TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES,

ENDING MARCH 1st, 1886.

THE Board of Management of the Toronto Home for Incurables, in presenting their Twelfth Annual Report to the kind friends and patrons of the Home, would record their devout thanks and praise to our Heavenly Father for all the benefits He has bestowed on the Institution during the past year. Everything has gone on satisfactorily in the management of the Home, which has progressed as The benevolent object favorably as its best friends could desire. contemplated in the establishment of the Home—which was to relieve and to cherish during the remainder of life persons suffering from incurable maladies, and thereby disqualified from the duties of lifehas been faithfully pursued by those in charge. Medical attendance, nursing, and domestic comforts are supplied; and the endeavor is made to alleviate suffering, and to cheer the life from which health has departed. All seeking admission are the victims of incurable disease, and more or less perpetual pain and bodily incapacity. such there are in the Home fifty-seven. During the year twenty-five have been admitted; three have left, thinking they were well enough to maintain themselves; two to live with friends; three from discontent; two have been dismissed; one, from insanity, removed from the Institution-eleven in all. In almost every case applications are made for re-admission by those who, from various reasons of their

own, have left the Home. The Board are unanimous in the conviction that, except for most urgent reasons, application for the re-admission of an inmate who has voluntarily left the Home should be refused. The Home has been fitted for the comfort of incurables. not as a temporary refuge, nor for those at the gates of death, but for the relief of living sufferers. During the year there have been fourteen deaths; and some of those who have lately passed away were inmates of the old Home, when first established, on Bathurst street, twelve years ago. They bore loving testimony to the care and kindness which had cheered and brightened their closing days of suffering and pain. The late Mrs. Roaf has bequeathed to the Institution the endowment of a bed to the memory of her late husband, which will be the first bed placed in the new wing, and called "The Roaf Bed." It is with unspeakable gratitude that the Management receive this Christ-like thought of relieving the poor and the afflicted, and thus perpetuating in blessings the memory of loved ones from generation to generation. For our further encouragement in this good work there comes, from an unknown friend, a bequest of forty-six dollars. And many who visit the Home give substantial proofs of their appreciation of the work carried on there. To these friends, and to the subscribers who have so liberally contributed the past year towards the maintenance of the Home, and to the Ontario Government and City Council, for their grants, most cordial and heartfelt thanks are given. In the month of July a garden party was held in the grounds of the Institution, which was largely attended, and the sum realized from the entertainment (one hundred and sixty dollars) placed to the Building Fund Account. The Building Fund has an amount nearly sufficient for the proposed extension and enlargement of our accommodation. The total amount required for completion of the work will be thirty thousand dollars. This includes a large ward, effectually isolated from the rest of the building, for the care of incurable Cancer patients. The large numbers suffering from this most painful disease, constantly applying for admission to the Home, has for some years impressed the Board with the great need of this ward. Through the kind providence of God we are greatly pleased to recognize His favor

