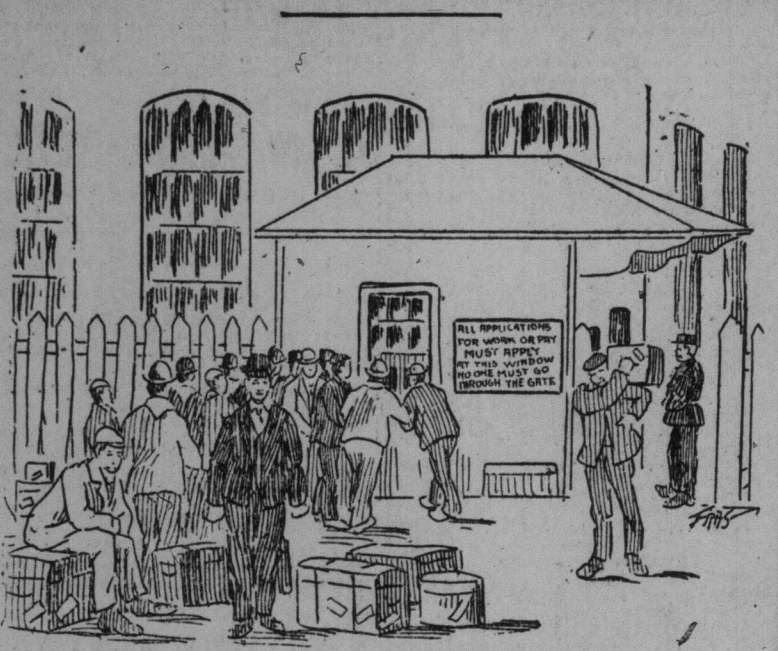

The sale is practically a formation of a partnership by the United States Steel Corporation, the Oliver Iron and Steel Company and W. P. Snyder.

The United States Steel Corporation pays into the treasury of the Crucible Steel Company \$4,000,000, and the Oliver and Snyder interests pay \$2,000,000, making \$6,000,000 in all.

The steel corporation receives one-half the shares of the capital stock of the Clairton, the Oliver and Snyder interests one-fourth, and the remaining one-fourth is still held by the Crucible Steel Company.

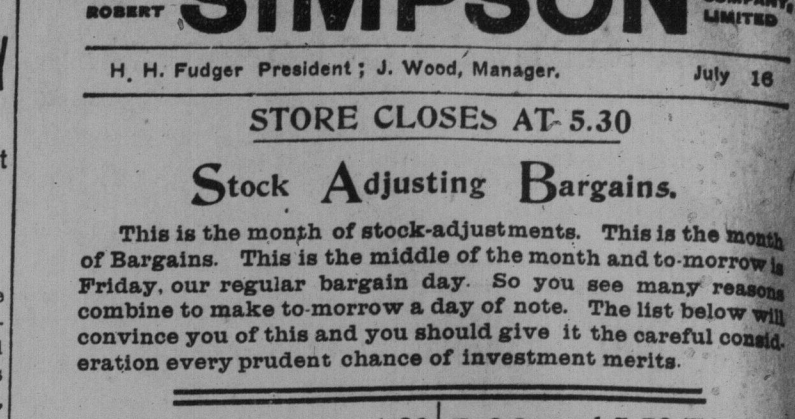
