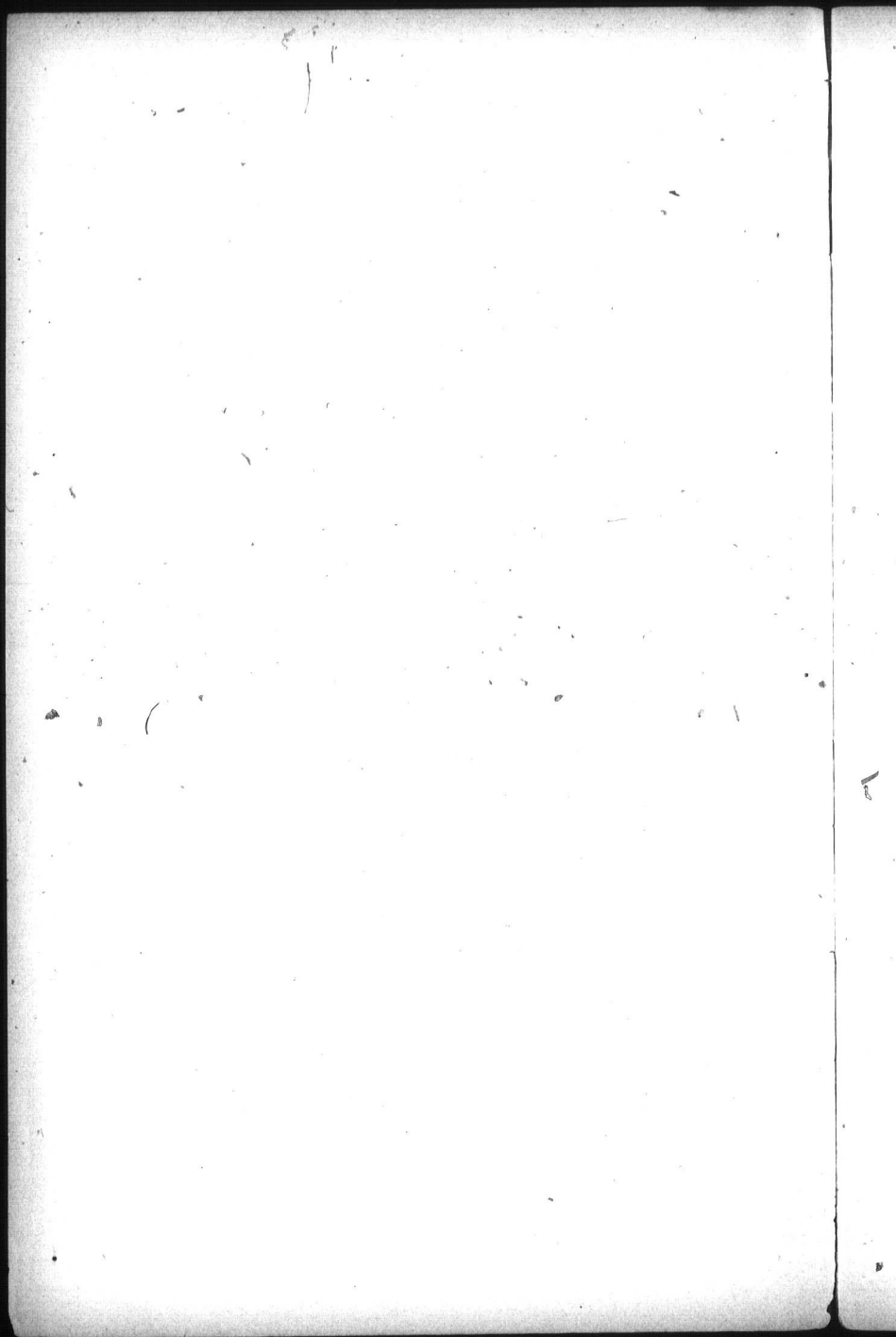

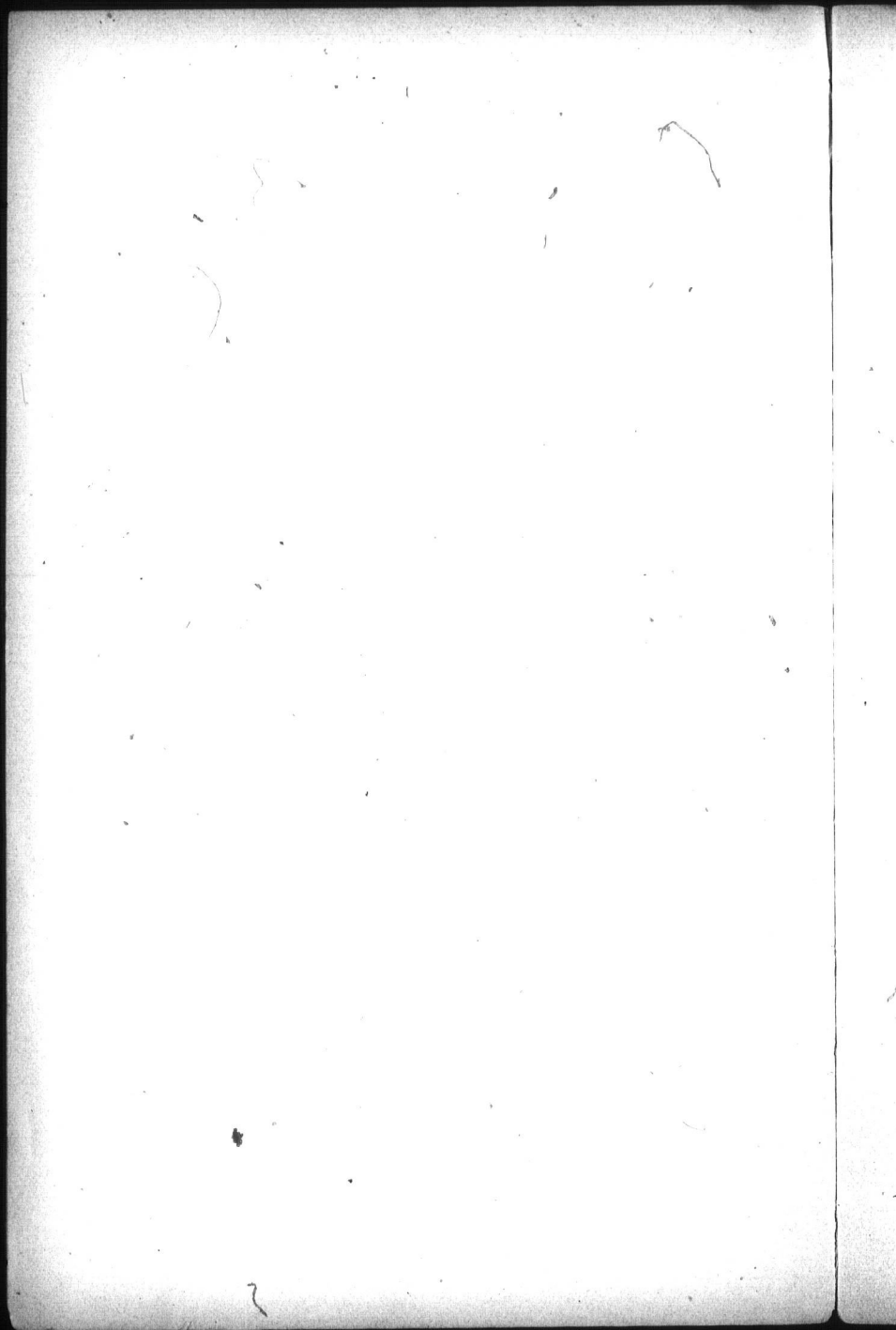

## ORPHANS' HOME.

The friends and contributors to this admirable institution gathered in large numbers in the school room of the home, Dovercourt, yesterday afternoon. Various reports of a very satisfactory kind regarding the year's work, were read. Rev. J. D. Cayley took the chair, and he was accompanied on the platform by Professor Symonds, Rev. W. Galbraith, Rev. C. L. Inglis, Rev. A. Hart, Dr. McConnell and Mr. Huson Murray. Many ladies occupied seats in the hall. The children contributed several songs.

