

BOARD OF WORKS VOTE DOWN THE RECOMMENDATION.

erday-Ald, Hill Scores the Mayor For Rewarding His Supporters At th Recent Elections -- Many Salaries Pro posed To Be Increased.

The Board of Works special session yesterday was one of the breeziest in its history Dr. Sheard, M.H.O., stated his intention of going into the water question thoroughly and by both chemical and bacteriological analysis ascertaining the present condition of the city supply.

Murmurs of dissent arose from the members of the board when the Mayor sat down bers of the board when the Mayor sat down after revealing his policy of secrecy, and Ald: McMurrich took up the gauntlet which the Mayor had thrown into the ring. "He would never," he stated "countenance any such line of action ou the part of a city cificial. If the public health was to be endangered by the use of the water he thought that the citizens should be cognizant of the fact in order that they might take the necessary precautions."

The Mayor apswared that his statement

The Mayor answered that his statement had been misconstrued. He meant to intimate that there was no need of publishing the results of the analyses, though, if necessary, the public could be told that it would be safer to boil the water before using it.

As the board treated the matter of making an analysis in a rather flippant manner the doctor proceeded to enlighten them regarding the amount of work entailed. Not one but many tests, he stated, would have to be made before a correct conclusion could be reached, as, improbable as it might appear, the water drawn from the well was at times purer than samples taken from the mouth of the intake pipe.

The Mayor was anxious to see the dredge purchased and spoke a few words to that effect. The few words, however, were productive of a perfect tornado of insinuating denunciation from a most unexpected quarter. It was Ald. Kill, who rose to take issue with the Mayor, and the board leaned back aghast as he boldly proclaimed that an election intrigue was behind this dredge-purchasing scheme and that it was concected by a man who would see that the foreman in charge would be one who could command a good many votes about election time.

By this time His Worship had somewhat recovered from the surprise engendered by the attack from one of the stanuchest members of the administration, and he sprang up as soon as Ald. Hill took his seat.

Presuming that the insinuation was levelled at his head he wished to take occasion to deny that he had ever solicited the vote of any man, much less the vote of one whom he had placed in a position. He challenged any one to cite an instance where such had been the case.





There never was such a consensu of opinion in favor of the establishment of an iron industry in Canada as there is at an iron industry in Canada as there is at present. Everyone seems to have got hold of the idea that iron is the backbone of condition afterward—but help that lasts of the idea that iron is the backbone of national greatness, and also of the fact that an iron industry cannot be created in the country without some kind of self-imposed restriction and self-imposed burden. The Federal Parliament has already put a duty on iron and the fesult has been to develop the industry in Nova Scotia, where the acilities are exceptional. This protective duty, there is no use denying it, no protectionist does deny it, is a re on trade and the importation of foreign made iron: But that is the very end aimed at. We must, however, go further. We must put upon ourselves other self-imposed burdens in order to complete the work. As great stores of iron ore, we ought to pay a bounty on all iron made in Ontario, and as ipality we ought to be prepared to grant tax exemptions, free sites, and perhaps a bonus to smelting works located within Toronto. All of which are more or less burdensome, but as the burden is self-imposed and for a great end, and will result in making our country more independent, more self-reliant, we ought willingly to make the concessions. Canada needs an iron industry, and to

get it we must have: 1. Protective duties on foreign-made iron imposed by the Federal Parliament. It may be that the present duties shall have to be revised and readjusted.

2. A bounty on pig iron paid by the Provincial Government. This is very important. Mr. Mowat has now his opportunity. His own supporters are urging action upon

3. Exemption from taxation, free sites and bonuses to smelting works by munici-

Mayor Fleming and Impure Water, At yesterday's meeting of the Board of Works, the Medical Health Officer stated that he was about to make a careful and thorough examination of the water now supplied the city. Mayor Fleming is apparently apprehensive that this examina-tion will disclose the fact that our water is impure, and he warned Dr. Sheard to withhold from the public the result of his examination, no matter how bad he might find the water to be. The Mayor defended his action by stating that Toronto was becoming notorious as a place to be avoided on account of the press writing about its water as infamous water. If toriety through its, bad water we are of opinion that the best and only way for the city to regain its good name is to supply a good, pure article. Any attempt on the part of the Mayor and Dr. Sheard to conceal alarming information from the publi would simply intensify the evil and increase the undesirable notoriety. Besides, the public ought to be apprised of the state of the water that is forced upon them, so that if they see fit they may avoid using it. Mayor Fleming may rest assured that the only way to stop this talk of bad water is to cease supplying it and substitute the genuine, unpolluted article, such as the lake affords. Dr. Sheard's duty in the matter is to tell us whether or not the water of Lake Ontario is pure. If it is, then it rests with Engineer Keating to construct a plant to bring that water in its purity into our houses. The fault at present lies with the plant, and not with the water. No one has confidence in the conduit that runs through the bay, and the sooner a new location is ed for it the sooner will the cry of to stop a complaint is to remedy the evil.


