discharge the whole Amount of such Rates or Duties as shall be due on such Importation, and after publickly Advertizing the fame, to have been feized on Account of fuch Neglect, it hall and may be lawful for fuch Collector or Collectors, if no Perion

II. And be it further Enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if the Master, Owners or Crew of any Veffel or Veffels what foever, having on Board any of the feveral dutiable Articles before enumerated, after their Arrival in any Port, Harbour or Creek in this Province, shall on any Account whatfoever break Bulk or discharge any Part of herCargo, or cause the same to be done until fuchCargo shall be reported to theCollectors of Impost and Excife for the Diftrict wherein fuch Port, Harbour or Creek shall lie, or shall on any Account after Report so made, break Bulk or discharge any Part of the Cargo of said Vessel before Permit in Writing for that Purpose had from such Collector or Collectors; shall discharge contrary to the Tenor of fuch Permit, or shall after Permit obtained. remove or carry away from the Wharf or Landing where the faid Collectors shall direct, such Cargo to be landed any Article or Articles which shall be subject to the Rates or Duties before mentioned, before the fame shall be gauged or weighed by the proper Officer, and the Duties paid or fecured as aforefaid, and a Special Permit obtained from faid Collectors for that Purpole, that then and in all fuch Cafes, it shall and may be lawful for such Collectors or others lawfully authorized to feize fuch Vessel and Cargoe, and the fame shall be condemned in Manner hereinafter expressed, and shall be fold, and one Half the neat Proceeds thereof shall go to the Informer, and the other Half to his Majesty for the Use of this Province; and all Persons aiding and assisting in such Clandestine, breaking Buik, discharging or removing any of faid dutiable Articles herein before enumerated, shall on Conviction in Manner herein after specified, forfeit and pay the Sum of Fifty Pounds each, one Half to the Informer, and the other Half to his Majesty as aforesaid, and all Horses, Carts, Trucks, Waggons, Boats, Shallops or other Craft, of what Kind foever, which shall be found with any of fuch dutiable Articles loaden in or upon the fame, before the faid Duties shall be paid or fecured as aforefaid, and Permit had for the Removal thereof, fuch Carts, Trucks, Waggons, Boats, Shallops or Craft, shall be feized as aforefaid, and condemned and diffributed in Manner herein directed.

III. And be it further Enasted, That if any Perfon or Perfons shall transport any Quantity of the faid enumerated Articles not exceeding the Value of Two Pounds from Place to Place whether by Land or by Water without Permit sirst had and obtained from the Collector of the District from whence such Articles are to be removed, which Permit shall specify the Place to which such Articles are to be carried, or shall be found going with such dutiable Articles a Road or Course contrary to that specified in such Permit, or shall neglect to enter such Permit

And be it further Enasted, That when any Person or Persons schule apply to the Collectors of Impost and Excise for a Permit to remove either by Land or Water any of the herein before enumerated Articles, that then such Person or Persons shall make and subscribe an Affidavit to the following Purpose, viz.

*XXXX * E it Enalied by the Governor, Council and Affembly, That A from and after the 31st Day of December, 1784, the Clerks or Receivers of the Licence Duties in eachCounty B 🕱 within this Province, shall return a just Account every *XXXX* half Year to the Justices of the General Session of each County or District, except the Town or District of Halifax, of the Monies to by him or them collected, and thall pay the fame half yearly into the Hands of the County Treasurer; And in Case such Receiver or Receivers shall neglect or refuse to render such Accounts and pay in fuch Monies as aforefaid, he or they shall forfeit for each & every Offence the Sum of Twenty Pounds, to be recovered by the Judgment of fuch Seffions, and applied to the Purpose of Repairing Roads within fuch County, and the faid Justices by and with the Advice of the Grand Jury for fuch County are hereby empowered to lay out, and expend fuch Monies for Repairs of Roads and Bridges within their respective Counties and Districts, and to account with, and receive from the faid Clerks or Receivers all Monies now remaining due for Licences heretofore obtained, which have not been paid into the Treasury of this Province, and in Case such Receiver or Receivers fhall neglect or refule to render fuch Accounts and pay fuch Monies, he or they shall forfeit and pay the Sum of Twenty Pounds for each and every Refufal or Neglect, to be recovered and applied as aforefaid,

II. And be it further Enasted; That the Receiver of the Licence Duties within the Town and District of Halifax; shall account with the Treasury of the Province half yearly, and shall pay into the Treasury all such Monies as he shall receive, which Monies shall be applied to and for the Purpose of making and repairing Roads within Ten Miles of faid Town of Halifax; the same to be laid out and expended under the Direction of the Governor; Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, and that this Act, and also an Act passed in the Eighth Year of his Majesty's Reign, intituded, "An "Act for Suppressing unlicenced Houses and for Granting to his Mater jesty a Duty on Persons hereaster to be licenced," except such Part thereof as is hereby before altered and amended, shall be and remain in full Force to the Thirty First Day of December, in the Year of Sur Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty-five.

HEREAS bis Most Gracious Majesty has been pleased to recommend, that all Molasses, Rum and other distilled Spirituous Liquors imported into this Province, or purchased therein for the Use of his Careening Yard or Navy, should be exempted and free from the several Duties laid or imposed thereon from Time to Time, by the Laws of this Province, and we being "Ver willing readily and chearfully to comply with the Wishes of our Most Gracious Sovereign, in Conformity thereto:

I. Be is Enacted by the Governor, Council and Affembly, That from and after the First Day of January next, if it shall or may be necessfury for the Storekeeper of his Majesty's Careening Yard, or for the Contractor for Supplying his Majesty's Navy, to import into this Province, for the Use of the faid Yard or Navy, any Molasses, Rum or other distilled Spirituous Liquors, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the Time being, by and with the Advice of his Majesty's Council, to order the Collector of Impost and Excise for the District where such Importation thall be made, to grant a Permit for such Rum or other Spirituous Liquors to be landed and stored, free and clear of all Duties or other Rates and Charges imposed thereon by the feveral Laws of this Pro-Vince, which Order the faid Collectors of Impost and Excise are bound to obey, Provided always, that before such Order shall be made for the Use of Naval Storekeeper, if such Importation shall be made for the Use of

If neceflary for Naval Storekeeper or A Contractor, & G, of his Majefty's Navy to import for the Ufe of the Careening Yard or Navy any Molaffes or Spirituous Liquors, the Governor with Advice of Council to order Collectors to grant Permits for fuch Spirituous Liquors to be landed, clear of all Duties.

Declaration and producing Certifi. cate as directed by the 8th and 9th Sec. of the Act for raifing a Duty of Excife on Wines, &c. &alfoCollectorsCertificate of Amount of Duties paid or fecured on fuch Melasses, &c. then the Governor, &c. to direct the Treafurer to pay to the Perfon from whom Purchase was made Amount of Duties by him paid or fecured.
