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PROCEEDINGS OF FIRST DAY.

LONDON CITY HALL, February 21, '71.

The Right Worshipful the Grand Master, Brother and Companion, Sir D'Alton McCarthy, took the Chair at 12 o'clock, noon, and the Right Worshipful the Deputy Grand Master, Brother and Companion Sir W. W. Connor, took the Deputy Chair.

Brothers and Companions, Sir James McClure, Grand Director of Ceremonies, and Sir John Hoey, County Master of South Simcoe, tested the Brethren and Companions in the Royal Scarlet Degree. The Grand Chaplain being absent, the R. W. G. Master called upon the Rev. Sir Stephen Lett, L.L.D., Past G. C., B. A., to conduct the opening services in the Illustrious Degree of Royal Scarlet, after which the R. W. Grand Master declared the Twelfth Annual Session of the Right Worshipful Grand Orange Lodge of Western Ontario duly opened for the dispatch of business.

Companions Sir D'Arcy Boulton, D. G. M.; B. A., and Sir James McClure, G. D. C., W. O., repeated the Lecture of the Illustrious Degree.

MOVED by Companion James McClure, G. D. C., seconded by Companion Robert Cade, C. M. W. M., and *Resolved*,—That this Right Worshipful Grand Lodge be reduced to the Orange Degree.

The Grand Master accordingly declared the Grand Lodge reduced, and instructed the proper officers to that effect.

MOVED by Brother John Hoey, C. M., S. Simcoe, seconded by Brother G. F. Gow, C. M., Muskoka, and *Resolved*,—That this Right Worshipful Grand Lodge do now adjourn to three o'clock, p. m. The R. W. G. Master declared the Grand Lodge adjourned accordingly.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

CITY HALL, Three O'clock P. M.,

February 21, 1871.

Pursuant to Resolution, the Right Worshipful Grand Master took the Chair, and the Right Worshipful D. G. Master, the Deputy Chair, and called the Grand Lodge to order.

The Grand Master read the following telegram from the Right Worshipful Grand Lodge of Ontario East :—

Connor, C. M., S. Huron, Robert Dreaney, C. M., E. Middlesex, and J. L. Wilson, C. M., W. Lambton, be a Committee on Finance.

MOVED by Bro. Robert Wilson, C. M. of Bruce, seconded by Bro. Edward Henderson, junr., C. M., Welland, and *Resolved*,—That Bros. Francis Ryan, Edward Henderson, C. M., of Welland, B. Gerry, C. M. of N. Huron, J. C. Steele, C. M. of N. Wellington, and James A. Saunders, P. No. 1234, and the mover, be a Committee on Correspondence.

MOVED by Bro. William Parkhill, G. L., seconded by Bro. John Hoey, C. M. of S. Simcoe and *Resolved*,—That Bros. C. F. Gow, County Master of Muskoka, Robert Cade, C. M. of W. Middlesex, Robert McKee, W. M. No. 726, John Carter, C. M. of E. York, and the mover, be a Committee on Credentials.

MOVED by Bro. John Hoey, C. M. of S. Simcoe, seconded by Bro. Wm. Parkhill, C. M. of N. York, and *Resolved*,—That Bros. James McClure, G. D. C., James Bennett, D. M. of Toronto, John Lynn, D. M. of King, Samuel Howden, C. M. of E. Lambton, together with the mover and seconder, be the Committee on Suspensions and Expulsions.

The Grand Treasurer then presented and read his Annual Report, (for which see Appendix.)

MOVED by Bro. Robert Dalby, W. M. of No. 846, seconded by Bro. J. C. Steele, C. M. of N. Wellington, and *Resolved*,—That the Report of the Grand Treasurer be referred to the Committee on Finance.

The Grand Secretary then presented and read his

ANNUAL REPORT.

