those who need help. Among others may be mentioned the House of Industry in Elm-street, where several gallons of soup are served out daily to all regardless of nationality or creed. The Board of the House has divided the city into districts, each of which is under the care of a visitor, who personally visits the abode of every applicant for relief, and according to his recommendation the board grants bread and fuel pro rata to each family. In cases of sickness small grants of groceries are made. The design of the board is to help the poor without making them paupers. The visitors go among the recipients of their districts weekly and distribute bread tickets, etc., and give such advice as may be deemed necessary. There is no remuneration for any visitor. Theirs is purely a labor of love. The following is a brief summary of one day's visitation in one district:

1. A widow. No fuel for three days,

months,

2. Husband a gardener. No work for five months except sifting ashes and shovelling snow. Wife does a little washing, but has only been out of the hospital a few weeks, and suffers from inflammatory rheumatism. There are three children.




