NOVA SCOTIA.

ACT OF INCORPORATION.

(Passed the 31st day of March, A. D., 1851.)

Be it enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows:

I. The persons hereinafter named, that is to say, the Bishop of the Diccese for the time being, the Venble. Archdeacon Willis, the Reverend Fitzgerald Uniacke, the Reverend Edwin Gilpin, the Honorables Brenton Halliburton, William B. Bliss, Charles R. Prescott, Henry H. Cogswell, and John Spry Morris, John W. Ritchie, Samuel P. Fairbanks, Lawrence Hartshorne, Henry Pryor, and all such other persons as row are Members of the Society called "The Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia," and their Successors, shall be a Body Corporate by the name of the "Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia," of which Corporation the Bishop of the Diocese shall be the President.

II. The Corporation may hold Real Estate not exceeding at any one time the annual value of Twelve Hundred Pounds, and the Rents and Profits arising from such Real Estate shall be applied for the uses and purposes of the Church or Churches, or of Religious or Educational Institutions connected with the Church of England in this Province. The Corporation shall have power to sell such Real Estate, and to purchase other Real Estate not to exceed the value hereinbefore mentioned.

III. All persons when admitted pursuant to the Bye-Laws of the Corporation, shall be members of the Society.

IV. The Society shall be governed and its affairs managed by a Committee of not less than twenty-five persons, comprising a President, Vice Presidents, a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary and Treasurer, the Committee to be henceforth called the Executive Committee, and such other officers as the Society may deem proper.

V. The persons who now hold the offices of the Vice Presidents, Committee, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer, shall continue to hold such offices until their Successors shall be elected under this Act.

VI. All donations to the Society shall be invested or disposed of under the direction of the Executive Committee for the benefit of the Society, and the Executive Committee shall be bound to account to the Society for all their acts, receipts and expenditures, and to make annual report to the Society at its general meeting, of the progress and state of the Society, and of its affairs generally.

VII. A general meeting of the Society shall be held once in each year, and as much oftener as may be directed by any Rule or Bye-Law of the

BYE-LAWS,

Passed at the Fourteenth Annual Meeting of the Society, in Halifax, February 18th, 1852.

1st. At all Meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, with a control over all its proceedings, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-Laws without his approval.

4th. The Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be the first of the Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to seven. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant-Secretary and a Treasurer.

5th. All Members of the Church are invited to unite with this Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Laymembers of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be Members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Treasurer of the Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the Local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual meeting of the Society shall be held at Halifax on the Second Thursday in February, at which the twenty Lay-members of the Executive Committee, together with the Secretaries and Treasurer shall be

elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

Sth. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of the months of July, August and September; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or, in his absence, by a Vice President.

Ofh. The Members of the Church in every part of the Province are invited to co-operate with the Diocesan Church Society, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and rules of the Diocesan Church Society. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing one of its members, resident within its district, to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society: but when the Local Committees desire it, they shall receive Books at cost and charges, to the amount of one-fourth of their remittances, or the said one-fourth may be placed in the bands of the Endowment Sub-Committee, for the benefit of the Parish or Mission where the money was contributed.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention:

- 1.—Provision for Assistant Missionaries.
- Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- Assistance to the crection or enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England, in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as, having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision, to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee, and lastly the written approbation of the Bishop.
- 6.-Assistance to the erection of Parsonage Houses.
- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.

8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.

9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.

10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishments at Windsor.

11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the widows and orphans of deceased Clergymen: but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some Members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants in their own neighborhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small, from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. An Annual Sermon shall be preached before the Society. The Preacher, time and place, to be appointed by the President.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Incorporated Society; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

ANNUAL MEETING.

THE 14th Annual Meeting of the Society was held in the National School, on Wednesday, the 18th February.

The Right Rev. the Lord Bishop in the Chair.

