ALL THREE DROWNED.

Great Ice Bridge Over Niagara River Breaks With Eight People on it, Five of Whom Escape.

Niagara Falls, N. Y., Feb. 4.—The great ice bridge that has checked the river and channel between the Cataract and the upper steel arch bridge below the falls, for the last three weeks, broke from its anchorage just at noon today and went down the river, taking with it to their death a man and woman said to be Mr. and Mrs. Eldridge Stanton of Toronto, and Burrell Heacock, 17 years old of East 17 street, Cleveland, Ohio. The bridge was considered perfectly safe. For weeks the great fields of ice had been coming down the river, piling up against the barrier until it was from 60 to 80 feet thick and under the influence of zero weather the great mass had become firmly anchored to the shore. The jam was about 1,000 feet in length and in some places a quarter of a mile in breadth. For two weeks it had offered safe passage to the hardy, and today an immense crowd of excursionists came to view the winter wonder of the river.

Had the accident happened an hour later in the day, hundreds would have lost their lives, for the crowd was moving down Prospect Park in the elevators that run down the cilif for the purpose of venturing out upon the ice.

A family gathering and the official welcome will take place in the morning. The Medina sailed from Bombay on January 10 and reached Gibraltar on January 30th.



Deputation from Canadian Postmasters Association Waits Upon Postmaster General for Increased Salary.

seem to be tair and just, as between the different portions of the Dominion."

The memorial contained the following plea for the increase in the rate of commission:—"During the last ten to fifteen years the cost of living has advanced more than fifty per cent. That cost of most classes of help has doubled, and that rents range from 75 per cent. to 150 per cent. higher than at that time.

About ten years ago the rate of postage was reduced from three and five cents to two cents. This was a boon to the general public, but a blow to the postmasters financially, just at the time when expenses were beginning to run up. Under the three cent rate, \$300 would pay postage on 10,000 letters (Canadian). Now it will pay for 15,000 letters. This is about the only source of income to the postmaster, and the amount of work per 1,000 letters remained unchanged, so that the postmasters' work was increased fifty per cent. to draw the same allowance.

Applying the reduction to British mail, \$300 would pay postage on 6,000 letters. Now it will pay on 15,000, or an increase of 150 per cent.

The matter on which postmasters get no allowance, circulars, catalogues, newspapers, magazines, etc., atc., which come from city offices for distribution, has increased in volume, in addition to the extra work required on letters to keep allowances on a level.
