General News.

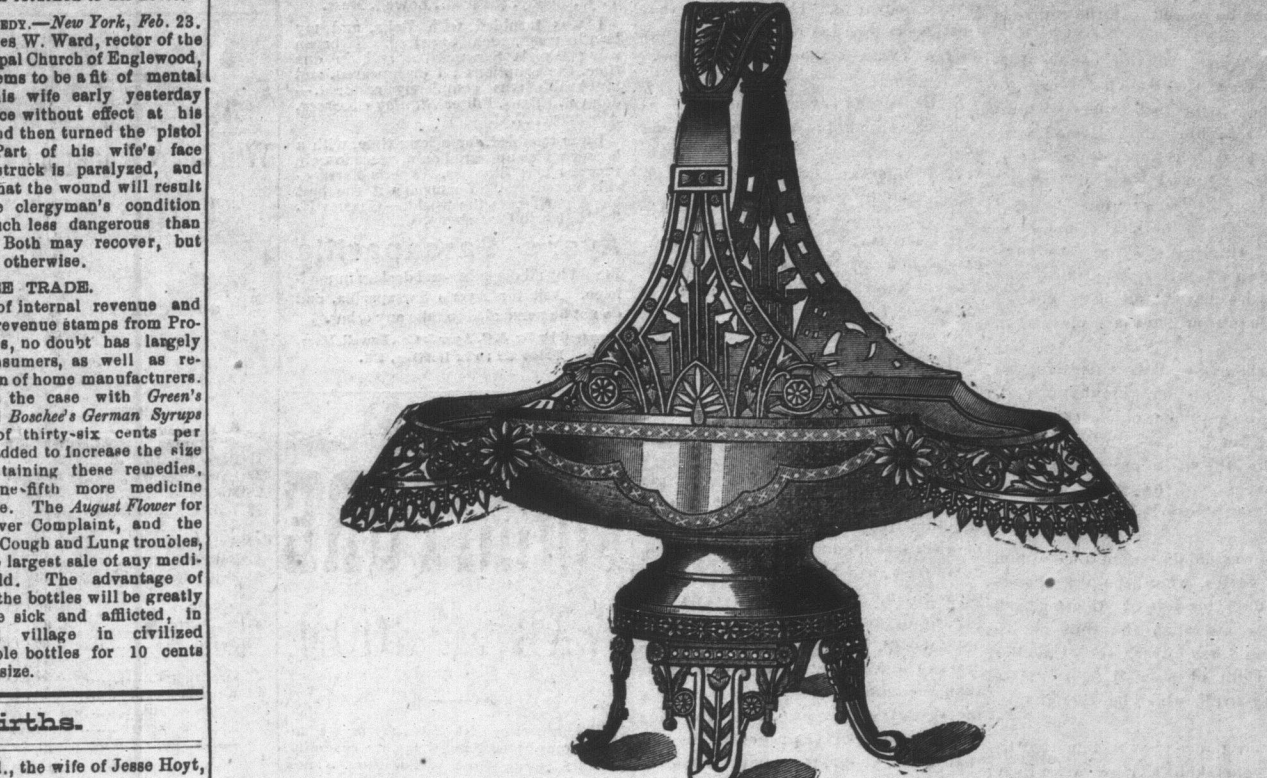