Our thanks are gratefully tendered to the generous friends whose subscriptions amount to twenty-three thousand dollars, of which over fifteen thousand dollars are already in hand for this purpose. It will be seen from the Report of the Building Committee that ground will very speedily be broken for the foundation of the new wing and ward; and we may reasonably hope before another year has finished to have the great pleasure of seeing the plan of the original Founders completed and the additional, ward in readiness to receive the suffering patients for whom it has been prepared. The Managers would also take this opportunity of conveying their warmest thanks to Mrs. Wilson, Miss Barton, Mr. H. C. Dixon, the Misses Martin, Mr. Ramsey, and other kind and sympathetic friends of the Institution, for several musical entertainments and other treats given to the inmates during the year, affording to them pleasing and happy thoughts for many days. The Home has been most kindly remembered by the Flower and Fruit Mission and Sunday-School of Jackson Hall, St. Mark's (Parkdale), and the Pillow Mission. Sincere thanks are warmly given to the Clergymen of Parkdale, who still continue to hold religious services on the Sabbath and other days, when all the inmates who are able assemble in the Chapel for prayer and praise; and to the ladies who conduct the musical part of the service the Management would express their gratitude. The Board very gratefully recognize the important services which have been so kindly and efficiently rendered by the members of the Medical Staff, and by Dr. Bigelow, who has been the resident medical attendant for the past year. He has filled the position to the entire satisfaction of the Board, and by his kind care and attention has much endeared himself to the patients. The Management have sincere pleasure in testifying their appreciation of his services so faithfully and cheerfully given. The valuable services of our solicitor, Mr. Mortimer Clark, are acknowledged with many thanks. To the editors of the daily papers the Managers are much indebted for gratuitously inserting in their papers matters relating to the Institution for the past year. Again Mr. Chapman, by most liberally supplying the Home with ice, is entitled to thanks. Mrs. Craigie still continues the faithful and trusted Superintendent. and the Managers duly recognize the responsible position she has to The nurses have ever proved kind and attentive; and often do we hear from the lips of a patient, "God bless my good nurse." We are sure the friends of the patients will be convinced, from their inspection of the Home, that everything is done to fulfil the object of the Institution, and sincerely hope that our friends, both in the Province and in the City, will be inclined not only to give us the means of enlargement, but, when that is accomplished, to give us still the needed means for the maintenance of the increasing number of patients.

MEDICAL REPORT.

In the absence of my esteemed colleague, Dr. Lynd, I have been requested to present unto you the Medical Report of this institution for the by-gone year, which, on behalf of the gentlemen associated with me on the Medical staff, I have much pleasure in doing.

It is a source of gratification to report the mortality during the past year as not exceeding that of its predecessor, although, the usefulness of the institution has been on the increase, more especially should we be thankful for this, when we know that during the past changeable season, the ravages of disease have wrought havoc in many a private home, especially in those of advanced years, such as the majority of the patients who fall under our care at this institution. The good sanitary surroundings of the building, its admirable heating apparatus and the vigilant care bestowed by the attendants upon the inmates, together with plenty of good food, form the great factors in warding off disease; supporting the feeble and oftimes restoring those in whom through privations at their own homes the vital powers have reached a low ebb, to a more robust and happy state of health.

There are at present fifty-seven patients in the "Home," and during the past year twenty-five new cases have been admitted, and four-teen deaths have occurred. Of the new cases admitted, eight suffered from rheumatism, six from paralysis, three from spinal disease, three from hernia, two from fracture of the femur, and one each from cystocele, hysteria and phthisis. Of the deaths, three died of asthma, two of apoplexy, two of diarrhoea, two of heart disease and one each of pneumonia, locomotor, ataxia, peritonitis, asphyxia and hemoptysis.

It is respectfully submitted and strongly urged that great care be exercised in the non-admission of cases in a dying condition and thus avoiding an unfair exaggeration of the death rate. Care should also be exercised in excluding those cases who, though incurable from some comparatively slight disease, yet possess sufficient control over their physical and mental faculties to enable them to earn a livelihood

Your Medical staff hail with much pleasure the anticipated erection of the new wing and cancer ward, where patients suffering from cancer can be taken in without restriction. Cancer being one of the most loathsome of diseases and requiring very much the care that an institution of this kind can bestow, the very loathsomeness of the disease, demanding that those who are its unfortunate victims should have every care and attention bestowed upon them to add some sunshine of comfort in their great affliction. The same may also be said of consumptives, and it is to be hoped that if, with our growing population, these classes of cases should become very abundant, that hospitals for their special management may be erected.

Early in last year a committee from the Medical staff consisting of Drs. Jas. Thorburn, Geo. Wright and Alex. Davidson, was appointed to draw up a code of rules and regulations for the guidance of the resident medical assistant; it is respectfully submitted that a copy of these rules be placed in the hands of all applicants for the position of resident medical assistant.

