SPRAYNIG THE **1920 APPLE CROP**

It seems to be the opinion of growers that the apple trees are well loaded with blossom buds, and though indicat ions are that we will have more than the average quantity of blossoms there seems every probability the blossoms will be weaker that than usual for the three following reasons: First, the large crop of undoubtedely reduce the 1919 vitality of the trees somewhat. Second. the frosts of October 19:9 caused the leaves to drop some weeks earlier than usual thus weakening the buds. Third, the extreme low temperatures of the past winter have, in the opinion of many orchardists, lowered the vitality of the buds of many varieties. With a prospect of a fairly heavy but weak bloom, the orchardists should take steps to correct the weakness and guard against injury
