

COUNTY AND CITY OF ST. JOHN.

(Corrected from " Munroe's History of New Brunswick.")

Boundaries.—" The said City and County of Saint John, bounded south by the Bay of Fundy; west, by Charlotte; north, by the line run north, eighty-three degrees and thirty minutes east from the southernmost point of Kennebecasis Island, by Deputies Scully and Palmer, in the years of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, and one thousand eight hundred and forty-one; and the westerly prolongation of said line to Charlotte; east, by the line run north by Deputy Stiles, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, from a birch tree on the shore of the Bay of Fundy thirty chains, east from the mouth of Goose River, including all the islands in the Bay of Fundy adjacent thereto."

This county is divided into four parishes, besides the City of St. John, viz.: Portland, Lancaster, Simond's, and St. Martin's. The county has a front line of nearly eighty miles on the Bay of Fundy from a little to the east of Goose River, at the south angle of Albert, to Point Lepreau, at the easterly angle of Charlotte; this coast is but thinly settled. The breadth of the county varies, with the indentations of the coast, from five to thirteen miles; it contains, exclusive of water, 414,720 acres, of which, in 1851, there were only 21,725 acres cleared. In 1852, 309,147 acres had been granted and located, and there were 105,573 acres still vacant. The population exceeds 42,000.

In an agricultural point of view, the soil of this county could not, without an unwarrantable outlay of capital, be made to sustain even one moiety of its inhabitants. Yet, notwithstanding that the surface is generally rocky aud sterile in its nature, and therefore not adapted for a systematic mode of farming, there are numerous small tracts well worthy of the farmer's These spots are now being made available, and great facilities are afforded for this purpose by the large quantities of alluvial deposits found along the numerous streams flowing through the vallies with which the county is everywhere intersected; the vast quantities of limestone, of which the hills are principally composed; and the abundance of manure, supplied by the neighborhood of a large city. By these appliances, not only may the already tillageable soils be rendered more productive, but the semi-barren lands may be made to yield a return; while the best market for agricultural produce in the Lower Provinces—the City of St. John -holds out a strong inducement for the extension of the agricultural operations of the county.

The City of St. John, which was established by Royal Charter in 1785, is situated near the mouth and on the eastern side of the river of the same name; the town of Carleton, which forms a part of the city, as incorporated lying on the western bank. The extensive suburbs of Portland and Indiantown, on the north, may be almost said to be parts of the city, though not subject to its magistrates, or included within its boundaries. The city proper contains, at the present time, about 25,000 inhabitants.

CITY OF SAINT JOHN.

General Description—Commercial and other Advantages.—The city of Saint John, the capital of the county, stands on a rocky eminence, of a peninsular form, within the harbor, and has a commanding aspect. The country for many miles round is beautifully variegated by lofty hills, alluvial vallies, and numerous sheets of water, formed by lakes and the meanderings of the River St. John. The harbor is situated in latitude 45 deg. 15 min. north, longitude 66 deg., 4 min. west; it is noble, safe, and spacious and has sufficient depth for the admission and safe anchorage of ships of the largest class; the tide rises and falls from twenty to twenty-six feet, and the water in the harbor varies in depth from ten to sixty fathoms; thus affording great facilities for repairing and launching vessels. Partridge Island, at the entrance of the harbor, is beautifully situate; on it stands a battery, light-house, signal-station, and hospital for the reception of sick emigrants and sailors.

That part of the harbor to the westward of the island is only navigable for small vessels, even at full tide. Mariners are directed in their approach to avoid danger by the light-house on the island, visible at a great distance, and another on a spit within the harbor. There is also a floating fog-bell, moored at some distance off the entrance. By these aids, vessels may be piloted in at any hour of the night, and in case of any accident occurring, life-boats, manned with able and efficient crews, are at command.