To the Right Worshipful the Grand Master and Brethren of the Grand Orange Lodge of Western Ontario, in Grand Lodge assembled:—

Once more, in the gracious providence of Almighty God, are we permitted to assemble in Grand Lodge, in this beautiful and rising city; some of us at least, may remember that one of the largest Grand Lodge meetings ever held in Canada, was held here in the year 1858.

It affords me sincere pleasure to be able to congratulate this Right Worshipful Grand Lodge on the increasing prosperity of our glorious institution in this part of Canada under your jurisdiction, both as regards increase of membership, respectability, and influence, and also in the financial position which we now occupy, in contrast with what it was six or eight years ago, eighty-eight Lodges having paid their Grand Lodge dues this year in excess of any former year, and two hundred and forty-six more than in 1865.

Many strange and momentous events have occurred since our last annual meeting. Again the dastardly Fenians have made a futile attempt at invasion, for murder and pillage, for surely they could not be so insane as to imagine that they could conquer this country—or even if they could conquer, be able to retain it. But thanks to the loyalty and pluck of our gallant volunteers, they left quicker than they came. Protestant Prussia has humbled Romish France, and the "eldest son of the Church," is now a prisoner, and the Holy Father, (Scarlet Lady) no longer upheld by French bayonets, is now shorn of his temporal power, and is little better than his eldest son. Spain is also making a mighty effort to be free, and shake from her shoulders that incubus which has held her down and reduced her from a first to a fourth or fifth-rate power in Europe. I need scarcely draw your attention to the mighty struggles which have and are still taking place in Italy, Austria, and other Romish countries, to shake off the galling yoke of Popish superstition and intolerance, and the rapid diffusion of the WORD OF LIFE. The little

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war cloud in the east has vanished (may we hope for ever) and our beloved mother land still enjoys the blessings of peace.

Rebellion has been rife, fanned by Popish Priests in the new province of Manitoba, and our late brother Scott became a martyr for his loyalty to Protestantism and British freedom. The traitors had to fly, but still the blood of our martyred brother crieth for vengeance on his craven murderers. The blood of the martyrs have always been the seed of the Church, and so it is with Orangeism.

There are now or soon will be, four Orange Lodges established in that sparsely settled province, and already the death-knell of Popery is sounding in our ears

I would particularly recommend the letter of Brother Stewart Mulvey, W. M. of No. 1307, Fort Garry, to the careful consideration of the Right Worshipful Grand Lodge during the present session.

We still find Popery true to her ancient instincts, as witness her murderous assault on our brethren and their friends, who were peaceably enjoying themselves in a park in the city of New York last twelfth of July, (see letters of the Grand Master of the United States, Bro. J. J. Bond) and I am sure you will deeply sympathize with the widows and orphans of our Brothers who were murdered on that occasion.

It is with feelings of pleasure that I turn from the contemplation of these sad scenes to one more congenial, and would therefore refer to the visit of our honored Brethren, the Delegates from the Grand Lodges of Ireland, England and Scotland, who attended the meeting of the Grand Orange Council of the empire in Toronto last July, and who were present at the grand celebration of our time-honored anniversary in that city.

I deeply regret that the time at their disposal was so limited that they were unable to visit more of our rising and prosperous province, as I am sure it would have afforded sincere pleasure to many a son and daughter of the mother-land, as well as of their offspring, to see and to grasp the hand of our worthy and honored Brother, Stewart Blacker, the worthy representative of a worthy house, as well as those of the other honored Brethren. The reception they met, and what they witnessed of our new country, far exceeded their sanguine expectations.

There have been five new Warrants issued during the year, viz :—

Nos. 1319 and 1322to N. Grey
No. 1321to S. Grey
“ 1320to Bruce
“ 1328to Brant

Six Warrants, some of which have been long dormant, have been re-issued, viz., Nos. 393, 538, 546 and 502 to the County of Muskoka ; No. 472, formerly in Norfolk, to South Simcoe, and No. 563 again to the County of Elgin ; No. 1026, stolen from the Lodge room, has been re-issued ; the County Master of Elgin reports No. 257 St. Thomas as again re-organized, and the County Master of Oxford, No. 438.

