THE HERRING FISHERY.

SOME INFORMATION ABOUT THE HERRING FISHERY. The Modes of Catching, Curing and Storing of the Fish—The Herring Fishery in the Bay of Fundy.

On Monday Hon. C. H. Tupper, minister of marine and fisheries laid on the table of the commons the special report of Messrs Wm. G. G. and M. G. Leach, the delegates appointed in June 1889 to enquire into the methods of catching, curing and packing fish in those counties.

The suggestions put forward in the report and recommended to be adopted, in the Canadian herring fishing districts are the subject of considerable comment among the fish dealers, and others interested in the fishing business.

Mr. John Seely, a prominent South Wharf fish dealer in conversation with a GAZETTE reporter expressed himself as being of the opinion that the proposals contained in the report as a whole would not be, if applied, of much benefit to the herring business in the Bay of Fundy.

He thought that as a general thing our fish were well cured and taken care of, but that an improvement might be made in the manner of preparing smoked fish. The class of fish, as a general thing, were not of good quality now as formerly, a large quantity of the smoked fish sold here are thought to be made up of inferior material.

Mr. Patterson thought that the government should look into this. Many people argued that this kind of fishing did no harm to the fisheries. The government set apart spawning grounds but no means are taken to prevent the wholesale destruction of young fish carried on year after year in the bay waters.

Every cure along the north coast of New Brunswick from Musquash west and south has from one to half a dozen of these weirs on its shores. Every land owner or person with a piece of land on the coast has a weir. The weirs are made of brush, birch or spruce logs, so that it is almost impossible for even the smallest fish to get through it.

Most of the large herring caught in the bay are taken by the schooner fishermen off shore. The small fish come along the shores and get into these brush weirs in immense quantities. At low tide the fish are taken out of the weir. Large quantities of fish are taken and taken to Eastport where they are put up as sardines, more are smoked, and the remainder of the small fish are either carried to the land and used as manure, or are made into pilchard food for fish.

In making it the fish are salted, boiled and then put into a press and have the oil pressed out. This oil is used for fertilizer and is sold for the benefit of the trade from time to time.

Speaking of this section Mr. Patterson has no objection to the suggestion that the fish be cured in a different way. The modes of curing and packing carried on by merchant curers, the same as is done with our harbor sardines, is a fishing business, and about the harbor and the fish can be handled over to the merchant curers as soon as the tide is out, and the fish are taken out of the water.

SECOND EDITION. PARRELL COMMISSION.

THE PARTICULARS OF THE REPORT OF THE JUDGES. The Action of League Leaders Contributed to Increase of Crime From 1882. Result Set up a False Standard of Honor.

London, Feb. 13.—The report of Judges Hannay, Day and Smith, the special commission appointed to investigate the charges by the Times against the Parrell members of the house of commons was laid upon the table in the house to-day by Mr. Matthews, secretary of state for home affairs. The judges find that the speeches made by many of the Parrell members were intended to bring about the separation of Ireland from England, and that the speeches of others in view of the state of the country were calculated to foment crime, as the speakers must have known.

The following specific charges against Parrell, personally, were not proved: That the time of the Kilmainham negotiations Parrell knew Sheridan and Boyton had been organizing outrages, and, therefore, wished to see them put down; that Parrell was intimate with the outrages; that Parrell was intimate with the outrages; that Parrell was intimate with the outrages.

As to the suggestion that crime was caused by the secret societies acting in antagonism to the league, Mr. Parrell stated in his evidence that in January 1882, that secret societies had ceased to exist.