At the extreme outward point of the peninsula, on which the city stands, are the parade-ground, two batteries, military station and barracks, capable of containing two thousand men; this position commands the whole harbor and its entrance. In the rear of the city, and a little to the northward of Portland, stands Fort Howe, on a high hill at the foot of which is a military post and magazine. This fort commands the whole upper part of the harbor.

The surface of the city is very uneven; it lies in the form of a ridge, sloping in every direction; the streets are numerous, and generally laid out in a systematic and regular manner, with the exception of some of them being too narrow. It has suffered much at different times from the effects of fire; however, it is well filled up, and the older wooden buildings are being replaced by others of more durable quality, being built of brick or stone, evincing considerable taste and very commodious. There are two squares within the city, with considerable areas, reserved for the accommodation of the public, the one called King's, and the other Queen's Square.

In taking a circuit from the military post on the south-east point of the peninsula, thence along the margin of the spacious basin, forming the harbor for a distance of about a mile and one-fourth, through Portland to Indiantown, and from thence across the Suspension Bridge to Carleton, the eye will behold, within an extent of about three miles, the nucleus of a city, with its numerous streets ascending the acclivities which surround the harbor, destined hereafter, to become a place of no small commercial importance. Included within this circle, are not less than five thousand edifices of various kinds, private houses and stores, churches and places of worship, belonging to Episcopalians, Presbyterians, Roman Catholics, Baptists, Methodists, Independents, and others; Academies, School Houses, Warehouses, and Foundries, as well as Manufactories for lumber and other purposes. There will be found also a Grammar School, Mechanics Institute, together with a Court House, Jail, Poor House, Hospital, and all the others incident to a large commercial sea port. There is a handsome Custom House and two convenient Markets, besides many other public buildings and philanthropic institutions. The numerous wharves and slips fronting on the harbor, throughout the city, as well as Portland,

There fax, Pic with Ch Miramio and Carleton embraces an extent of nearly two miles; the whole distance presenting one continued thoroughfure of business. Few places, indeed, of the same size and population, evince better indications of prosperity than are shown by this thriving sea-port. And yet, but about seventy-five years ago, this crowded city was a mere peninsula of rock, covered with a dense mass of shrubbery, composed of cedars, spruce, birch, and underwood.

The City of Saint John, including, of course, Portland and Carleton, is even at present the commercial emporium, not only of the Province of New Brunswick, but of that extensive western portion of Nova Scotia, from the head of the Bay of Fundy to Yarmouth harbor, including the numerous and flourishing settlements which have sprung up on the many bays and rivers along this range of country. In this point of view, and looking at the advantages it possesses, from its position at the entrance of a noble river, second to none in British North America, except the St. Lawrence, and possessing the great advantage over that river or being free from ice during the whole year, the conclusion forces itself on our minds, that, before many years roll around, its commerce will be inferior to that

of few places on the North American Continent. With the exception of a circuit of a few miles in the immediate neighborhood of the city, which is not adapted for farming, although highly favorable for ship building, manufactories, and other branches of industry the whole country, for more than one hundred miles cast and west, and above two hundred miles in a northerly direction, is capable of affording vast quantities of agricultural produce, and of undergoing many other improvements, all of which would contribute to the extension and commercial prosperity of the city. The River Saint John and its branches may be considered navigable for steamboats for over two hundred miles, and for other small craft for not less than two hundred more; and this mode of conveyance, yearly increasing, cannot fail to render it the depot of an enormous extent of country. A Line of Steamers run between Indiantown, near the Suspension Bridge, and Fredericton, leaving each place, by special arrangement, every morning and evening, thus affording a daily and nightly communication between the two cities, one the commercial emporium, and the other the Head Quarters of the Province. Two steamers are employed twice a week, with the exception of about two months, during the middle of winter, between the City and Sackville, Dorchester, and the Bend in New Brunswick, and Annapolis, Windsor, and other ports on the west coast of Nova Scotia; bringing the produce of these fertile and extensive districts, and especially the fat cattle and butter of the counties of Westmoreland and Cumberland, proverbial for producing the best of both these articles that can be found in the Lower Provinces, to the market of Saint John. In return, these steamers are the means of supplying all those populous districts with merchandise and West India produce to a considerable amount.

