ECLIPSES.

There will this year be four Eclipses of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. The 22d January, there will be an Eclipse of the Sun, visible only in a small part of the Austral Ocean.

II. The 5th February, there will be a total Eclipse of the Moon, visible at Quebec :—commencement, 7h. 21m. evening; middle, 9h. 7m.; end 10h. 53m. The Moon will be totally eclipsed from 8h. 18m. till 9h. 56m.

III. The 21st of February, there will be a partial Eclipse of the Sun, visible in part of Greenland and Iceland.

IV. The 18th July, there will be a partial Eclipse of the Sun, visible in Greenland, Iceland and the North of Europe.

V. The 5th August, there will be a total Eclipse of the Moon, visible at Quebec :—commencement, 3h. 12m., in the morning; total at 4h. 18m.; at 4h. 38m. the Moon will set totally eclipsed.

VI. The 16th August, there will be a partial Eclipse of the Sun, visible in the Austral Ocean.

VI. Le 16 août, éclipse partielle de soleil visible sur l'Océan Austral.

CHANGES OF THE MOON.

Many persons understanding that the mean time between one new Moon and another is 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes and a fraction, imagine that to find full or quarters of the Moon, they have only to take a half or fourth part of that time ; and when they do not find the changes marked in the Calendar to correspond with this method, they impute it to mistake in the calculation of these changes. It is, therefore, necessary to put them in mind, that the great inequality of the Moon's motions renders the above extremely inaccurate, so that nineteen times in twenty, it must fail in giving the true conjunction or opposition.

LIGHT-HOUSE ON POINTE DES MONTES.

Keeper.....James Wallace.

Will shew a light every evening from sunset to sunrise, between the first of April and the thirty-first of December inclusive.

The following notice was published by the Trinity House, relating to this Light-House :

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

That a Light-House has been erected on Point des Monts, (or Cape Monts Pelés) on the north side of the River St. Lawrence, nearly opposite to Caribou Chat, the Lantern standing one hundred feet above the water.

The Light-House lies with the outermost part of Caribou Point, N. 52° . East and South 52° . We by the Compass, and it can be seen over that point and to the Eastward of it.

Ships approaching the Light from the Eastward, they draw towards Caribou Point, must bring it bear W. by S.; they will then be in a good fair way and if necessary, they can near the land by the lead.

After passing Caribou Point, and as they draw towards the Light-House, they must come no nearer than 12 fathoms water to avoid two ledges of rock, one of which lies E. S. E. from the Light, with only given 12 feet of water on it; the other lies S. W. from the Light, and E. S. E. from the Western extremity of Pointe des Monts, with 16 feet water on it; but the rocks do not lay farther from the shore than half a mile at low water.

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LIGHT-HOUSES.

The Light-House lays with the western extremity of Pointe des Monts N. 64°. East and South 64°. West, and distant about one mile; and when ships are to the Westward of the Point, the Light-House is in one with the outermost rocks off the Point; and in day time it forms a bold distinct Land Mark, and on this line of bearing ships are in the best possible fair way for the general purposes of Navigation, whether bound up or down.

For any particular purposes of Navigation, ships may safely stand to the Northward, until the Light bears E. by N.; they will then be drawing near the North land: and when it bears E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. it is time to back; for when it bears East it will shut in with the High Land, and cannot be seen to the Southward of East, and then they will be only one mile from the land, and if they are off Godbut River, Pointe des Monts will bear from them E. by S. two leagues distant.

When ships are off Saint Nicolas Harbour, and the light bearing E. by N. they are in a good fair way from the North land. The S. E. spit of Manicouagan great Shoal, the ship and the Light-House are then all in one line of bearing.

LIGHT-HOUSE ON S. W. POINT OF ANTICOSTI.

Keeper.....John Hammond.

A Light-House having been erected on the South West Point of the Island of Anticosti, notice is hereby given that a grand Revolving Light, on the Argand principle, was shewn thereon for the first time, on the 25th of August, 1831, and that the said light will continue to be shewn every night from sunset to sunrise, from the 1st April to the 15th December, in each year inclusive.

LIGHT-HOUSEES.

When ships are to the Eastward of the Light-House, they may safely stand towards the Island until it bears N. N. W. by Compass—they will then be in a good fair way—and if they wish to make more free with the land, they can do so by their lead. The land trends from the Light-House S. E. by S. nearly so.

