He had that Canada had been growing into an indepen-dent nation since 1840, especially since the Confederation in 1867. Since 1880 Can-ada's stemi-continental inter-oceanic territory had greatly fostered the sentiment. However, there were influences that might work for annexation. Taxation, general and local was about as high in Canada as in the United States, being in Nova Scotia \$9.45 per capita as against \$11.25 in Vermont, but the Ver-monters' burden would be lessened by \$2 before 1900 by the payment of the debt. No statute can be quoted decree-ing that the Imperial Government is not to vato sariff legislation passed by the Canadian Parliament. But when Governor-General Lorne assented to the Protectionist N.
