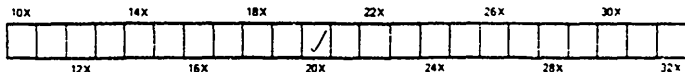

Consecration of Rochester Cathedral

On the 10th inst. the cathedral of the Most Holy Trinity in Rochester was consecrated by His Grace the Archbishop of New York, in the presence of the Roman Catholic hierarchy in the city of Rochester, but in Western New York also.

It was within the life-time of men still among us that the site of this magnificent edifice was a wilderness without human habitation. The first vestige of the Catholic ministry was in 1818 by Rev. Patrick McCormick, sent out as a missionary by the then Bishop Connolly of New York, for the few scattered members of his church who gathered in the parlor of the residences of a Protestant fellow citizen kindly and liberally thrown open to them for celebration of the Mass.

His successor, Bishop Dubois, came to Rochester in 1851 to dedicate the second church, St. Nicholas. In 1853 he was succeeded by Archbishop Hughes, who in 1858 consecrated the cathedral of the Most Holy Trinity, now known as St. John the Baptist. The consecration ceremony began at 7 o'clock and was performed by Archbishop Corrigan. The Archbishop and his assistants formed in procession at the episcopal residence and headed by the Archbishop proceeded to the cathedral. The Mass was celebrated in the cathedral at 10 o'clock.

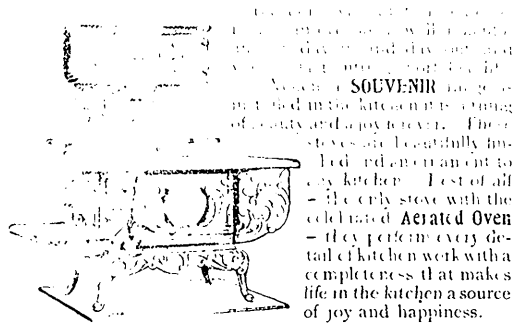
