THE CITY ELECTION.

A good deal of speculation has been indulged in regarding the appearance of Mr. Alexander McKay, M. P. for Hamilton, at the meeting of the London Conservative Association last night, when action was resolved on looking to a contest in the election for the Legislature now pending here.

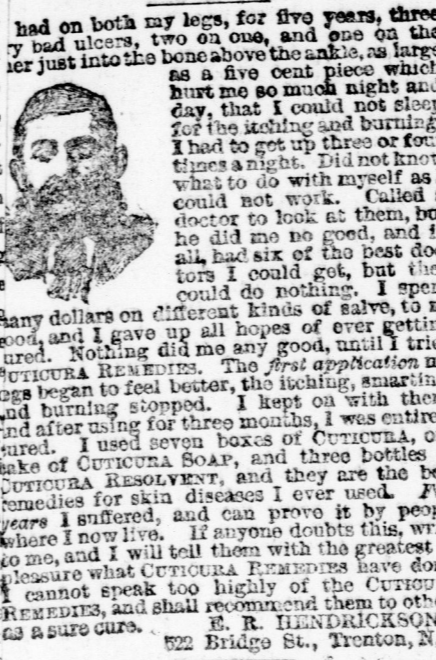