After Prayers the Right Rev. the President opened the Meeting, stating that the principal business which claimed their attention was the adoption of a code of Bye Laws for the guidance of the Society, now Incorporated. He also communicated to the Society that the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel had most liberally granted the annual sum of £440 sterling, toward the Bishop's income during the present incumbency, and that the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge had made an unconditional grant of £2,000 sterling toward an Endowment Fund for this See.

Whereupon it was moved by the Venble. the Archdeacon, seconded by the

Honble. the Chief Justice, and resolved unanimously,

That the grateful thanks of this Society be offered to the Venble the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge, for their great liberality toward this Diocese.

The Report of the Standing Committee for 1851 was then presented to the Society. It was moved by the Rev. J. C. Cochran, and seconded by the Rev. R. Uniacke, and

Resolved, That the Report now presented be adopted, printed and circulated under the direction of the Executive Committee.

A statement of unpaid grants was read by the Secretary, and it was recommended to the Executive Committee that the statement be published in the Annual Report.

Resolved, That the Rev. the Secretary be requested to accept the sum of £30 as an acknowledgment of his services during the past year.

Resolved, That the thanks of the Society be presented to the Assistant Secretary, to the Treasurer and to the Auditors, for their valuable services during the past year.

The Bye Laws, which had been prepared by a Sub-Committee, appointed for that purpose, were proposed one by one for the consideration of the Society. After much deliberation they passed in form and order as published in the 14th Report.

Resolved, That the Vice Presidents of the Society should remain as in the 18th Report.

Also, That the following Lay Members of the Society be members of the Executive Committee for 1852.

Also, That L. Hartshorne, Esq., be the Treasurer, H. Pryor, Esq., A. M., Asst. Sect'y., and the Rev. E. Gilpin, Jr., A. M., Secretary of the Society for the year

The Executive Committee were directed to procure, if necessary, a Seal for the Incorporated Society, and to make provision for its custody.

The request of the Bishopric Endowment Fund Committee, that the D. C. S. should become Trustees of the Fund, was then presented, and it was

Resolved, That the Society accepts the Trust, and directs the Executive Committee to receive and invest the money.

Several applications were deferred until the first meeting of the Executive

The meeting then adjourned until the next evening, when the Annual Public Meeting was to be held.

ANNUAL PUBLIC MEETING.

The 14th Annual Public Meeting of the Society was held in the new Temperance Hall, on Thursday evening, the 19th February, 1852.

There were present, a number of the Clergy of the Diocese, and the Lay members of the Executive Committee, together with representatives from several of the Local Committees, while the Hall was well filled with those who are interested in the welfare of the Society.

The Right Rev. the President took the Chair at 7 o'clock.

Two verses of the 100dth Psalm were sung.

The Venble. the Archdeacon read the Prayers appointed for the use of the Society.

The Secretary read an abstract from the 14th Annual Report.

FOURTEENTH REPORT

OF THE

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY,

(NOW INCORPORATED.)

ADOPTED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING IN HALIFAX,

FEB. 18тн, 1852.

THE Standing Committee for 1851 now discharge the pleasing duty of reporting their proceedings during the past year.

Your Committee have endeavored faithfully to carry out the designs of the Society, and to advance its objects by the most judicious measures they could adopt.

They gladly embrace this opportunity of acknowledging the debt of gratitude which is due to Almighty God for his merciful protection, and for the encouraging success with which He has vouchsafed to crown our efforts.

Difficulties have indeed been met with, arising chiefly from the extended operations of the Society, and the increasing claims upon its regard; while its means are not proportionably enlarged, nor the claimants yet accustomed to self-exertion.

These difficulties have been encountered in humble reliance upon the strength of our spiritual Leader, and in full assurance that He will ever support that Church which He has established upon Earth as the exponent of His mercy:—well knowing that we, although responsible for our own efforts, are merely instrumental in the sure establishment of Divine truth.

