In view of the facilities for communication between this Province and the neighboring republic that are to be afforded the public in general during the coming season, we may certainly expect a large influx of visitors into this valley, seeking refuge from the glare and heat of the large cities of the Union. Bridgetown, from its pleasant situation and its fine scenic advantages, has shown itself to be very attractive to these particular tourists, who have been inclined to stop here for a few days, leaving the discomforts of their hotels, in order that they may see for themselves what has been repeatedly urged that Bridgetown is capable of affording attractions for a large class of summer visitors who seek for a retreat that is situated so as to afford them the full benefit of a country life and yet possess a quiet and orderly, but still shows a healthy business activity; all kinds of fruits, produce, meat, &c., can be readily procured in their season; beautiful drives afford a fine range of scenery, the country roads being everywhere bordered by well-tended farms, with their fine orchards, (in the month of June, when the orchards are in full bloom, we may fairly claim our country to be second to none in the world.) The Bay of Fundy is within a distance of five miles over a winding road, which, if steep, will repay the trouble it may take to climb. Other mountain roads, some of which present exceptionally fine views of the surrounding country, occur at intervals, by which the various hamlets on the shore may be reached. During the season good fishing and hunting grounds may be reached in a few hours, and guides can easily be obtained. Plenty of good teams may be had and at reasonable rates. Our climate is never oppressively hot, and the generally speaking, the thermometer will range between 70° and 80° in the shade during the warmest months, with always cool mornings and evenings. The above enumerated claims of Bridgetown to a share of the summer trade are, however, although we are reluctantly so, nullified by our want of proper hotel accommodations. In this respect we are sadly deficient. There are several good private boarding houses, and three country hotels, but their accommodations is scanty and far behind the requirements of the large class of tourists who seek to attract. We want a large hotel, pleasantly situated and well appointed, under the management of a capable man who has had experience in the business, and knows where to go and where to come. A hotel so built as to permit of a large portion of it being shut up during the winter months would be the best suited to make the speculation of putting one in other places and well situated to serve itself as capable of supporting a good hotel as Bridgetown, as it marks out a plain field of the matter, it is a stark contrast to us in that it is a well-kept, the traveling public and tourists in general give Bridgetown a wide berth or come only when necessity compels them, then get out of it as soon as possible. We know where we speak, and have been told repeatedly by stout-hearted, travelers and sea captains, that a large number of people would make Bridgetown their winter place every winter if only proper accommodations could be secured.