Steamers leave Saint John for Boston three times every week, during the summer, touching at Portland and Eastport on their way. Railways are completed from Portland to Boston, New York, and also to Montreal and Quebec; the time occupied in travelling from Saint John to either of those places, would not exceed thirty hours. By these means a ready communication is opened with the whole of the United States and Canada.

Ferry Boats are continually plying, during the day, between the City and Carleton, thus affording to men of business a more speedy means of communicating with each other than by taking the circuitous route over the

Suspension Bridge. There is a communication, established by electric Telegraph, with Halifax, Pictou, Windsor, Truro, Amherst, and other places in Nova Scotia; with Charlotte Town and Cape Traverso in Prince Edward Island; with Miramichi, Richibucto, Shediac, Sackville, Dorchester, the Bend, Sussex

The European and North American Railway places Saint John in direct and rapid communication easterly with Halifax, Shediac, and the flourishing settlements along these lines, respectively, westerly and northerly, with St. Andrews, Woodstock, and the great network of railways, either already constructed or in progress, in Canada and the American Union. And to crown the whole, we may indulge reasonable hopes, that the time is at hand, and the increasing trade of this portion of the Province is forcing it on, when a direct line of steam communication will be established between this port and the Mother Country.

The Lunatic Asylum is a neat and commodious edifice, pleasantly situated near the west end of the Bridge. It is conducted in the best possible manner, and every way in accordance with the modern mode of treatment adopted in Great Britain and the United States, and is a stand-

ing monument of the philanthropy of the Province.

The streets are well lighted with gas, and the water company derive a supply of excellent water from a lake at a distance of about four miles, from which iron pipes are laid.

The Suspension Bridge. - This bridge over the River Saint John, is about a mile and a quarter from the city, and is an excellent specimen of modern bridge building; it reflects great credit on Mr. Reynolds, the architect, more especially as there had been so many fruitless attempts made to span the vortex over which it is thrown.

The bridge is allowed to weigh, including cables, one hundred and fifty tons, and will sustain, in addition to its own weight, a load of one hundred and thirty-one tons, if equally distributed all over the platform, as the

"safe load it can carry, without a shadow of doubt."

Falls of Saint John.—There are few rivers in America of so great an extent (no less than 450 miles), whose tributary lakes, rivers, and minor streams, when accumulated, make their exit into the sea through such a narrow, tortuous passage as the River St. John. The cliffs on each side of this narrow gorge or fissure, at the head of the harbor of St. John, are about one hundred feet in height, and are composed principally of variegated limestone; the chasm is from 450 to 650 feet in width. the small rocky islands in the stream, which are being worn away by the dashing cataract, and to the rocky protuberances which project from the sides, the water rushes through this narrow passage, which is little more than half a mile in length, with great force. The rise of tide in the harbor ranges from twenty-two to twenty six feet, and the water, above the falls, rises at flood, from one foot and a half to three feet; the height of the fall may therefore be estimated at from twenty to twenty-three feet. But for about three-quarters of an hour during each flood-tide, the whole surface of these periodically troubled waters become calm and placid, as if to accommodate itself to man's requirements, and is rendered, by this law of nature, navigable for ships, steamers, etc. A visit to this spot well repays the admirer of nature's anomalies.

Portland.—The southern portion of this parish forms a part of the City of St. John.

The present Volunteer Fire Department was organized in the year 1849, and is composed of one Hook and Ladder and eight Engine Companies.

There are sixty men attached to each engine, who receive Certificates of appointment from the City Corporation. Each Fireman is exempt from Militia duty, from serving on Juries, and from the payment of City Rates, to the amount of Thirty Dollars yearly. He is required to serve for a period of fourteen years, when he is allowed to retire with certain privileges.

