CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

Province of Quebec Rifle Association.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be called the "*Province of Quebec Rifle Association*," and shall have for its object, the encouragement of Rifle shooting in the Province.
2. That the Annual subscription for Individual Members be two dollars, and a donation of ten dollars in cash, at any one time, shall entitle the donor to be elected a life member.
3. That any regularly constituted Rifle Association or Corps in this Province, may become affiliated to this Association, by the payment of an annual subscription of not less than ten dollars, the number of memberships to be in proportion to one for every half dollar so subscribed.
4. The affairs of the Association shall be managed by a Council composed of the office-bearers, and two representatives from each affiliated Association. Five to form a quorum.
5. The Office bearers of this Association shall consist of a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected primarily at the first meeting, and afterwards annually at the annual meeting.
6. A Patron and Vice-Patrons may be elected at the first meeting, and afterwards whenever a vacancy occurs.
7. The Deputy Adjutant Generals and Brigade Majors of the Province, being members of the Association, shall be members, ex-officio, of the Council.
8. The Representatives to the Council must be members of Association, either by affiliation or otherwise; they shall be chosen annually by the Association they represent, and their

name sent to the Secretary, at least one month before the annual meeting.

9. The Council may from time to time, make such By-Laws for their proper guidance as they may deem necessary, but no by-law to be altered or new one proposed, without at least such notice being given to each member of the Council, as by the by-laws may be determined.

10. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such time and place, as may be agreed on at the annual business meeting.

11. The annual business meeting shall be held at such time and place as may be determined on by the by-laws.

12. An Annual report shall be made by the Secretary and Treasurer and submitted to the Council, previous to publication.

12. At the Annual Meeting, the Council shall appoint an Executive Committee, to carry out the Annual Prize Meeting, under such regulations as may be made by the Council from time to time.

BY-LAWS.

1. That the Annual Meeting of the Association be held at Montreal on the first Thursday in May.

2. Extraordinary meetings may be called by the Secretary, when required, by any six members of the Council, fifteen days notice of such meeting given to each member of the Council, and the requisition must state the object for which the meeting is called.

3. Three Auditors shall be appointed annually, whose duties shall be to examine the Treasurer's accounts previous to the Annual Meeting.

4. The Treasurer shall be required to deposit from time to time—all sums of money paid over to him, on behalf of the Association—in a safe bank.

5. The payment of sums for current expenses, must be authorized by the President, or in his absence, one of the Vice-Presidents. Other payments, to be made only upon the authority of the Council.

REPORT

OF THE

FOURTH ANNUAL MEETING

OF THE

Province of Quebec Rifle Association.

MONTREAL, May 15, 1873.

The Minutes of the last Annual Meeting, and of the subsequent meetings of the Council and Executive Committee, were read and adopted.

The Secretary's and Treasurer's Reports were read and approved, and ordered to be printed.

The election of officers then took place with the following result :—

To be *President*—Lieut.-Col. C. J. Brydges, re-elected.

Vice-Presidents—Andrew Allan, Esq., Lt.-Col. McEachern, C.M.G., Lt.-Col. King, Lt.-Col. Grant, Lt.-Col. McKay, Lt.-Col. Hickson, Lt.-Col. Bailey, Robt. Hamilton, Esq., Allan Gilmour, Esq., Major Alleyn, Captain Esdaile.

Secretary—Lieut.-Col. Fletcher, C.M.G., re-elected.

Treasurer—Major D. Torrance Fraser, re-elected.

Executive Officers—Major Worsley, Capt. Hon. M. Aylmer.

Auditors—Lieut.-Cols. McEachern, Bacon, and Hanson.

Executive Committee—Lt.-Cols. Brydges, Fletcher, McKay, Rogers, Bacon, Grant, D'Orsonnens, Bethune, Bond, and Rowe, Captains Esdaile, Johnson, Morgan, and Thomas.

Surgeon—C. A. Coates, Esq., M.D., 51st Batt.

Resolved,—"That the Annual Matches commence on the second Tuesday in August."

