B I L L.

An Act to prohibit the erection of any Toll-gate or Toll-bar which may intercept the free passage of the Inhabitants of Cities, Towns and Villages within this Province, in passing from one portion of such Cities, Towns or Villages, to other portions of the same Cities, Towns or Villages, respectively.

BE it enacted, &c.

That from and after the passing of this Act it shall not be lawful for any Incorporated Company, Joint Stock Company, or any persons or persons whatsoever, to erect
5 or cause to be erected, or to continue any Toll-gate, Toll-bar or other erection within this Province, whereby any inhabitant of any of the Cities, Towns or Villages within this Province, or other persons resorting thereto, shall be prevented from having free access, ingress, egress
10 and regress, from one portion of any of such Cities, Towns or Villages, to other portions of the same Cities, Towns or Villages, in the said Province respectively.

Toll gates not to be erected in Cities, Towns, Villages, &c.
