



ANNUAL REPORT.

The President and Directors of the Halifax Protestant Industrial School submit herewith, for the information of subscribers and the general public, their Annual Report for 1899, together with the Financial Statement of the Treasurer, and a list of cash subscriptions and other contributions received during the year.

The number of boys in the Institution at the beginning of the year were forty-one, of which eight were sentenced by County Court Judges from different parts of the Province, ten placed in the Home by their parents, nine sentenced for truancy (short terms) and fourteen sentenced by the City Magistrate.

Twenty-five boys were admitted during the year, and twenty-three left their time having expired.

The conduct of the boys throughout the whole year was very good, with one exception of a boy from the Country who ran away and was retaken.

The health of the boys was excellent. We are thankful to say that we have not once called in the Physicians of the Institution, which speaks well for Superintendent, Matron, and the good sanitary state of the Buildings, &c.

We regret to announce we have been compelled to close the Boot and Shoe Department, our boys being in the Institution such a short time we could

not run it without a great loss, and again we could not teach them a trade in the time at their disposal, so we decided to give them more opportunity for study, also physical culture. The Board were fortunate in obtaining the services of Sergt. Major Long under whose able instructions the boys have made rapid progress, so that their improved appearance is most marked.

We are indebted to our friends for kindly sending Xmas gifts. The boys gave some fine singing and speeches were made and a very enjoyable evening was spent both by the boys and visitors. Money prizes were given to each boy by the Directors and Cameron Brock received the silver medal presented by E. G. Smith, Esq., for general good conduct through the year.

The boys continue much interested in the Sunday School, the Superintendent being assisted by Mr. Frank Theakston and Mr. Wm. A. Hart. We would be glad to have at least two more workers in this department so that the classes might be divided and more effectual work done.

During the year quite a number of our old boys visited the school and we were delighted to know they were all doing well. The following called :

James MacKenzie, now employed in Electric Car Works, Boston.

Thomas Nearey, in large store, Boston.

William Morris, (left here 9 years ago), good position in Boston Navy Yard.

Thomas Shaw, at Kentville, a good young man and married.

John Roddick, also married.

One of the number, John Roddick, came out and gave a good practical address to the boys on a Sabbath afternoon

We were glad when two of our boys volunteered for South Africa, Robt. Edwards in the Strathcona Horse and James Williams in Second contingent and we are sure they will acquit themselves with credit.

The day school is under Mr. Gardiner a most painstaking teacher.

The kindling wood department is still kept up. The boys also work the farm and do other light work.

Buildings are in capital repair but the main building requires painting.

The north field has been drained and what was formally a bog has been made a most productive piece of ground.

We tender thanks to our subscribers, we should have a much larger list, also thanks to Dr. Lindsay, Physician, the Press, and all who have aided us through the year.

We cannot close without expressing our entire confidence in Mr. and Mrs. Norman who are fully alive to all the requirements of their varied and trying position.