There is great diversity of opinion with respect to dormant Warrants—some contending that when a Warrant becomes dormant, it may be started again after one or more years, by the old members, or by other parties in the same locality, or in a different part of the same County—and some even go so far as to take them to other counties without either paying up the back Grand Lodge dues or renewing them again. I would therefore respectfully call attention to the reply of the Most Worshipful Grand Master to my question on that subject in the last report of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, page 22.

I would also call the attention of the Finance Committee most particularly to Lodges in arrears on the Grand Treasurer's books for back dues. It

is my firm conviction that the dues have been paid in most instances by the private Lodges, to some District or County Officer, but have never reached your Right Worshipful Grand Treasurer.

I have also reason to believe that the Reports, Circulars, &c., sent from the Grand Secretary's Office, have, in some instances, never been distributed by some of the District or County Officers to the private Lodges. This supineness on their part, causes a lukewarmness in the cause on the part of the private Lodges, thus neglected in many instances.

It is the same with Lodges as with private members, if allowed to get in arrears they lose that interest in the good work, and become remiss in their duty, and the Lodge soon becomes dormant or else a large number of suspensions for non-payment of dues and non-attendance is the result.

I am happy to report a vast improvement thus far in District and County returns, but there are still many defaulters. I was anxious to lay before you a complete Orange Directory of Western Ontario, but owing to press of Orange correspondence and the tardiness of the returns coming in, I am unable to do so; but it is fairly commenced, and I hope to get all the desired information with as little delay as possible. I again take pleasure in giving extracts from District and County returns.

The District Master of Brantford reports :—

A very large District meeting; never was in a more prosperous position; peace and harmony prevail, exemplifying the words of the Psalmist, "How pleasant it is for Brethren to dwell together in unity." We can muster from two to three times as many on the 12th as our returns show. This is on account of so many not being in connexion; but this difficulty is fast passing away, and we hope in next report to be able to say we have five times as many in connexion. We have six Lodges and another applied for.

The District Master of Toronto reports :—

The increase here has been unprecedented; 303 members have been added to my District the past year; large numbers of Young Britons are coming into our ranks, which I look to for further increase next year: No. 404 had, last night, fourteen for initiation, so you see the good work goes bravely on.

The County Master of Halton reports :—

"We are in a flourishing condition except one or two Lodges, and for them I expect improvement. There is marked prosperity in our Lodges—many are taking the higher degrees and more anxious to do so as soon as time permits. At our Royal Scarlet meeting in March, twenty were advanced. I fancy there is no better proof of zeal and interest in our cause than that afforded, when members, in numbers, desire the highest advancement. Thirteen were initiated in No. 272 in May. The increase is not merely in numbers but in men of position and influence."

The County Secretary of Haldimand reports :—

"It is with pleasure that I have to state that our noble Order has received a fresh influence in this County; we are again increasing rapidly, not only in numbers but likewise in respectability."

The Venerable County Master of Huron and D. G. M., W. O., reports :

"I have great pleasure in stating to you that my county is getting on in contentment, peace and brotherly love, which is a true omen of the prosperity of our time-honored Institution in this County. The annual district meetings in the several districts this year have all been well attended, and the best of harmony prevails amongst the Brethren; and I must say that our Annual County Meeting has been everything that could be desired—well attended, every Lodge was well represented, and all worked with a will for the benefit of our glorious cause; the best of feeling and brotherly love was manifested throughout the proceedings of the day and all well satisfied. I am of the opinion now that we are getting into working order again after the division of the County, that both South and North Huron will do better, and although we have adted no new Warrants this year to South Huron, we are adding members to the several Lodges throughout the County, and the Order in every respect is getting on better; working Brothers is what is wanting to forward our great and good cause; and I could wish with all my heart, that those lukewarm Protestants who boast so much of their loyalty, could only see the object of Orangism in its purity, and know what it really is and what it has done, and is doing at the present day for the Protestant Faith, in both this country and in the old country, which our ancestors died to defend. They might be more inclined to strengthen our Orange ranks."