This report would fall far short of what it should be, did it not record the satisfaction we have in the zeal and interest taken in the welfare of the "Home" by Mrs. Craigie, the matron, and Mr. Bigelow, the resident medical assistant, in their endeavors to maintain the comfort and well-being of the patients, nor shall we forget to notice with pleasing satisfaction, the nurses, who are at all times vigilant in the exercise of their duties, and courteous in their demeanor. The stability of a house may be well measured by the unity and harmony which reign within its walls, such as obtain in this one.

It is with continued happiness and blessing to ourselves that we are enabled, under the guidance of Divine Providence to exercise the means placed in our hands for the alleviation of the sufferings of this part of our community which has been committed to our charge, and it is felt that "it has been good for us to have been here."

OF THE

HOME FOR INCURABLES

Adopted and Amended 28th March, 1884.

I. This Institution shall be known as "The Toronto Home for Incurables."

II. Its objects shall be to afford maintenance, nursing, and medical and surgical aid to persons suffering from incurable disease, and to provide for them, while inmates of the "Home," the ministrations of the Gospel.

III. Every subscriber of two dollars and upwards per annum shall be entitled to vote at the annual meeting, at which a Board of Managers shall be elected for the ensuing twelve months. Every individual who shall pay in advance, and at one time, the sum of fifty dollars, shall be entitled to the same privileges for life.

IV. All money now in the possession of the "Home," or which may hereafter be collected or acquired by it. shall be applied (unless otherwise directed by the donor) to the general objects, uses and requirements of the "Home."

V. The affairs of the "Home" shall be under the direction, control and management of a Board of Managers, of whom at least forty shall be ladies and twelve gentlemen, and who shall be elected at the annual general meeting of subscribers, qualified as set forth in Article III.

The medical staff attending the "Home" shall be ex-officio members of the Board of Managers,

In case of a vacancy arising, the Board may elect a member to fill the vacancy until the next annual general meeting.

The Board shall control and direct all the business of the institution, and their decision upon all points of management shall be final.

There shall be chosen annually, and by the vote of the Board, a President and Vice-President, and, from among the Lady Managers, the following officers, viz.: First Lady Directress, Second Lady Directress, Third Lady Directress, Secretary, Assistant-Secretary, and Treasurer.

For the more convenient working of the Institution, the Board may from time to time appoint committees of not less than three of their number, such as an Executive Committee, and committees for visiting and superintending the "Home."

The Board may also enact By-laws for regulating the duties of the various officers and employés of the "Home."

The By-laws shall not be altered except at a regular meeting, after notice duly given, at least a month previously.

VI. The Board of Managers shall hold stated meetings at least once a month, and may hold adjourned meetings when necessary. At such monthly meetings the Board shall have power to make additional Bylaws regulating its own government, and for the government of the officers and employés, as before provided, and when necessary, after due notice, to alter and amend the same.

Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President and one of the Lady Directresses, or on requisition of five or more members of the Board. When a special meeting is called, the time and place of meeting, and the business for which it is called, shall be stated in the notice calling the meeting, and no other business shall be taken up at such meeting.

VII. The annual general meeting of the subscribers qualified as set forth in Article III., shall be held in the month of March.

It shall be the duty of the Board of Managers to make all necessary arrangements for said annual meeting; to lay before the subscribers a report of the proceedings of the previous twelve months, and to ex-

VIII. In view of the large contributions given by the citizens of Toronto, and the grant made by the City Council in aid of the "Home," applicants from the city of Toronto for admission to the "Home" shall have preference over others.

IX. The Board will receive incurable persons from any municipality in Ontario outside of Toronto, on condition that a bond be given by said municipality to pay such sum as the Board may determine from time to time for the maintenance of each patient so sent. Provided always, that a certificate as to general character and circumstances shall have been received from such persons as the Board may approve; that a certificate be given by the gaol surgeon of the municipality, or by such other medical gentleman as the Board may approve, that the person seeking admission is incurable; provided also, that such certificate be endorsed by the medical officers of this Institution, and that the application be approved by the Board at a regular monthly meeting.

X. The foregoing Constitution shall not be altered, unless it be at an annual general meeting of subscribers, notice of such alteration having been given at least three months before the annual meeting, and approved by a majority of the Board of Managers.