Professor Symonds read the 28th annual report of the Committee of Management and that of the Treasurer, and moved their adoption. The former showed that since May, 1888, 72 children had been admitted, of whom 47 were boys and 25 girls, belonging to the following denominations: Presbyterians, 11; Methodists, 11; Baptists, 2; Salvation Army, 1; Church of England, 40; Protestants not specified, 7. Seventy-six children were discharged, 47 taken by relatives, one boy ran away, and four girls and sixteen boys were apprenticed. The total average per month in the home was 172—including the matron and staff, 181. The lady managers gratefully acknowledged the attention of medical officers and the unremitting care of Mr. Graham, and also tendered thanks to the public for generous support. The summer pleasure trips given by Messrs. Davis, McIntrye and others during the hot weather were thoroughly enjoyed. The school is under the control of the Public School Board, and the cost of each inmate per day was 14 cents. The council of the home recently transferred the mortgage from the North of Scotland Canadian Mortgage Co. and arranged a loan from the trustees of the late Wm. McMaster's estate for 18,600, at 5½ per cent. for ten years, thereby reducing the interest. Many favorable reports have been received from boys placed in situations. Among promised subscription was one of \$1,000 towards the debt from Mr. Wm. Gooderham. Mr. Sam. Taylor had contributed \$200, Miss Ellen Denison \$50, and Mrs. Franklin, Streetsville, \$200. The proceeds of the ball in the Pavilion amounted to \$706.21, and \$393.14 was received from the Orange lodges.

The Treasurer's statement showed the income to amount to \$10,917.36 and expenditure \$9,779.97, leaving a balance in hand of \$1,137.39. Lady Managers' collections amounted to \$1,953.17; relatives' contributions, \$1,812.20; city grant, \$1,500; Government grant, \$1,346.20; rentals, \$1,200. The salary list amounted to \$1,298.30.

Mr. S. C. Duncan-Clarke seconded, and the report was adopted.

Dr. John McConnell read the medical report prepared by himself and Dr. Hunter. It contained the following: "The health of the children has been remarkably good during the past year, in fact few private families in the city have been as free from sickness." The medical staff acknowledged the uniform kindness and scrupulous attention given by Miss Wheelwright to the children under her care.

This report was also adopted.

Rev. Mr. Inglis in appropriate terms moved a resolution of thanks to the donors, which was passed.

The Chairman, on behalf of Mrs. McMurray, gave notice of motion that at next annual meeting she will move that the Board of Managers be increased from 20 to 25.

The meeting having concluded, the visitors went through and viewed the rooms.

## THE 38th ANNUAL REPORT.

The 38th Annual Meeting of the friends of the Protestant Orphans' Home calls for most devout thankfulness to the Giver of Life with all its mercies, from those intimately associated with and interested in the children.

While never wishing to boast of good health, they still gladly acknowledge the exemption from serious illness; although once or twice it was thought advisable to transfer cases to the hospital. One boy was also sent to the asylum at Orillia, being of a defective mental capacity.

Seventy-two children have been admitted since May, 1888. Of these 47 were boys and 25 girls.

According to religious denominations as follows:—Presbyterians, 11; Methodists, 11; Baptists, 2; Salvation Army, 1; Church of England, 40 and Protestants not specified, 7.

Seventy-six children have been discharged from the Home. 47 taken by relatives, 3 little girls adopted, 1 boy ran away, 20 children were apprenticed, of whom 4 were girls and 16 boys.

Total average per month in the Home, 172. Including the Matron and staff, 181.

The Lady Managers very gratefully acknowledge the constant attention of the medical officers, who have been unremitting in their care. Also the kindness of Mr. Graham, for valuable services rendered.

They wish to tender their thanks to the public generally, for their kind support and contributions of various kinds, including Mrs. Carlyle's annual treat of ice cream to all the children. Also to Messrs. Barber & Ellis for paper to print the Annual Report, and Messrs. Brown Bros. for the covers for the same. To the Order of Foresters for \$12. To Mr. Huson Murray their solicitor, who is always ready to give his advice free of charge and watch the interests of the Home.

The pleasure trips on the boats, given by Messrs. Davis, McIntyre and others, were thoroughly enjoyed during the hot weather; and now that there is a prospect of a better wharf at the foot of Dufferin Street it will be still easier to reach the boats, being within a walk from the Home.