The County Master of West Lambton reports :—

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"I feel it a great pleasure to be able to report so favorably concerning Orangemen in this County. The Order never was in better standing than it is at the present time; some Lodges are in splendid working order, and some that were almost dormant have arisen with renewed energy, and are doing very well. The County meeting was never better represented than it has been this year, which I think speaks well for the Brethren of West Lambton."

The County Master of Lincoln reports:—

"I have great pleasure in stating that this veteran County never was in such good Orange condition as at present; from that noble old Lodge, No. 77, of glorious memory, to No. 1297, all are prospering most favorably. We have a splendid Lodge of Orange Young Britons, established last September in St. Catharines, now numbering over sixty, who, I feel confident, will be an ornament to our good old Orange Tree in the course of time."

The County Master of West Middlesex reports:—

"We are gaining steadily, not so much in numbers as in influence; most of the returns were made with greater promptness, and the County meeting was a large and influential one; most every Lodge has a hall of their own to meet in."

The County Master of Muskoka reports:—

"I feel great pleasure in having to inform you that the Orange Lodges in this County are in a very prosperous and flourishing condition, and I have no hesitation in saying that two-thirds of the inhabitants of Muskoka are Orangemen, and as the district of Muskoka is likely to be formed into an electoral district, we expect to show forth our colors as Orangemen, in sending to the Legislative Hall two men of the right stamp."

The County Master of North Simcoe, and D. G. M. of B. A. reports:—

"I am happy to have it in my power to again give a favorable account of the Order in this section of the country. In the adjoining County of Muskoka at the town of Bracebridge, I had the pleasure of dedicating a hall to the Orange cause a couple of months ago, on which occasion I took the opportunity of spreading our principles by an address, which was well received by a very large audience. I also spent a day among the Brethren in an excursion round Lake Muskoka. In the adjoining Orange County of South Simcoe the Provincial Grand Master and myself attended a large demonstration on the Fifth of November, and delivered addresses (in the day time) and also attended another demonstration at night, so we were not idle. I am pleased to add that the building of Orange Halls still goes steadily on, not only in mine, but in the adjoining Counties. I have just prepared a deed for one Hall in the Penetanguishene District; in my County the Hall is up, and I am to dedicate it as soon as the snow falls; and I have instructions to prepare two more, one for Orillia district, in my County, and the other for the County of Grey; so you will see the Order is progressing. I am happy to say the absence of bickering, expulsions and suspensions continue to distinguish my County. When I hear of such things, I visit the locality, and can generally reconcile matters. On the whole, though there are some few instances of decline, I feel assured the Order has gained strength in numbers and influence."

The County Master of South Simcoe reports:—

"The Orange Institution is progressing in this County, even more than could be anticipated. Our District Meetings this year were better attended than heretofore. The Annual County meeting was the largest ever held in this County, about 200 members being present: order and general conduct very good."

The County Master of Toronto reports:—

"It is my pleasing duty to send you the returns for my County, and it is very satisfactory to me (as it will be to you) to know that we have made a very large increase in new members since my last report. Our total number now in connection, or rather up to December last, was 1177, and every Lodge is still increasing."

The County Master of East York reports:—

"I think that our County, on the whole, is in a more flourishing state than it has been for past years. We are getting a few new recruits; shall soon have a good Lodge of Young Britons in Markham village; with care and a good guardian will make a fine Lodge. The Young Britons should be encouraged, for it will be the making of good Orangemen in every County when they come of age to join the Lodges."

The County Master of North York reports:—

"I have much pleasure in being able to report that the Order in this County is still on the advance. We had large meetings at both District and County, and love and Brotherly feeling prevailed. Every Lodge has paid their County and Grand Lodge dues. I have been elected the sixth time unanimously."

"West York is in a satisfactory and steadily improving condition."

I have also received many cheering accounts of prosperity, &c., from private Lodge officers.

