He contended that the subject ought to be taken out of the hands of the Senate and a divorce court established similar to the British court established similar to the British court established in 1857. As it was now the Senate was virtually a jury of 72 members, of whom one-third by reason of their religious training were opposed to divorces sitogether, and others for various reasons should not act as jurors. But this was not all, for after the case had gone through the Senate it had to go to the Commons and be tried by a jury of 215—who had not heard the evidence.