A brief view of the past operations of the Society will shew that as its resources have been slowly revealed, its true position has been gradually assumed. In its earlier years, the Society, although acknowledging nearly the same objects which now claim its attention, was compelled to apply its funds to the distribution of Books, the payment of Lay Readers, the building and enlargement of Churches. Next we trace the Society extending a friendly hand to some who were desirous of becoming authorised teachers of the word of God. A further step in advance was the determination to support two travelling Missionaries, who in the most destitute portions of the Province might extend the ministrations of the Church among its long-neglected members.

But it is within the last few years that the Society has decidedly assumed its proper missionary character, by aiding in the support of at first six and then nine assistant missionaries. These are appointed by the Bishop of the Dicese, and sent to the more extensive Missions, where the resident Pastors cannot attend to the wants of all their charge.

To this object the Society now turns its chief attention, and to its support the annual income, at its present average, must be almost exclusively devoted.

It has been for some time thought that the incorporation of the Society would add stability to its plans and afford convenience in its operations. This your Committee have the satisfaction of informing you has at length been accomplished. You are now "the Incorporated Diocesan Church Society of Nova Scotia;" and after the adoption of a code of Bye Laws we trust that the Constitution may prove equally permanent and useful.

The Society has also reason to be thankful for the appointment of a Bishop of this Diocese. As President of the Society, with legitimate control over its proceedings, his counsels and supervision must be at all times advantageous, but especially so in guiding and encouraging its missionary efforts.

The appointment of a Bishop to the vacant See of Nova Scotia must indeed be a cause for rejoicing to all who desire the transmission of Evangelical truth, through the medium of Apostolical Order, and who are willing to accept the wholesome exercise of Ecclesiastical discipline, according to the established rules of the Church.

To enable the Society to fulfil its present engagements, there is need of a

Its income cannot be accounted at above £800, one fourth of which may be withdrawn by the contributors, leaving but £600 for general purposes. Our responsibility for the support of missionaries alone is £625 per annum. There are now earnest and urgent appeals for assistance from several quarters, the force of which your Committee cannot but acknowledge, while they are totally unable to grant the requests.

Under these circumstances your Committee do not hesitate to recommend the Society to call upon all its members to double their subscriptions. We fervently hope that the noble example which has been given by the late Chief Justice of the other Province* may be followed in this Diocese, and lead to the establishment of our Society upon a more permanent basis than it can

otherwise hope to attain.

During the past year the third Jubilee of the S. P. G. has been most joyously celebrated by the Church in many parts of the United Kingdom. In several places in England they have not yet done so, but propose to express their congratulation at some period in the present year. Circumstances have hitherto prevented the Church in this Diocese from joining in the general celebration. But an opportunity will be offered at no distant time, for testifying our sympathy with the Venble. Society, and our sense of the great debt

Of this amount £24 15s. 2d. has been returned to several of the Local Committees, as the one-fourth of their contributions to the Society. Grants to the amount of £19 15s. 9d. have been made in books toward the formation of Parochial Libraries, and for distribution.*

A resolution was passed at the General Meeting in February, 1851, authorizing the distribution among the Clergy, of all the remaining tracts which

were in the Depository previous to the year 1840.†

In March last your Committee decided upon removing the Books from their former position in the National School, and placing them in the hands of a

This step was taken in consequence of a report from the Book Committee, stating the disadvantages under which the books were offered for sale, and

strongly recommending their removal.

The difficulties which for some time have attended the efforts of the Society to distribute these valuable Books in the Diocese, are now much increased by the higher rates charged for them in England. We are no longer allowed to obtain them at members' prices; which makes so material a difference in the cost at which the Books can be distributed here, that the grave question must be considered whether the Depository can be sustained, or whether some other mode of obtaining books from the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge would not be more expedient.;

The following extract from a letter by the Secretary of S. P. C. K. will

direct connexion with the Institution according to its rules. It is only to its Diocesan and District Committees that the Society professes, or indeed can afford, to issue its publications at reduced prices. Those prices involve an actual loss on the Parent Society, a loss it is content to incur, within the regulations assigned. But Church Associations, as such, have no claim on the gratuitous advantages offered by the Society to its own members and recognized branches."