We have to mourn, in common with our Trans-Atlantic Brethren, the demise during the past year, of Brothers the Earl of Roden, Sir Wm. Verner Bart., and Dr. Drew, loved and honored names which will ever remain green in the annals of Orangeism.

Praying that the Divine Blessing may rest upon your deliberations and guide and prosper your decisions so that peace, love, harmony and unity may prevail.

Moved by Bro. James Bennett, D. M. of Toronto, seconded by Bro. John Boxall, P. No. 657, and Resolved,—That the Report of the Grand Secretary be referred to the Committee on Correspondence.

Bro. James Bennett, D. M. of Toronto, gave notice that he would, on to-morrow, move the following resolutions:—

Resolved.—That the Grand Lodge, as the Representative of the great Protestant and loyal body of the western portion of the Province of Ontario, in the Dominion of Canada, has read with much surprise the political capital which has recently been made by newspaper writers and political partizans out of the horrid murder of our worthy Brother, the late Thomas Scott, by certain rebels in Manitoba acting under immediate orders of Riel and Lepine. That the act itself was barbarous and cruel, divested of provocation or palliation, and calls aloud upon every humane mind, and especially upon every good subject of Her Majesty, to use all proper and constitutional means to bring the perpetrators of the bloody deed to condign punishment.

Resolved.—That while this Grand Lodge gives full expression to the feelings of every member of the Order in reference to the atrocious outrage named in the previous resolution, it hesitates not to denounce all parties who seek to make political capital, for mere party purposes, out of an act so barbarous and inhuman, and whose sympathies were withheld when needed to bring the equally guilty and rebellious murderers of Colonel Moodie, and the other brave and loyal men, to justice in 1837, thus evincing, by their sympathy for law and loyalty in the one case, and their want of it in numerous others, the hypocrisy of their professions, and the rank deceptions used to mislead such loyal and confiding men as may be blinfolded by devices so artfully contrived and so pertinaciously reiterated.

Resolved.—That this Grand Lodge, in adopting the foregoing resolutions, has two objects, and two only, in view. First, to impress upon the Dominion Government and upon the Government of Manitoba, the urgent necessity, as well as the justice, of vigilantly watching the perpetrators of the murder of Brother Scott, to the end that they may be brought to suffer the just penalty which the laws of God and man award to their inhuman barbarity; and, secondly, that in thus speaking out our full sense of horror at the crime, our act may not be attributed to, or identified with, political schemers, who seek rather to exalt party than to punish crime.

Bro. the Rev. David Smyth, G. C., gave notice that he would, on to-morrow, move as follows:—

That this Grand Lodge respectfully recommend the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, at its next sitting, to expunge from the Obligation the clause—"I was not rejected in any Orange Lodge."

Bro. D'Arcy Boulton, D. G. M. of B. A. presented and read the Report of the Committee specially appointed to investigate the case of surreptitious entrance into this Grand Lodge:—

Report of Committee.

To the Right Worshipful the Grand Lodge of Western Ontario:—

"Your Committee, to whom was referred the case of Bro. Robt. Boyd, a member of No. 188 and Past Master thereof, charged on the floor of this Grand Lodge with having surreptitiously gained admittance thereto without being legally in possession of the Annual, beg leave to report that they have investigated the whole matter, and find that Bro. Robt. Boyd overheard two gentlemen, but whom he is either unable or unwilling to name, talking about the Annual, and he picked it up, and on going to the door he gave the Tyler, as he says, the word; that he knew he was doing wrong, but trusted that it would not be checked. The Committee also find that the assertions made by him prejudicial to the haracter and standing, as an Orangeman, of Bro. Peel, W. M. of 188, are wholly un-

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founded. Your Committee therefore, beg to recommend that Bro. Robt. Boyd be not permitted to attend the sitting of this Grand Lodge, but that his Lodge, No. 188, be instructed by this Grand Lodge to investigate the whole matter and punish the guilty parties under the Constitution.

