The professor has lately made a survey of the falls and deduced figures therefrom which he explained at length He said that the area of the rock worn away at the Horseshoe Falls between the years 1842 and 1875 was 18,500 square feet, equal to .425 acre; between 1875 and 1886, 60,000 square feet, or 1.37 acres. The main length of the contour of the falls is 2,300 feet. The time required to recede one mile. if the rate is 2.4 feet per year, is 2,200 years. The minimum values for the yearly rate of recession, that is, the average rate along the whole contour are: From 1842 to 1875, 2.44 feet; from 1842 to 1886, 2.42 feet; from 1875 to 1886, 2.38 feet.