TRAVELLING MISSIONARIES.

It has been thought advisable and for the benefit of the Church, that the Travelling Missionary, the Rev. J. Breading, who had been for some years, with patient zeal, itinerating the rugged shores on the Eastern coast of this Province, should occupy the more settled position of resident minister at Beaver Harbor, in the same district. This alteration has been caused rather by an urgent request from the inhabitants of that place to be allowed the privilege of a resident pastor, than from any desire of change on the part of the missionary, or any unwillingness still to endure the toilsome marches, and to brave the perilous exposures which he must encounter in that wild region, in the discharge of his Christian warfare. The D. C. S. has granted £75, (which is half of the stipend formerly paid him by this Society,) and the S. P. G. has kindly promised £50 per annum toward his support in the new

In October last the annual sum of £100 was devoted toward the payment of a Travelling Missionary. To that amount the S. P. G. has added £50

With such provision for his support, a Clergyman, the Rev. W. Stuart, has been appointed and sent by the Bishop of the Diocese, to the South-western shore of the Province, where there is a wide and important field for his exertions. His labors commenced with the present year.

There has been expended during the past year, £150, in carrying out this

the exmmittee have great reason to be encouraged in the effort. The Churchmen in many places are scarcely able to make up in money the sum required by the S. P. G. and this Society; and in some instances where they seem able, they have not yet learned how to exert themselves, yet the Missionary character of the Society is always understood and well appreciated, and there is no expenditure of its funds so generally pleasing as that which is caused by the support of Laborers in Christ's vineyard.

It is true that under the present system some inconvenience may be felt by the Missionary; yet since there does not appear to be any mode so feasible for accomplishing the desired object, your Committee have no hesitation in recommending you still to proceed with faith and patience in the course you

have already adopted.

The Rev. J. T. T. Moody The following extracts afford us encouragement. writes from Yarmouth,-

" I find Mr. Spike very useful and diligent in that portion of the Parish immediately under his care; and we have every reason to hope for the extension of the Church in the district of Argyle through his instrumentality.

" His congregations and Sunday School have increased very much, and my mind is relieved of much anxiety caused by the probability of the defection from the Church of many young persons and children, who could scarcely be expected to grow up in the bosom of the Church which hitherto provided so inadequately for their nurture.

"The planting a Clergyman at Tusket was an experiment indeed, but one of which I argue well; and although the field is limited, I consider the Society's

grant well appropriated, and pray for its continuance."

The Rev. E. B. Nichols, writes from Liverpool,—

"The Rev. John Ambrose has succeeded the Rev. Mr. Forsythe, and com-

menced his labours with the present year.

" The duties assigned him will supply semi-monthly services to five of the ten regular stations in the Mission, and will extend over a district of fifty miles in length.

"He happily brings to the work a robust frame and a willing mind. his services have been gratefully and acceptably received. I carnestly trust they

may be blessed to the turning of many souls unto righteousness.

"I am also glad to observe that the Society's liberality to this Parish has been duly appreciated, and that although objects of a local character have called forth during the past year subscriptions exceeding by nearly £400 those of any preceding year, the collections on behalf of the Society have not diminished, but on the contrary increased by 6½ per cent."

APPENDIX.

SECOND REPORT

OF THE

ENDOWMENT SUB-COMMITTEE.

The Endowment Sub-Committee in presenting their 2nd Annual Report to the Diocesan Church Society, express their conviction of the great importance of this branch of the Society's operations.

If the plan already adopted for obtaining an Endowment Fund be strictly adhered to and systematically carried out, there can be no doubt but that in the course of a few years every Mission in the Province will have a permanent although moderate income toward the support of its Minister.

The effort already made has met with as much success as could be anticipated in an undertaking which from its nature must be slow in progress.

