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HERSCHEL'S WEATHER TABLE.

The following Table, constructed upon philosophical considerations of the attraction of the Sun and Moon in their several positions respecting the Earth, and confirmed by experience of many years' actual observation, furnishes the observer, without further trouble, with the knowledge of what kind of weather there is the greatest probability of succeeding, and that so near the truth that in very few instances will it be found to fail:—

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ECLIPSES.

During this year there will be four Eclipses: two of the Sun and two of the Moon.

I. On the 22nd January there will be an Annular Eclipse of the Sun, but it will not be visible in America.

II. On the 6th February there will be a partial Eclipse of the Moon. Visible in size 9,744 digits on the Northern limb. It begins in the evening at Montreal 9 minutes past 8. The Eclipse attains its largest size at 35 minutes past 9, and ends about 11 o'clock. It begins in Toronto 7.46, middles 9.12 and ends at 38 minutes past 10.

III. On the 18th July there will be a total Eclipse of the Sun in the morning. On this Continent it will be only partial. In Canada it will be visible about two hours, beginning a few minutes past 7 in the morning and ending a few minutes past 9.

IV. On the 1st August there will be a partial Eclipse of the Moon, but it will not be visible in Canada.

Until July 18th Venus will be the evening star, and then the morning star the rest of the year. Until July 17th Mars will be morning star, then evening star the rest of the year. Jupiter will be morning star until January 10th, then evening star until July 29th, then morning star the rest of the year. Saturn will be morning star until February 11th, then evening star until August 22nd, then morning star the rest of the year. Venus will be eclipsed by the Moon on the 24th April, visible generally throughout the country; the planet will disappear behind the Moon about half-past eight in the evening, and reappear about nine. Jupiter will also be eclipsed by the Moon on the 26th April, about one hour before the Moon sets.

STANDING RULES

On the subject of Private and Local Bills adopted by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, 3rd Session, 5th Parliament, 20 Victoria, 1857:

1. That all applications for Private and Local Bills for granting to any individual or individuals any exclusive or peculiar rights or privileges whatsoever, or for doing any matter or thing which in its operation would affect the rights or property

of other parties,—or for making any amendment of a like nature to any former Act,—shall require the following notice to be published, viz :—

In Upper Canada—A notice inserted in the Official Gazette, and in one newspaper published in the County or Union of Counties affected, or if there be no paper published therein, then in a newspaper in the next nearest County in which a newspaper is published.

In Lower Canada—A notice inserted in the Official Gazette, in the English and French languages, and in one newspaper in the English and one newspaper in the French language, in the District affected, or in both languages, if there be but one paper; or if there be no paper published therein, then (in both languages) in the Official Gazette, and in a paper published in an adjoining District.

Such notices shall be continued in each case for a period of at least two months during the interval of time between the close of the next preceding Session and the presentation of the Petition.

2. That before any Petition praying for leave to bring in a private Bill for the erection of a Toll Bridge is presented to this House, the person or persons purposing to petition for such bill, shall, upon giving the notice prescribed by the preceding rule, also, at the same time and in the same manner, give a notice in writing, stating the rates which they intend to ask, the extent of the privilege, the height of the arches, the interval between abutments or piers for the passage of rafts and vessels, and mentioning also whether they purpose to erect a drawbridge or not, and the dimensions of such drawbridge.

3. That the Fee payable on the second reading of any private or local bill shall be paid only in the House in which such bill originates, but the disbursements for printing such bill shall be paid in each House.

4. That it shall be the duty of parties seeking the interference of the Legislature in any private or local matter, to file with the Clerk of each House the evidence of their having complied with the Rules and Standing Orders thereof; and that in default of such proof being so furnished as aforesaid, it shall be competent to the Clerk to report in regard to such matter "that the Rules and Standing Orders have not been complied with."

Newspapers and Periodicals.—Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication addressed to any place in Canada at the following rates, *if paid quarterly in advance*, by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

For a paper published 6 times a week 2s. per qr., or 40 cents.
 " " 3 " " 1s. " 20 "
 " " 2 " " 8d. " 13 "
 " " 1 " " 4d. " 6½ "

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either Publisher or Subscriber, such Papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

Transient Newspapers.—Transient Newspapers, that is to say Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the Office of Publication, and American or British Papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by Postage Stamp, or they cannot be forwarded, except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers and News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mail.

Newspapers by Mail from England or United States.—Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mail are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge).

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada are charged 1 cent each on delivery.

Periodical Publications.—The rate on Periodical Publications is, if not exceeding 3 ounces in weight, 1 cent, over 3 ounces, 4 cents.

If prepaid by Postage Stamps from the Office of Publication Periodicals, published in Canada, weighing over 3 ounces may pass for 2 cents each.

Periodicals, printed in this Province, other than Newspapers when specially devoted to Education, (both religious and general), to Agriculture, to Temperance, or to any branch of science, and addressed directly from the Office of Publication to be transmitted to any Post Office in this Province, are exempt from charge.

Transient Periodicals.—including Canadian Periodicals not prepaid the commuted rate from the Office of Publication are exempted by the preceding clause, and all other Periodical Publications posted in this Province—must be prepaid by Postage Stamps, the full rate, at the time of posting.

Periodicals received in the Mails from the United States are charged with the rates named in the first clause of the section.