Moved by Bro. Joseph Doupe, D. G. S. of W. O., seconded by Bro. James A. Saunders, P. No. 1234, That this Grand Lodge dispense with Divine Service during this meeting, and that a collection in aid of the Protestant Orphans' Home be taken up at the beginning of the sitting on to-morrow afternoon. Lost.

Moved in amendment by Bro. J. L. Wilson, C. M. of W. Lambton, seconded by Bro. Samuel McLean, D. Report of Committee on Finance, (No. 1.)

murderers of Colonel Moodie, and the other brave and loyal men, to justice in 1837, thus evincing by their sympathy with law and loyalty in the one case, and the want of it in numerous others, the hypocrisy of their professions, and the rank deceptions used to mislead such loyal and confiding men as may be blindfolded by devices so artfully contrived and pertinaciously reiterated.

Middlesex, and *Resolved*,—That a Special Committee be now struck consisting of Brothers Samuel McLean, D. M. of Brant, Wm. Parkhill, D. G. M. James Bennett, D. M. of Toronto, Wm. Boles, C. M. of Lincoln, and John Machon, C. M. of Norfolk, to take into consideration certain Petitions, Appeals and Complaints pending between the brethren of London, and embodied in certain charges against Brother John Reid, District Master, on which the action of the County Lodge is disapproved of.

The consideration of the Report was then continued, and clauses three and four adopted.

MOVED by Bro. James McClure, G. L. of W. O., seconded by Bro. James Bennett, D. G. S. of B. A., and *Resolved*,—That to the fifth clause the words "and that this Grand Lodge do forthwith grant said Brother his certificate," be added.

The sixth clause was adopted.

MOVED by Bro. William Parkhill, D. G. M. of Western Ontario, seconded by Bro. John Orr, G. D. C. of W. O., and *Resolved*,—That the seventh clause be referred to the Committee on Finance with a recommendation to report a sum of fifty dollars towards the object sought. The Report as thus amended was then finally adopted.

Report of the Committee on Correspondence.

To the Right Worshipful the Provincial Grand Lodge of Western Ontario :

Your Committee on Correspondence beg to report that they have examined with due care, the correspondence of the Grand Secretary for the past year, and find that, with his usual judicious care that officer has given prompt and earnest attention to all matters coming under his notice.

2. In a Petition from Bro. E. T. Essery and others, in the matter of Bro. John Reid, your Committee deem that this Grand Lodge can take no action, they not having taken the proper steps to obtain a hearing from this Grand Lodge, but would suggest that the petitioners represent the case in a proper and legal manner to their County Lodge, in accordance with the rules set forth in the Constitution.

In reference to a letter from Bro. Joseph Doupe, D. G. S., there being no evidence before your Committee, they are unable to decide in the matter.

3. Your Committee find with grief and surprise that it is evidently the custom with some Private Masters, and also some District, County and Grand Lodge Officers to move Dormant Warrants from one District and County to another, and resuscitate the same, totally disregarding that rule of the Constitution which sets forth that all Warrants on becoming Dormant shall lapse back to the Grand Lodge, and can only be re-issued on the payment of the proper fee.

Your Committee therefore recommend that the proper steps be immediately taken to enforce the recall of such Dormant Warrants, and that in cases where such illegal resuscitations have taken place, the regular fee for re-issue of such Warrant be demanded, and in default of payment all such Warrants be cancelled, several such flagrant breaches of the Constitution having taken place.

4. With reference to the request of Bro. John Bennett, and brethren of L. O. L. No. 377, asking to be allowed to remove their Lodge from the County of Wellington to the County of Halton, your Committee would recommend that they be allowed to do so, the consent being given to such change by both Counties.

5. Your Committee regret to find from a letter from Joseph McArdle, that his private Lodge has not yet seen fit to comply with a resolution of this Provincial Grand Lodge held at Stratford.