Its advantages are generally understood and acknowledged, as affording foundation for a hope of some relief under the evils of an entirely voluntary system. Many of the Local Committees now reserve one-fourth of their contributions toward the endowment of their own districts; while the assistance which has been sought and granted from the "General Endowment Fund," has tended to stimulate the exertions and redouble the efforts of several.

The amount transferred to the care of the Endowment Committee during 1850, was £104 2s. 2d. During 1851, it amounted, together with interest on the money already received, to £218 13s. One hundred pounds of this is the munificent donation of Miss Totten to the Parish of Digby. Of these sums £21 12s. 6d. has been returned to the Local Committees under the Rules of the Society, to be invested for the support of the Missionary alone. At first the money was kept in the Savings' Bank, at 4 per cent. interest: but as the amount increased, and that Depository was prevented from receiving any more, it became necessary for your Committee to find some other way for improving the sums committed to their care. During 1851,

there have been three shares of Stock purchased in the Bank of Nova Scotia, for the sum of £176 15s. 0d., which yield an annual profit of £5 1s. 10d. per cent. It has been the object of your Committee to keep a small sum in hand ready to meet any demand, while the rest is employed on the most advantageous terms that can be obtained with due regard to security.

The whole sum at present in their charge consists of the value of the three Sha es of Bank Stock, £71 14s. in the Savings' Bank, and £15 13s. 8d. in

the hands of the Treasurer.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub-Committee were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850:

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages, or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interest or rents arising from such Endowment.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall

be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowments shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such sus-

V. The Endowment Sub-Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Mission, as well as the reserved one-fourth of any contributions that may be made by any Parish or Mission, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if in the judgment of the Endowment Sub-Committee, such opportunity or proposition for endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorise the said me-fourth to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing Rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society, at their next

meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish, or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a Resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment decired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub-Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is exofficio Secretary of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

REPORT

OF THE

BOOK COMMITTEE.

In accordance with a Resolution of the Standing Committee, passed March 28th, 1851, the Books of the Depository were removed from the National School, and placed in the hands of Mr. W. Gossip, about the first of May.

Mr. Gossip has given up for their reception one half of his shop, and has devoted to them much time and attention.

During the past year there have been three importations of Books for the Depository, amounting to about £110, currency.

Your Committee regret to state, that under the existing rules of the S. P. C. K. the books cannot be obtained as formerly, at members' prices, but are charged at a rate of about twenty-five per cent. higher.

On the 10th inst. your Committee met to consider the state of the Depository. The accounts and statements of Mr. Gossip were presented for examination. It was found that the total amount of sales during the past, was about equal to that of the preceding year. It was also noticed that £6 0 $3\frac{1}{2}$ is the only remuneration received by the Depositary for his sacrifice and trouble.

After much consideration of these difficulties, your Committee were induced to adopt the following Resolutions:—

I. "Resolved,—That the Book Committee are of opinion that the advantages which were anticipated have not been derived from the removal of the Books to the Store of Mr. Gossip."

II. "Resolved,—That it is the opinion of the Book Committee, that, under the disadvantage of the higher price at which the Books are now furnished us by the S. P. C. K., the Depository cannot be sustained."

III. "Resolved,—That this Committee suggest that some more expedient mode be adopted for obtaining a supply of the Books."

With reference to a Resolution authorizing the employment of Assistant Missionaries, it was Resolved on the 17th August, 1849:

That no part of the funds of this Society shall be paid under that Resolution until the first and each subsequent quarterly payment of the £50 to be provided by the People in such cases, is actually paid in advance to the Treasurer of the Local Committee.

A question having arisen whether a Member of the Society might devote his annual subscription to any particular object of the Society, the matter was referred to the Executive Committee on the 19th March, 1852; and the following opinion was expressed:

"Resolved, That it is the opinion of the Executive Committee, that it is the intention of the fifth Bye Law, that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."
