





LORD ROSEBERY'S IMPARTIAL POR-TRAIT OF THE MINISTER.

A biography of one of England's greatest Ministers marks Lord Rosebery's first entrance into the world of literature, and it is a gratifying surprise to everybody that Lord Rosebery's 'prentice hand shows no sign of the 'prentice. The little book has proportion, fucidity, arrangement, and the glow of a pen that had been trained to writing for many years. Above all things it presents a clear, intelligible, and impartial portrait, and to a biography no higher praise can be given.