BY-LAWS.

Amended and Adopted March 28th, 1884, and March 20th, 1886.

I. Duties of Officers.—At meetings of the Board of Managers the Chairman (elected as such from amongst the gentleman managers) shall preside. In his absence the Managers present shall name a Chairman pro tem.

The Chairman shall be the judge of order, and his decisions thereon shall be acquiesced in without debate.

He shall direct the Secretary when special meetings are ordered, to insert in the notices the import of the special business upon which the Managers are to convene.

II. The Secretary shall keep fair and regular minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Managers in a book to be provided for that purpose.

She shall preserve all the records and papers of the Society which do not belong to the office of Treasurer.

She shall cause a notice of each stated meeting, and of each special meeting of the Board of Managers, to be sent to the address of each Manager, at least one day previous to the day fixed for the meeting.

The Assistant Secretary shall assist the Secretary in her duties when required, and act for her at meetings of the Board in her absence.

III. The Treasurer shall receive all moneys belonging to the Society, and shall give a receipt to the persons from whom she may receive money.

For the sake of regularity, and in order to establish the amount, all persons who may hand money to the Treasurer are requested to ask for a receipt for the money so paid over.

When the Treasurer does not require the money in paying accounts which have passed the Board, she shall deposit the money, or such part of it as may not be immediately required, in the Savings Bank, to the credit of her official account as Treasurer.

She shall keep a fair and regular account of the receipts and expenditures, and her account book and bank book shall be open to the inspection of the Managers at each stated meeting.

Prior to the General Annual Meeting, she shall prepare a statement showing the receipts and expenditures of the year, duly classified and audited, that a lucid, full explanation, or exposition of the working of the finances of the "Home," may be submitted at the general meeting.

The Treasurer's accounts shall be audited by a Committee of the gentleman managers named by the Chairman or by the Board.

IV. The Treasurer only shall pay accounts for articles and services supplied to the "Home," when duly certified, and in all cases of payment, shall require a receipt.

Accounts shall be certified to be correct as to prices, by the Managers who made the purchase of the articles and shall be initialed "correct," accordingly. They shall then be initialed by the Matron or the Superintendent, to show that the articles were received at the "Home."

The accounts shall then be laid before the Managers at the stated monthly meeting, and when payment is ordered, the order shall be entered on the minutes by the Secretary.

The Treasurer can then pay the accounts, and an entry upon the minutes will be a sufficient authority to the Treasurer to pay whatever accounts or disbursements the Board may have ordered.

V. The Managers may appoint from time to time Committees from amongst themselves to attend to any special duties.

As a rule such Committees shall consist of not less than three, and not less than two shall be considered a quorum to act.

These Committees, for the sake of regularity and for future reference, shall, as a rule, report to the Board in writing.

VII. The Superintendent and Matron shall hold their offices at the pleasure of the Board.

They shall do all in their power to promote the comfort of the inmates of the "Home," and shall follow the instructions of the Board of the lady managers for the week, and of the medical staff when orders are given.

They shall keep a book for entering all such things as they may consider necessary for the use of the "Home," and submit it to the weekly visitors. When disbursements are ordered, a regular account of the same shall be kept for the information of the Managers and the Treasurer.

VIII. The Managers deeming the point of admission of Inmates into the "Home," to be a very important matter, decide that the following formalities shall regularly be observed:

1st. Applicants for admission into the "Home," are to state how long they have resided in the city, their residence, age, disease, and circumstances, also, whether he, or she, has been attended by any medical man, and whether any clergyman has visited.

2nd. Thereafter two of the Managers shall visit the residence named (two ladies if the applicant be a woman, two gentlemen if the applicant be a man). They shall look at the surroundings of the applicant, ascertain what can be practically known of the person's circumstances, habits, and general character, in short get all the available information about the case.

They shall see the clergyman and the doctor, if either have been in attendance, hear what each has to say about the applicant, and report to the Board of Managers.