The Apparatus of the Department is of the best description—the Engines particularly - which have been procured mainly through the exertions of the Officers and Members of the respective Companies. The care and attention bestowed in keeping them in complete working order and ready for immediate use, reflect the greatest credit on the Brigade.

ST. JOHN SUSPENSION BRIDGE COMPANY.

The project of constructing a suspension bridge over the River St. John, near the city, originated with William K. Reynolds, who, after two years of persevering exertion, succeeded in obtaining a Charter and forming a company for this purpose.

The bridge was erected in 1852, at a cost of £20,000. Mr. Reynolds being the contractor, and Capt. Edward W. Serrell, of New York, chief engineer. Its dimensions are as follows: - Span, 650 feet; width of roadway, 23 feet; height of towers, 52 feet; depth from floor of bridge to top of high water, 72 feet - suspended from ten cables, each containing 300 strands of wire, making total of 3000 strands. The roadway has since been rebuilt at an expense of £3,500.

ST. JOHN MECHANICS' INSTITUTE.

This Institution was formed in 1838. It is under the direction of a president, two vice-presidents, a treasurer, a corresponding secretary, a recording secretary, and a board of directors—three-lourths of whom are mechanics. These are all elected, annually, from among the members, whose number now amounts to nearly four hundred. Prosperity has attended this institution since its first establishment. In 1840, its popularity led to the necessity of erecting a building for the use of its members. This building contains a hall for public lectures, a large room in which the Gesner Museum is deposited; a library room; a news room; and other rooms, which are appropriated to particular objects. The news-room is constantly supplied with the latest papers, both domestic and foreign, and the best magazines and reviews of the Mother Country and United The library contains now upwards of 3000 volumes, and every years receives additions of new works, of sterling worth. The museum, which, by the liberality of those who purchased it in shares from Dr. Gesner, is now the property of the Institute, contains a large and valuable collection of minerals, a great variety of zoological specimens, and many Chinese, Indian, and other curiosities, and frequently receives additions from sea captains and others, who get into their possession foreign articles of an attractive description. The hall, which, in its original state, could accommodate from seven to eight hundred people, has been lately so enlarged, that accommodation can be given to seven hundred more. The hall is exceedingly useful, and appears to be the most eligible place for societies to hold their annual and other public meeting. The members of the Institute have been favored with courses of lectures in the hall every winter, from gentlemen of good literary acquirements, chiefly belonging to the city, on scientific and other subjects of general interest. The museum is open on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday evenings, at 8 o'clock. The library is open on Monday and Friday evenings at 8 o'clock.

CHURCH OF ENGLAND YOUNG MEN'S SOCIETY.

The formation of Young Men's Societies can be traced back to the latter part of the reign of Charles the Second. In that period of abounding iniquity, associations of young men for the purpose of mutual edification in godliness, were established. The first was formed in London in 1678, and in twenty years afterwards there were twenty distinct societies in that city and its suburbs. Nor were these devoted young men without their imitators, for similar societies were soon established at Cambridge, Gloucester, and other towns in England. Under the encouragement of the archbishop of Dublin, similar societies made their appearance in Ireland; in Dublin alone from beginning with one society, numbering three or four individuals, they in a few years increased to nine or ten distinct

The Church of England Young Men's Society, in the City of St. John, The objects of it are, primarily, the was formed some years ago. advancement of moral and religious habits among young men who are resident in the city: and secondly, the general advancement of Evangelical religion in the city, province, and elsewhere. To effect these objects, weekly meetings of the members are held, in which the Bible is studied, and essays upon religious subjects are read. The rooms of the Society are also opened four evenings in the week, where the members can resort for the perusal of books; magazines, and newspapers. Courses of lectures are also delivered every winter by clergymen and other members of the Church of England friendly to the Association. A library is formed of religious books, and other means are about being adopted to promote the great objects of the society. Each member pays 15s. a year. The annual meeting for the election of officers and the transaction of other business is held on the first Tuesday in January. At the last meeting, the following gentlemen were elected office-bearers for the current year :-

ST. JOHN YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION.

