A VERY TWISTED CASE.

Appeal of Sheet Metal Workers Advances Another Stage.

Sheet Metal Workers' Union No. 30, whose funds in the Dominion Bank were attached to meet judgment in the suit brought against it by the Metallic Roofing Company, is appealing from the order of Justice Anglin.

"You have no existence as a union," said Justice Meredith when the case opened yesterday, "you are nothing."

"We are nothing sometimes," said Mr. Donoghue, "but we are something when you begin to take our money."

Justice Meredith: "Every member will have to be sued, I suppose."

Mr. Donoghue: "Certain persons are to be sued, representing local unions No. 20, 21, and the international body. Surely those persons who have become members of this union since the attachment should not be made to pay these costs. There cannot be an order against the union making up order. This local union is one body, and the international union is another body."

Justice Meredith: "Whom do you represent?"

Mr. Donoghue: "I represented the Amalgamated Sheet Metal Workers, the union which was appointed to represent this paper."

Justice Meredith: "The Dominion Bank is the trustee?"

Mr. Donoghue: "No, the bank is custodian."

Then Judge Meredith asked Mr. Johnnie if he would be content to have the appeal as if the local union No. 30 had not been ordered to pay costs. He consented, and argued in the appeal this morning in so far as the appeal concerns the individual members of the union.

Sir Fred. Borden Promises a Detailed Statement in the House To-Day.

Ottawa, June 5.—(Special.)—When the government motion of motion were called in the house to-day, Sir Frederick Borden moved that, on Tuesday the house go into committee of the whole to discuss the following resolution: "That it is expedient to provide that the salary of the commander of the Royal Military College shall not exceed \$2500 a year, and that the salaries of the staff adjutant, professors, instructors, assistant instructors and staff sergeant, shall be fixed and may be readjusted from time to time by the governor-in-council."

Another resolution reads: "That it is expedient to amend the Militia Act, and to provide that the permanent force of the militia shall be increased to 5000 men."

Sir Frederick Borden, in a semi-explanation, said he preferred to wait until Tuesday, when he would have all the papers in regard to the matter. He would, however, bring down the resolution, and stated that he did so because he had been notified that N. A. Belouf, the member for Ottawa, had expressed the intention of bringing the matter up, that there was no real reduction of the militia. There had been a reduction of the training establishments, but not reductions in the general establishment of the militia.

In other words, the minister of militia said there had been no diminution in the actual peace and war establishments. As compared with the situation last year, there was positively no change at all. Regarding the question of officers, many reports that were concerning the real path of the matter, but Sir Frederick Borden asked that the matter be referred until to-morrow.