Resolved,—"That Lieut.-Col. McKay, Lieut.-Col. Bacon, Lieut.-Col. Bond, Captain Esdaile, T. Beckett, Esq., with the Treasurer and Executive Officers, be appointed to collect subscriptions for the next Annual Prize List."

Moved by Lieut.-Col. Bacon, seconded by Major Worsley,
"That the sum of one hundred dollars be given to the Secretary for his services for the past year."—Carried.

Moved by Captain Atkinson, seconded by Lieut.-Colonel Hanson,

"That the Members of a Battalion having its Head-Quarters in Montreal, are fully entitled to compete in all our Matches, without reference to where its Companies are stationed."—Carried.

Moved by Captain Johnson, seconded by Captain Esdaile.

"That as the competition for the Team for Wimbledon is confined solely to enrolled members of the Active Militia of the Dominion, it is the opinion of the Council of this Association, that the Team should be sent to Wimbledon as a Detachment of Militia under the command of an Officer approved by the Adjutant-General. And that the Secretary be directed to send a copy of this Resolution to the Adjutant-General, and to the Secretary of the Dominion Rifle Association."—Carried unanimously.

The following amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws were proposed by the Secretary, and by resolution adopted.

Rule third of the Constitution,

"That on the first line, after the word *Association*, the words '*or Corps*' be inserted."

Clause first of the By-Laws,

"That the Annual Meetings be held on the *first* Thursday in May instead of the *third*.

Votes of thanks were passed to the Officers of the past year for their efficient services, and to Lieut.-Col. McEachern for his able performance of the duties of Chairman.

The meeting then adjourned.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

In presenting the Fourth Annual Report of the Operations of the Association, I beg to submit the following facts :—

The number of Battalions and Associations affiliated for the year was eighteen, being an increase of one over 1871.

The number of Competitors entered for the Matches, was 1503, an increase of 19 over the previous year, the attendance of Competitors would have been larger, but for the General Elections which were held in Montreal and other parts of the Province, in the same week as the matches, and prevented many from being present. The Executive Committee endeavoured, as far as possible, to avoid having the matches in the same week as the elections in Montreal, and for that purpose postponed the time first agreed upon—the 13th August to the 27th—but the elections were also postponed from the time first mentioned in the papers. Under the circumstances the attendance was encouraging.

The Programme of Matches was carried out successfully, without an accident. Dr. Coates, Surgeon of the Association, was constant in his attendance, but fortunately his services were not needed. The management of the Executive Officers, Lieut Col. Hanning and Capt. Hon. M. Aylmer, gave general satisfaction, not a single protest was made against their decisions. The weather was favourable for shooting throughout the week, and an effort was made to finish the matches on the Saturday, as the majority of the Competitors from a distance, had made arrangements to leave on that day, but the Committee were obliged to postpone the small bore championship till Monday. It would be well in future to arrange the Prize List in such a manner that would ensure the completion of the matches at an early hour on Saturday : a saving both to the Association and Competitors, would be effected thereby.

The Battalion Match was, as usual, the most exciting one

of the meeting. The Cup having been already won once by two of the competing battalions, viz: the 8th and 2nd G. T. R. Rifles, either of these Corps winning it again would hold it permanently. Twelve Corps entered, and after a very close contest between the three leading Battalions, the 8th Stadaconas were again successful, beating by one point the Three Rivers Provisional Battalion, thus winning the cup two years in succession, and carrying it off from any further competition. The contest was a close one, as may be seen by the scores of the five highest: 8th Batt, 176; Three Rivers, 175; G. T. R. Gar., Art., 173; 1st P. W. R., 170; 2nd G. T. R., Rifles, 170; 2nd G. T. R. Rifles, 159. The best score made at the longest range, was by the youngest battalion in the Dominion, the 79th Highlanders.

Now that the Provincial Cup is lost to the Association, something must be done to obtain another to take its place as a Battalion Challenge Cup. A suggestion was made at the last Prize Meeting, that a special subscription be made in the City of Quebec to purchase a piece of plate, to be called the *Quebec Challenge Cup*, to be fired for Annually by Battalions, at the Annual Matches of the Provincial Association. If this suggestion was carried out, it would be a generous act on the part of the friends of the Association, residing in the good old City from which this Province derives its name.

