On Monday Patrick James Whelan was brought before Chief Justice Richards, Justice Morrison and Adam Wilson, Queen's Bench, on a writ of "Habeas Corpus," issued on Friday last An immense crowd waited at the gate of Osgoode Hall to see the criminal. Whelen preserved his equanimity throughout the proceedings, and the frequent references to a hanging by the neck until dead, that occurred in the reading of the document, grated on the ears of ordinary spectators with more apparent harshness than on those of the prisoner. The Counsel appearing in the case were—for the prisoner, Hon. J. H. Cameron for the Ontario Government, Mr. Christopher Robinson, Q. C.; and for the Dominion Government, Mr. J. T. Anderson. Mr. J. H. Cameron on behalf of the prisoner stated the legal obligations to Whalen's trial, and Mr. Robinson made the rejoinder. Mr. J. H. Cameron then moved that Monday, the 90th November be fixed for the argument, and that meanwhile the prisoner be committed to the custody of the Sheilf of York. This was agreed to, and the prisoner was sent back to gaol. It is rumoured that, in case the present movement in Whelan's behalf be unsuccessful, his counsel will pettion for a reprieve, in order to gain time to bring the matter before the Privy Council in England.