This very useful Association was established in this city in December, 1854, on the plan of societies of the like nature begun in London in 1844, and followed since by numbers in the United States and the sister Provinces. A number of zealous and active young men, belonging to different Evangelical churches, requested the ministers of the Protestant denominations, and others interested in the religious welfare of youth to meet together, and having formed a constitution on the model of the English and United States associations, and chosen their officers, began to act in a room of the Mechanics' Institute, and since removed to Smith's Hall, Prince William Street. Their numbers are now about 200. They receive as active members, all members of Evangelical Churches—as associate, all persons of good moral character. Life members pay £5; annual contributors, 10s. They manage their affairs by a large committee of active members, who meet every alternate Tuesday evening. The Association meet regularly once a year, besides attending a Bible class every Sunday afternoon; a literary class every Monday evening; a prayer meeting every Wednesday evening, and when called on special occasions. The rooms are open every evening between the hours of 8 and 10 o'clock (except Saturdays and Sundays.) They are well furnished, lighted, and cheerful — have a library — periodicals from various parts of the world, religious and secular; and accommodations to induce young men to pass their leisure evenings in them most agreeably. The Association is in connection with the great Confederation of the United States, the sister Provinces, and through its delegates, with England, France, and other parts of the continent of Europe.

Their means of doing good are—their Reading Rooms, Season Lectures, Bible Class, Prayer Meetings, Literary Exercises, Attention to Strangers,

and intercourse with kindred societies from other countries.

HACKNEY COACH FARES.

I. And be it Ordained, That it shall and may be lawful for the owner or driver of every Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle as aforesaid, to ask, demand, and receive the following prices or fares, for the conveyance of passengers within the limits of the said City, viz.: - For conveying one passenger from any Public Stand to any other part of the said City, or from any one part of the said City to any other part thereof, One Shilling; and for every passenger exceeding one, Six Pence additional; and if any driver of any Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle as aforesaid, shall be detained at any place by any passenger, or shall make any agreement for carrying any passenger or passengers by the hour, he shall be entitled to ask, demand, and receive the following rates, viz.: - For any time not exceeding half an hour, One Shilling and Three Pence; and in that proportion for every half hour that such Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle as aforesaid, shall be detained or employed. Provided, always, that in case any driver shall be record to cross the Ferry to Carleton, he shall, in addition to the foregoing fares, be entitled to demand and receive the ferriage for himself, his carriage, and horses, both going and returning.

LI. And be it Ordained, That every Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle, used or driven for hire as aforesaid, shall have fastened up, in some conspicuous place, on the inside of such Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle, as aforesaid, a plate or card, on which shall be engraved or printed, and distinctly to be seen, the name of the owner, the number of his License, and the Fiftieth Section of this Law, showing the rates of fare; and if any driver of any such Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle, shall convey any passenger or passengers without having such plate or card, as aforesaid, or shall ask or demand any greater or higher rates or prices than are hereby fixed, he shall not be entitled to recover any compensation for the conveyance of any such passenger or passengers; and if any owner or driver of any such Coach, Carriage, or other vehicle, shall convey, or cause to be conveyed, any passenger, without having such plate or card as aforesaid, or shall demand and receive any greater or higher sum than he shall be entitled to receive by virtue of this Ordinance, he shall be liable to the penalty of Ten Shillings for each and every offence.

For conveying one passenger from the City line to the Railway station in Portland, or from said Railway station to the City line, One Penny. And for every member of same family or party, One Penny additional, with baggage not exceeding 80 lbs. each passenger: by night or by day.

For conveying one passenger from the City line to Indiantown, or from Indiantown to the City line, Six Pence; and for every member of the same family or party, Twopence additional, with baggage as before: by night or by day.