When ships are to the Westward of the Light-House, they may safely stand towards the Island until the light bears S. S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. they will then be in a good fair way from the land, and as before mentioned they can make more free by their lead.

Nearly East and West with the Light-House, and about three-fourths of a mile from it, is the outermost part of a *Reef of Rocks* which joins the S. W. Point. These are dry at low water and are the only danger near the Light-House; therefore a berth of a mile from the Point, is a good fair way.

Sixteen leagues to the Eastward of the Light-House, at Shallop Creek, and sixteen leagues to the Westward of the Light-House, at Grand Bay, and the Light-House itself, are Dépôts of provisions for the use of Mariners in distress, or other shipwrecked persons.

A Light-House has been built on Heath Point, the East end of the Island of Anticosti, but has not been put in operation for want of sufficient funds vested in the Corporation of the Trinity House.

It is now used as a provision Dépôt for shipwrecked Mariners.

For Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Baie Chaleur, &c. Sundays and Thursdays, from 2nd November to 1st April, and from 10th April to 20th May, at 2 P. M.—From the 21st May to 1st November Mondays and Fridays, at 3 P. M.

Mails for Gaspé and Baie Chaleur via Metis and the Restigouche, every Wednesday, a half-past 11 A. M.

The Postage on Letters for Great Britain and Ireland, sent via Halifax, has within the last year been reduced to a uniform rate of 1s. 2d. sterling, which postage may be prepaid or not, at the option of the sender. If letters for Europe are sent via New York, the provincial and United States postage thereon, must be prepaid.


TABLE OF PROHIBITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS.

Gunpowder, Arms, Ammunitions or Utensils of War, prohibited to be imported, except from the United Kingdom, or some other British possession.

Fish, dried or salted. Oil, Blubber, Fins or Skins, the produce of creatures living in the sea, prohibited to be imported, except from the United Kingdom, or from some other British possession, or unless taken by British ships fitted out from the United Kingdom, or from some British possession, and brought in from the fishery, and except herrings from the Isle of Man, taken and cured by the inhabitants thereof.

Coffee, Sugar, Molasses, Rum, being of foreign production, prohibited to be imported into any of the British possessions on the continent of South America or in the West Indies, (the Bahama and Bermuda Islands not included,) except to be warehoused for exportation only; and may also be prohibited to be imported into the Bahama and Bermuda Islands, by Her Majesty's Order in Council.

Base or Counterfeit Coin, Books, such as are prohibited to be imported into the United Kingdom—prohibited to be imported.










**REGULATIONS
RESPECTING THE TOWAGE OF VESSELS.**

Any vessel taking the boat at any intermediate distance between Quebec and the Church at Batiscan, will pay the full towage, as if towed from Quebec.— If taken in tow between Batiscan Church and the wharf at Three Rivers, to pay three-fourths of the full towage.—If taken in tow between the wharf at Three Rivers and Sorel, to pay two-thirds of the full towage. If taken in tow between Sorel and the Church at Pointe-aux-Trembles, to pay one-half of the full towage; and from the Church at Pointe-aux-Trembles, or any intermediate place above the said Pointe, to Montreal, to pay one-third the full towage. It being understood that when towage is engaged for vessels at Quebec, as they have a preference over others, the full towage to be paid for, whether the whole, or part, or none of the towing is performed,—the deduction made, referring only to vessels for which towage has not been previously engaged at Quebec.

Passengers on board vessels taken in tow, to pay, one-half the steamboat Steerage rates.

Masters of vessels to furnish tow-lines and hawsers— Not less than nine feet to be charged as draft water. The greatest draft of water to be taken as measurement.

Should the masters of the boats, from any just reason, deem it necessary to cast off a vessel, no deduction to be made on the towage, provided they are re-taken by the first opportunity.

Vessels towed from Montreal, or any place above Sorel, to Three Rivers, to be charged three-fourths of the towage to Quebec, and from Three Rivers, and above Portneuf, to be charged half towage.

All pilotage to be paid by the masters or consignees.

In the event of any vessel grounding, when in tow, in consequence of being too deeply laden, or from the fault of the ship's Pilot, the detention to be paid for, also the tariff rate for freight taken out.

The proprietors will not hold themselves liable for any damage that may be done to vessels or their warps, either in taking in tow, towing, or casting them off.
