Here, then, is the whole secret of the matter: it was a mere struggle for self; the entire aim and object of the Council was to get pay for themselves, and because they could not succeed in that object, they first ungenerously refused to coincide in paying the lower house, and followed up that principle, by rejecting all the appropriations of the session, because the claim of the Assembly, the reasonableness of which was admitted by themselves, was constitutionally followed up. And mark the difference of terms in the two claims. The House sent up a bill to provide only for "the expenses of the Pseaker and Members of Assembly, while attending in General Assembly; but the Council claim "provision for the attendance and expenses of the President and the Members of the Legislative Council;" leading us to infer that they wish their time also paid for, which the lower house do not. This, then, is the dignified situation in which the Council placed themselves by their extraordinary resolution; and as, by their pertinaciously persisting in rejecting the "Members Pay," a second time, on this disinterested and magnanimous ground, they had attempted a direct infringement on the inherent privileges of the lower house, and on the freedom of the elective franchise, (as we have already shown in our hat week's editorial article,) what course was left to the House to pursue?
