



For instance, he could sell on the street on Sunday, or a barber could sell goods on Sunday, and a merchant could shave, and not come under the act; therefore, it was not a criminal law, being applicable only to sections of the community.

The argument will be taken up again this morning, and is likely to proceed all day. Mr. Marsh, Q.C., appears on behalf of some interested parties to oppose the arguments advanced by Mr. Paterson.




