It is learned from statistics supplied by the Dominion Department of Agriculture that, despite the new U. S. tariff, Canadian export of butter to that country in January, 1923, was greater than in the corresponding montlat year, being 491,466 lbs., agail | 185,828 lbs. For the ten months enued January 31, 1923, it was, however, somewhat less than in the corresponding ten months ended on the same date in 1922, being 2,220,844 lbs., against 2,894,583 lbs. Cheese was much in excess in 1922-23 of 1921-22, being 5,80,500 lbs., compared with 2,564,844 lbs. So, too, was the export, over the border, of powdered milk in excess in 1922-23 compared with 1921-22, the returns reading 1,472,653 lbs., against 322,185 lbs.







Boston, March 29.—With insufficient fuel to continue beyond Nantucket, the U. S. Shipping Board steamship West Inskip, from Antwerp to New York, with the disabled freighter West Helix in tow, will be met off South Shoal Lightship by a tug from New York, and relieved of her tow.

The West Inskip has towed the West Helix, crippled through boiler trouble, for nine days and at times has been barely able to proceed in the face of heavy gales. In the 48 hour period between Sunday noon and Tuesday noon, the vessels covered only 181 miles. The tug will take the disabled freighter to Boston and the West Inskip will proceed to New York. The West Helix sailed from Antwerp on February 2, for Boston, and put in to the Azores February 23 with machinery damaged and short of fuel, resuming her voyago March 2. On March 14 she became helpless and broadcast appeals for aid, to which the West Inskip responded.

SHIPPING BUSINESS AT

BOSTON GAINS RAPIDLY

Steamship Lines Announce a Number of New Services—Ice Floes a Menace.

Boston, March 29. — Port business continues to boom, with the result that all available freight space is in demand, notwithstanding the more prompt handling of shipments made possible, both by truck and rail, by the more faavorable weather conditions. The latest indication of this recordbreaking business is seen in the necessity for emarging the quarters of the warehouse division of the customs service.

Incoming liners report severe weather and ice-floe menace, both combining to seriously retard shipping. Fortunately constant watchfulness by patrols has minimized the ice danger.

Shipping circies welcomed this week the resumption of White Star Line service between this port and Queenstown and Liverpool, also revival of replaning at Boston-to-Ireland service.

The plans of the Scandinavian-American Line for a direct Boston service are regarded as additional evidence of this city's growing importance as a foreign trade port. Another straw is seen in the decision of the Anchor Line to inaugurate Boston-Glasgow trips. The proposed Boston-to-Gulf of Mexico line adds to the growing feeling





Meteorologists of the Weather Bureau of the United States Department of Agriculture say that they do not know of any scheme for the artificial production of rain on a scale of practical magnitude nor for otherwise affecting atmospheric behavior. Widespread drought is due to lack of sufficient moisture in the atmosphere and the absence of other conditions essential to the formation of rain. If there is little moisture to bring down, obviously no device for causing roin artificially has any value because of the absurdity of supposing that hum'n agencies can supply adequate amounts of water for extended areas when the atmosphere itself is practically dry.

"A recent proposal is to cause pre-

amounts of water for extended areas when the atmosphere itself is practically dry.

"A recent proposal is to cause precipitation by sprinking dust particles in the air by means of apparatus carried on airplanes, on the theory that these will aid condensation. Cloudiness due to dust particles, however, takes place long before precipitation occurs, and frequently continues after the rain is over, indicating that the motes and dust particles do not necessarily cause the precipitation. If clear weather follows rainfall it may be because new dry air has moved in from other localities.

"Presence or absence of dust particles in the atmosphere does not, in the opinion of meteorologists, have anything to do with the distribution of rainfall. As a rule far more dust particles are present in the atmosphere ev rywhere than would be essential were the dust hypothesis correct to bring about abundance of precipitation. On the other hand, enormous quantities of rainfall occur over the oceans where there is least dust. Some places in the Hawaiian Islands have an annual rainfall exceeding 500 inches, and yet the air is nearly dust free. The most dust in the atmosphere, except near industrial cities, occurs over dry and semi-arid regions.

# Promotes U.S.

Shortage of Fuel Abroad is Reflected in Greater Demand From States—British Mines Restricted.

New York, March 29-The occupa-French, with consequent decrease in its coal production, entailing as it does shutting off of supplies to Italy, France, Germany and other European countries, has caused some increase in United States exports of bituminous coal, according to a statement from the Department of Commerce.

British colliery owners and coal merchants seem to be unable to supply the increased demand for coal and coke resulting from the Ruhr situation, as not only has their production of coal reached its probable maximum under existing conditions, but their dock capacity, which is and has been for some time the governing factor in their export trade, is heavily over-taxed. This is due largely to the fact that British dock labor has insisted upon only two eight-hour shifts a day. Strong efforts have been made to put on an additional shift, but so far with little success, and the whole matter has now been referred to the Industrial Court, which means a probable delay of six