The Optional Rifle Matches continue to be popular, the Sniders at 500 yards against the small bores at 800, succeeded in taking eight out of fifteen prizes: at 500 and 600 yards against 800 and 900 for small bores they were not so fortunate, only 4 prizes fell to Government Arm.

We were again favoured with the welcome presence of a number of our old friends from Ontario, who were as usual successful in winning a goodly number of prizes, the attendance from year to year of so many of the best shots from the Sister Province, is an evidence that they approve of our system of working and appreciate our list of Open Matches. We were honoured during the progress of the matches, by a visit from Col. Church and Captain Wingate, officers of the newly formed "National Rifle Association of New York." These gen-

lemen were on a tour through Canada, collecting information relative to the system, and working of Rifle Associations. They expressed themselves pleased with what they witnessed at our ranges.

The thanks of the Council are again due to His Excellency Lord Lisgar, late Governor General, for a splendid Silver Cup presented to the Association on the eve of his departure from Canada. This Cup will be fired for at the next matches.

A very handsome addition was made to our prize list last year, by the presentation of five Martini-Henry Rifles, with 2,500 rounds of ammunition, by the London Testimonial Committee.

Thanks are also due to the National Rifle Association for their valuable Silver Medal. Our Association being affiliated with the N. R. A., the report of our last matches is published in the Annual Report of the National Association.

The Treasurer's report shews a falling off in the subscription list. With the exception of the Grand Trunk Railway, none of the Banks or Public Companies gave us any assistance last year. The thanks of the Association are due to Lieut. Col. Bacon, Capt., Hon. M. Aylmer, James Esdaile, Esq., and the Treasurer for the trouble taken in collecting subscriptions. The next Council will have to decide how to raise funds for the coming season. It will hardly be fair to call on the same people in this City five years in succession.

In some respects our expenditure has been reduced, but we have also had some extra expenses in putting the ranges in order. Platforms had to be built for the 400 yards ranges: the markers butts all required refacing, and the earth works of No. 1 & 2, 5 & 6 required new timbers at the sides, and had to be built up afresh. Additional expense for markers was incurred on election day, as the entire detachment of B. Battery, engaged as markers and buglers, were recalled to their quarters for the day, and extra pay had to be given to the new markers. The expenditure may be curtailed by finishing the matches within the week, and striking off one competition.

At the Annual Meeting of the Dominion Rifle Association in 1872, it was resolved to send a Team of twenty marksmen

from Canada to Wimbledon, to compete at the Annual Matches of the National Rifle Association; the Team to be composed of the best shots selected in the Dominion; each Province to hold a competition and to send to Ottawa the names of those making the ten highest scores: the twenty highest scores taken of the lists from the Provinces, to form the Team.

The competition for Province of Quebec was held at Point St. Charles on the 28th, 29th, and 30th of May. Eighteen Competitors entered and fired each 30 rounds per day for three days in succession, at three ranges, 200, 500, and 600 yards: out of the ten whose names were sent to Ottawa, six obtained places on the Team. Major Worsley, our Executive Officer, was selected by the Adjutant General to command this detachment of Canadian Militia, the Party was well received in England, and gained many honours and prizes at Wimbledon, defeating a Team selected from the best shots in the United Kingdom. The Quebec men were conquerors in a trial of strength between the four Provinces represented by the Team.

Another party of twenty will be sent this year: at a special meeting of your Council held on the 1st May, it was resolved to hold a competition for the selection of marksmen, on the 13th of May and following days, the fifteen highest scores are to be sent to Ottawa, similar competitions will be held in the other Provinces. The staff officers, and officers commanding Corps in the Province, were notified to send their best shots to the competition at Point St. Charles, on the 13th, it is to be hoped that Quebec will maintain its position as the best shooting Provinces.

The Council has again to acknowledge with thanks, the liberality of the Grand Trunk Railway, Vermont Central Railway, South Eastern Countries Railway, Richelieu Navigation, Canadian Navigation, and Ottawa River Navigation Companies, in granting Competitors passage over their lines, to and from the matches for one fare.