6. Your Committee have also much pleasure in recording the receipt of a letter from Mr. J. J. Bond, Grand Master of the Loyal Orange Association in the neighboring Republic, (accompanied with a copy of their Constitution and Laws) and sincerely wish our neighbors a great and lasting success in that most noble of all causes, the propagation of Protestant Christianity, trusting that they may always continue on that road which leads to everlasting life.

7. With reference to a Communication from Bro. S. Mulvey, Master of L. O. L. No. 1307, Winnipeg, asking for aid to assist in raising a tablet to the memory of our late murdered Bro. Scott ; your Committee beg leave to submit said letter to the earnest consideration of this Grand Lodge.

8. Your Grand Secretary has placed before your Committee a most able scheme for compiling an Orange Directory, and we most sincerely hope that all members of the Orange Order will use every effort in their power by giving the fullest information to assist that most efficient officer in completing this truly most useful work.

Lastly, the complete style and manner of keeping the books and the very business-like Report of your Grand Secretary, commands the utmost praise.

Moved by Bro. Wm. Parkhill, A. D. G. M. of W. O., seconded by Bro. John Machon, C. M. of Norfolk, and *Resolved*,—That Bro. D'Arcy Boulton, D. G. M. of B. A., read the Report.

After some discussion and slight amendment it was

Moved by Bro. John Boxall, Proxy No. 637, seconded by Bro. James Bennett, D. M. of Toronto, and *Resolved*,—That the Report of the Committee who investigated the charge against Bro. John Reid be now adopted as amended.

Report of Committee.

To the Right Worshipful the Grand Lodge of Ontario West:—

Your Committee, to whom was referred the case of the Petition, Appeal and Complaint in the matter of the disputes between certain brethren in London, and Bro. John Reid, District Master of London and W. M. of L. O. L. No. 412, beg leave to report that they have investigated at great length, in a sitting of some ten hours, the whole matter of the disputes and the working of the Institution in London. They have heard the evidence offered by the complainants, and also that offered by Bro. Reid in defence, and he having positively refused to undergo examination in their presence, they do find that the said appeal and complaint is fully proved, that the said John Reid has been and is guilty of violating the constitution and laws of our Society in persisting in holding his Lodge in his own tavern, and in the words of the petition, *farming* the Lodge for his own pecuniary benefit.

They further find that a charge was laid before the County Lodge of E. Middlesex, embracing all these charges, and that Bro. John Reid had seven days' notice to appear, which he did do; that notwithstanding he so appeared, and waived by so doing, any irregularity, he claimed that he was not allowed the full eight days' notice, and that the matter was referred to a committee of seven to be held at a future day, who, we find, neglected or refused to take any action and allowed the matter to drop.

They further find that the appeal against the inaction of the said County Lodge is well founded and ought to be sustained.

They further find that Bro. John Reid has been guilty of passing himself on a Scarlet Chapter of our Institution wrongfully, and without even having legally received the fifth degree in our Association, viz., the Royal Scarlet.

Your Committee therefore beg leave to report that the said Bro. John Reid ought to

be expelled from the Institution, but they recommend the more merciful course of suspending him for five years, and unless he forthwith delivers up all Lodge property to the proper authorities that he be expelled.

Your Committee beg to report that the said Lodge, No. 412, ought to be at once removed from Bro. Reid's tavern and taken to some place where it may be held without violating the Constitution.

It is the duty of every County, District and Primary Lodge to make an Annual Return to the Grand Secretary.

The returns from Primary Lodges should be made the day after the regular meeting in December, and should distinguish the Officers elect for the coming year.

The returns from District Lodges should be made on the second Wednesday in January.

The returns from County Lodges should be made on the first Wednesday in February.

All sentences of Suspension and Expulsion from the Order, must be taken from the Primary Lodge to the District, thence to the County for confirmation, and be entered on the several returns, otherwise they will not be entertained by the Grand Lodge.

All Reports, Rituals, Constitutions and Blank Forms will be supplied gratuitously, through the County Masters, to whom all applications of this character should be made.
