



The Opposition party in the Province of Quebec has achieved a considerable victory. A working majority for a government under the leadership of Mr. Mercier has, in some probability, been returned.

Before the union with Upper Canada in 1841, while the Lower Province was still ruled by an irresponsible executive, a council nominated for lift by the Governor and a powerless assembly. 