Postage Stamps.—Postage Stamps of the respective values of 1 cent, for Newspapers, 5 cents for ordinary Provincial

Letters ; 10 cents for United States rate ; 12½ cents for Canadian Packet, and 17 cents for Cunard Packet, are provided for sale to the Public.

Penal Clause.—The Act contains the following penal clause :

To inclose a letter, or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted for the Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

To inclose a letter or any writing, or to make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers), shall be a misdemeanor.

Money Orders on England, Scotland and Ireland.—Money Orders, payable at any Money Order Office in Great Britain and Ireland, can be obtained at any Canadian Money Order Office. The Orders are drawn in Sterling, the Commission chargeable being, for £2 and under, one shilling sterling ; from £2 to £5, two shillings. No Order can be drawn for more than £5 ; but any number of Orders of £5 each may be procured

hemp Tow undressed; Flour; Fruits, green; Fruits, dried, the growth of the United States only, while the Reciprocity treaty is in force; Furs, skins, pelts or tails, undressed, when imported directly from the United Kingdom or British North American Provinces, or from the United States, while the Reciprocity Treaty is in force; Gems; Goldbeaters' brims, moulds and skins; Grains: Barley and Rye, Beans and Peas, Bear and Bigg, Bran and Shorts, Buckwheat, Indian Corn, Oats, Wheat, and Meal of above Grains; Gravels; Grease and Scraps, Grindstones wrought or unwrought; Gums and Rosins in a crude state; Gypsum or Plaster of Paris, ground or unground, but not calcined; Hams; Hair: Angola, Goat, Thibet, Horse or Mohair, unmanufactured, Hemp; Hides; Horns; Household Furniture and Effects that have been in actual use for one month or more, of persons coming to settle in this Province, and in charge of the owner; Household Effects, personal, not merchandize, of subjects of Her Majesty, domiciled in Canada, but dying abroad; Indigo; Inventions and improvements in the arts, models or patterns of, provided that no article shall be deemed a model which can be fitted up for use; Junk and oakum; Lard; Lime, the produce of British North America only; Machinery, models and patterns of, provided the same be not put in actual use; Marble, in blocks or slabs, unpolished; Meats, fresh, smoked and salt; Menageries, horses, cattle, carriages, and harness of, subject to regulations by the Governor in Council; Military Clothing for Her Majesty's Troops or Militia; Military Stores and Materials for Military Clothing imported for the use of the Provincial Militia, under such restrictions as may be passed by Governor in Council; Mosses and Sea Grass, for upholstery purposes; Musical Instruments for Military Bands; Nitre or Saltpetre; Natural History, specimens of, Oils—Cocoa Nut, Pine and Palm in their crude, unrectified or natural state, Oil Cake or Linseed Cake; Ordnance Stores; Ores of all kinds of metals; Oser or willow for basket maker's use; Packages of all kinds in which goods are usually imported, except the following, viz: spirit, wine, oil, beer, cider and other casks for the containing of liquid, baskets of every description, trunks, snuff jars, earthenware jars, glass jars, bottles, and barrels, containing grain seeds and peas, Pig Iron, Pig Lead and Pig Copper; Pitch and Tar; Philosophical Instruments and Appar-

atus, Globes; Plants, shrubs and trees; Printing Ink and Printing Presses; Provisions for Army or Navy or Indian nations; Rags; Resin and Rosin; Rice; Sago Flour; Sail Cloth; Sal Soda; Sal Ammoniac; Salt; Seeds for agricultural, horticultural, or manufacturing purposes only; Ships Blocks; Ships Water Casks in use; Shackles; Sheaves; Signal Lamps; Silk; Hat Felts; Slate; Soda Ash; Spelter in block or pig; Specimens of Natural History, Mineralogy or Botany; Statues, busts and casts of marble, bronze, alabaster, or plaster of Paris, paintings and drawings as works of art, specimens of sculpture, cabinets of coins, medals, gems, and all collections of antiquities; Stereotype Blocks for printing purposes; Stone, unwrought; Sugar, (see sliding scale above); Sulphur; Tallow; Teasels; Timber and Lumber of all kinds round, hewed, sawed, unmanufactured in whole or in part; Tin and Zinc or spelter, in block or pig; Tobacco, unmanufactured; Tools and Implements of trade of handicraftsmen arriving in Canada, when accompanied into the Province by the actual settler, and brought in by such settler for his own use and not for sale; Tow, undressed; Travelling Trucks; Treenzils; Turpentine, other than Spirits of Turpentine; Type metal, in blocks or pigs; Varnish, bright and black, for shipbuilders, other than copal, carriage, shellac, mastic, or Japan; Vegetables not elsewhere specified; Vehicles of travellers, except those of hawkers or pedlars; Water Lime, unground; Wine, spirits and fermented liquors of all kinds, imported for Officers Mess, and the packages containing the same; Wood for Hoops, when not notched; Woods of all kinds; Wool; all importations for the use of Her Majesty's Army and Navy serving in Canada; or for the public uses of the Province.

All Bakers, Brewers and Distillers, and their Agents, the following annual duty for registration:—For each Baker's two wheeled vehicle, or corresponding sleigh, 40s. ; ditto waggon or ditto, 60s. ; ditto Brewer's or Distiller's two or four-wheeled vehicle or corresponding sleigh, 60s.
