An Act to regulate Ferries beyond the local limits of the Municipalities in Lower Canada.

TWHEREAS it is expedient to make more efficient provision Preamble. for the regulation of ferrymen, and persons conveying passengers for hire across the several rivers and waters of Lower Canada and the Licensing of Ferries, not within the local limits of 5 any Municipality: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United 10 Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and intituled, An Act to re-unite the Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, and for the Government of Canada, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That an Ordinance passed by the Legisla- Parts of 17 G. ture of the late Province of Quebec, in the seventeenth year of 3. c. 12. 15 the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled, An Ordinance empowering the Commissioners of the Peace to regulate the prices to be paid for the carriage of Goods and the passage of Ferries, in the Province of Quebec; an Ordinance of the Legislature of the late province of Lower-Canada, passed 20 in the second year of Her Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Ordinance for the better regulation of Ferrymen, and others convey- and of 2 V.c. ing persons for hire across the Rivers and Waters of this Pro- 13, repealed. vince, and all such parts of any other Ordinances or Acts of the Legislature of either of the said late Provinces, or of this Pro-25 vince, inconsistent with or repugnant to the provisions of this present Act, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

II. That from and after the fifteenth day of April, next after Ferrymen for the passing of this Act, no person shall act as a ferryman, or places between two shall convey, or cause to be conveyed by any one in his ser-Municipalities 30 vice, any person across any river, stream, lake, or water within must be Lower-Canada and not wholly within the local limits of any licensed by Municipality thereof without having received a license under Governor. Municipality thereof without having received a license under the hand of the Governor of this Province, for the time being, or of some person by him duly authorized to that effect, to 35 keep a ferry across any such river, stream, lake, or other water, for a certain time, at a place, and within limits, to be designated in such license,-nor shall the person having received such license, so act as a ferryman, or so convey, or cause to be conveyed, any person for hire, at any place to which such 40 license shall not extend, or beyond the limits mentioned therein. Penalties. under a penalty of Five Shillings currency, for each person so

conveyed contrary to the provisions of this Act; and of such further penalty as may be fixed by any regulations to be made

in the manner hereinafter provided.

III. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to fix and

Governor to fix Tolls, make regulations and impose penalties.

regulate, as often as occasion may render necessary, the rate to be paid for the passage at any ferry, over any such river, or other water; and likewise to make such other and further general or special regulations, as shall from time to time appear 5 necessary and expedient, and to impose penalties not exceeding Fifty Shillings as for the violation of any of such regulations in any case unprovided for by this Act; and the said rates and regulations, so made shall be published in the Canada Gazette. Any terryman who shall, after the publication of any 10 such rate or regulation as aforesaid, ask or receive a higher price than is hereby allowed, or shall refuse to work and be employed at the price specified in such rate, or shall disobey any of the regulations so to be made, shall for every offence, forfeit the sum of Twenty Shillings currency: All fines or penal- 15 ties imposed by this Act or by any regulations under the authority thereof, shall be recoverable in a summary manner before any one Justice of the Peace, on the oath of any credible witness other than the informer; and one half of every such penalty shall be paid to the informer, and the other half shall 20 be paid to the Receiver-General of the Province, to form part of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Province: Provided always, that nothing in this Act shall extend to the owner or master of any vessel plying between two ports in this Province, or regularly entered or cleared by the Officers of Her Majesty's 25 Customs at any such port, in any way to affect any privilege granted by the Legislature either of the late Province of Lower Canada or of this Province, to the proprietor of any Bridge or to any Railroad Company, or other Road Company.
