The decision of the Dominion Government to contribute \$40,000 a year in co-operation with the British Government towards the reduction of the cable rates to and from the West Indies should have a marked effect in increasing the trade under the new Reciprocity Agreement, The Ottawa Board of Trade has taken an active interest in promoting improved comcreasing the trade under the new commentary conditions were the control of the co

and Bermuda. Beyond Jamaica there is only one route, that of the West Indies and Panama Company, also a British concern, receiving £10,000 a year in subsidies.

The reduction in the rates about to be secured by an increased subsidy may defer the immediate consideration of the proposal for states ownership and control of cable communication between Great Britain, Canada and the British West Indies, but the increasing trade which is expected to result from the preferential tariff arrangements recently inaugurated will tend to make state ownership a policy to be dealt with in the not distant future.



WITNESS IN SULZER PROBE AND CAMPAIGN CHECKS WHICH FIGURE



IN THE WITNESS CHAIR

Serious charges against William Suizer, Governor of New York State, involving his record during the last gubernatorial campaign, have been made and are now being investigated by a committee at Albany, of which James J. Frawley is chairman. The investigation is part of the effort of the Governor's opponents to bring about his removal from office on a charge of violeting the Corrupt Practices act. Efforts are being made to bring about his indictment and trial in the courts on this charge as well as to depose him from the Governorahlp.

One of the chief points of attack is the charge that he did not file a true list of his campaign expenses and contributions. One of the chief specifications in this allegation is that he received a check for \$2,500 from Jacob H. Schiff as a campaign contribution and failed to file notice of this with the Secretary of State, as required by law. Louis Sarecky, who has been in the employ of Mr. Suizer for several years, was the first witness to be called to tell what he knows about allegations that Mr. Suizer did not file true lists of his campaign expenses and contributions. He refused to answer questions, and a court order compelling him to do so will be filed.

Checks and items on the Governor's sworn statement of campaign expenditures were put in evidence. The statement showed receipts of \$5,460 and disbursements of \$7,724.09. The initial questions put to Sarecky indicated an intention to show that a check for \$2,500, drawn on the National Bank of Commerce to the order of Louis A. Sarecky, signed Kuhn, Loeb & Co., and marked "Mr. Schiff's contribution toward William Sulzer's campaign fund," was not recorded on Mr. Sulzer's sworn statement. The questions also suggested that Sarecky had gone every three days before the election to New Jersey and had deposited checks there.