Miss Wheelwright, the valued Matron of the Institution, had a serious attack of inflammatory rheumatism during the winter, but fortunately recovering, is again in her usual health and able to perform her numerous and responsible duties. She was made the recipient of several handsome presents on her 20th anniversary as Matron, by her friends and some of the "old boys."

who have prospered in life, since under her care. Miss Armstrong continues to take a deep interest in the school, which is under the control of the Public School Board.

Feeling that it was advisable, the Committee of Council and the Solicitor of the Home, transferred the mortgage from the North of Scotland Canadian Mortgage Coy., and arranged a loan from the trustees of the late Hon. Wm. McMaster's estate for \$18,600.00 at  $5\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. for ten years, thereby reducing the interest, which is satisfactory considering that it takes about \$9,000 per annum to carry on the work of the Home, although the average cost per inmate per day is but 14 cents according to the official returns.

Mr. William Gooderham kindly said he would give \$1,000 towards reducing the debt if nine others could be found to do the same. When the gauntlet of charity is thus thrown down it would be cheering to see the nine, or even more, hastening to take it up.

Mr. Samuel Taylor has again generously contributed \$200 to the building fund, and the following legacies were gratefully received:—Miss Ellen Denison, \$50; Mrs. Franklin, of Streetsville, \$200.

Santa Claus did not forget the children. They were also remembered by Mr. Wm. Gooderham sending \$50 towards Christmas cheer.

In February a ball was held in the Pavilion, many ladies and gentlemen most kindly acting as patronesses and stewards, the total results of which, after paying all expenses, amounted to \$706.21 for the benefit of the Home.

At Easter some thoughtful supporters contributed three cases of eggs, which were greatly enjoyed by the little people.

A visit was received from the Prentice Boys in the early spring, and later on from the country Orangemen came 57 bags of apples, potatoes and other vegetables, in response to the suggestion of their Grand Master. The Lady Managers also wish to acknowledge the sum of \$393.14 received during the year from the Loyal Orange Lodges.

About the children who have been placed out, the greater number appear to be doing *well*. It will not be out of place here to give an extract from a letter written last month by a gentleman who had taken an interest in two boys:—

“I hope the boys may give satisfaction to those who have taken them, and I, for one, am thankful for such places as your Home. These boys would certainly have been ruined if allowed to go on as they were doing. If their young lives have been turned into a channel for good, the care and money expended on them will be well spent.”

Such is a brief outline of the workings of the Institution, but not many understand or enter into the wider influence on the lives of people and of children, whom even a stroke of the pen may place for years under the control of an exacting master or remove to a veritable home where, as we have heard of one little one, "she is the brightness of our daily life."

When we get letters full of complaint, calling the unfortunate child all manner of names, we justly consider it is the person's own state of mind and efforts are made to remove the object of it to a less dolorous atmosphere. Far different is the case where the writer says "We like him very well in some respects but not in all," or "He has his faults but not so bad that we cannot overlook them."

There is a strain of genuine kindness in this, for who has not faults to be overlooked? And we heartily sympathise with the fervent prayers offered up for the truthfulness and well-doing of our children, whom we desire to see void of offence.

There must be shading in every picture, but it is very cheering to get letters saying "He seems just the boy for the place." or "My neighbor would like to get a good boy, like the one you sent me."

One bright little fellow wrote, enclosing five cents for a younger brother still in the Home and saying "I am enjoying my place more and more."

We have the honor to submit to the Lady Manager of the Protestant Orphans' Home the 38th Annual Report of the attending medical officer as follows :

The health of the children has been remarkably good during the past year ; in fact, few private families in the city have been as free from sickness.

There have been no cases in which the illness threatened to be of a dangerous character.

A small number have had some mild form of lung trouble. A few have had some of the more common forms of skin disease. There were some accidents of a minor character. The Home was not troubled with any contagious diseases.

The Medical Staff have the greatest pleasure in recording the uniform kindness and scrupulous attention given by Miss Wheelwright and her assistants to the children under their care, thus rendering our duties exceedingly pleasant.
