

SCIENCE AND DRAW POWER

Following the illustrious example of Professor Proctor, who has formulated the mathematical laws governing the phenomena of draw power, Sir William Thomson recently submitted a paper to the Royal Society, entitled, "The Correlation of Blind and Straddle," in which he claimed to have made the following discovery:

"In experimenting upon the effects of age upon the diversity of straddled hands before the draw, I found, first, when the senior hands consisted of one conventional straddle of draw and one Devonian straddle of Kings, with an intermediary and unobtainable straddled hand, consisting of one club or other inferior straddle, the tendency to create an upheaval in the metallic deposits, and thereby cause an irregularity in the formation, said hand was irregular in its formation. 


