Quick as lightning came the child's philosophic and clinching response, "are you a sheep Mr. Mundy?"—[Knickerbocker, or New York Magazine.]

One evening John Clerk (Lord Eldin) had been dipping rather too deeply in the convivial bowl with a friend in Queen Street, and on emerging into the open air his intellects became a considerable degree confused, and not being able to distinguish objects with any degree of minuteness or certainty, he thought himself in a fair way of losing the road to his own house in Picardy Place. In this perplexity he espied some one coming towards him, whom he stopped with this query, "D'ye ken whaur John Clerk bides?" "What's the use o' yer speerin' that question?" said the man, "ye're John Clerk himself." "I ken that," answered John, "but it's no himsel that's wanted, it's his house."

MUSIC THROWN TO THE COCKS.—A writer in Fraser contends that poultry enjoy musical sounds, stating that he has often gratified a feathered audience. A noble cock "would come with all his train, and comport himself like a first-rate critic at the opera, listening with half-closed eyes, while we sang softly "The Meeting of the Waters," or some other wild and straggling, or if a stupid or insensitive hen, intent on her sand bath, shuffled too noisily, he would give her a peck to teach her betters manners. The performance generally ended with "Over the Hills and Far Away!"—the termination of which invariably elicited a hearty crow.

PAPER HOUSES.—A paper village for exportation was recently set up in the grounds of a factory. It consisted of ten houses. It is not the simple paper mache as ordinarily used, but contains an admixture of rags not reduced to pulp, which enables it to solidify as hard as a board. The walls are double, to ensure ventilation, and the partitions have a strength and durability which will put to shame the lath and plaster mockeries of too many of the London houses that Jack built. It was found on trial that one of the smaller houses could be pulled down and built up again in four hours.

EXTREME LENGTH OF THE HAIR.—Sir Charles Wilkins states that while he was resident at Benares, he saw a Fakir, the hair of whose head reached the enormous length of twelve feet.—[Saturday Magazine, No. 166.] The tails hair of the Chinese frequently reach the ground, and their mistresses have been cultivated to the length of 8 or 9 inches. White mentions an Italian lady whose hair reached to her feet when she stood upright; the same observation may be made of the Greek women. A Prussian soldier had his hair long enough when loosened to touch the ground; and in several instances English ladies have had it six feet long.—[Rowland on the Hair.]

DEMOGRAPHY OF THE POPULATION OF THE SANDWICH ISLANDS.—The native population are melting away like snow before a summer's sun. The official returns of James W. Marsh, Esq., to the Governor of Oahu, in the Islands, for the year 1853, show the following results for the First District, in which Honolulu is situated:—Births 191; deaths 3769; marriages of natives 453; marriages of foreigners 62. This district is comprised between Mauauna on the east, and Mowaka on the west, a distance of some fourteen miles, and containing a population of about 10,000 souls. The deaths from small-pox, included in the above, are supposed to be above 2500—the balance from other diseases.

In the same district, during the year 1854, there were births 267, deaths 906, marriages 418. It is to be remarked that it was in this district that the small-pox first broke out, and was more fatal perhaps, than in any other portion of the Islands. From the limited returns that have been collected, we infer that the population does not exceed 70,000 souls on all the Islands—a diminution of 10,000 since the census of January, 1849.

Statistics of the population of the Cooks district, from the official returns:—Natives, 10,196; Foreigners, 1169—total, 11,365. In 1850 the number was 14,484, showing a decrease of 3119 in three years.
