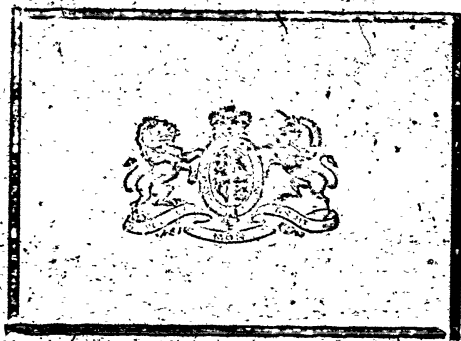
God save our Gracious King,