For conveying one passenger from the City line, as far as Portland Church, or from the Portland Church to the City line, Threepence; and for every member of the same family or party, One Penny additional, with baggage as before: by night or by day.

For conveying one passenger from the City line to the Straight Shore, as far as the Suspension Bridge, or from the said Bridge to the City line, Sixpence; and for every member of the same family or party, Twopence additional, with baggage as before: by night or by day.

For conveying one passenger from the City line to the Alms House, Penitentiary, Rural Cemetery, or Lunatic Asylum, or from any of thos






(Corrected from " Munroe's History of New Brunswick.")

The City of Fredericton, formerly called St. Ann's, was constituted the head-quarters of the Province in 1785, by Sir Guy Carleton, its first Governor; and it has ever since continued to be the Capital, the residence of the Governors, and of the heads of all the principal departments; here also the Legislature and the Executive Council hold their sittings. It is eighty-four miles by the river, and sixty-five miles by the high road, above the City of St. John.

This City stands on a plain protruding into the river, which is here over half a mile in width; it is surrounded by a chain of hills, rising in regular gradations, the level extending along the margin of the river for about a mile and a half, and being, at the widest part, about half a mile in width from the river, opposite the centre of the city, to the hill on which the college has been erected. Fredericton was incorporated in 1848, and is lighted with gas; its population, in 1840, numbered 4002; and in 1851, it contained 4,458; at the present time it exceeds 5,000. It has, however, suffered very severely by fire at various times. On the 11th of November, 1850, nearly one-half of the city was destroyed, the fire burning many hours; one church, five schools, and some one hundred and fifty houses being consumed; and again in the year 1854, no less than £40,000 worth of buildings and other property were destroyed by the devouring element. The buildings have, however, been much improved in consequence, many of them now being constructed of brick.

Although this city is the centre of a large agricultural county, the Provincial Seat of Government, and the intropot of the principal part of the productions of the Upper St. John, besides having enjoyed the advantages of being a military station; still, it has not kept pace with many other parts of the Colony. Looking at all these circumstances, and in addition, considering the mail, steamboat, and telegraphic communications, of which it may be said to form the centre for this section of the Province, and that the surrounding country possesses every requisite for supporting a large population, and abounds with the finest timber, close to extensive water communication, it seems surprising that it should not have made more rapid progress. All that is required is more energy, enterprise, and capital, to develope the latent resources by which it is surrounded, to render it a place of importance, and to enable it to rank among the more populous cities of British North America. This want, so long felt, is being gradu-

ally supplied, and Fredericton is attaining a fair position among her sister cities in the Colonics.

On a rising ground, near the town, stands King's College, now known as the University of New Brunswick, which was established by Royal Charter in 1828. This Institution possesses a tract of 6,000 acres of land, and receives an annual endowment of £2,000 sterling, half of which is paid by the Home Government, and the remainder from the Provincial revenue. Near this institution, and immediately connected with it, is the Collegiate School. The Baptists also possess a Seminary in this city. Both these Institutions, although the College was at first established in strict connection with the Episcopal Church, are not now Denominational, so that students, not adhering to the creeds of either of these bodies of Christians, may receive an education at either establishment.

The Province Building contains the Legislative Halls, Crown Land-Secretary, Auditors, and other offices; but the whole of these buildings would not far exceed, if indeed they could equal the King's College, either in cost of construction, or in architectural appearance.

The City is divided, for municipal purposes, into five wards, namely, King's, Queen's, St. Ann's, Carleton, and Wellington; each of which annually elect two Councillors; a Mayor and all other necessary officers are elected for the City at large. Its streets are systematically laid out, and of good width; and the town contains the Court House, Jail Post Office, Telegraph Station, Probate, and other County Offices, also an Episcopal Cathedral, Bishop's residence, two Episcopal, one Presbyterian, Methodist, Baptist, and Roman Catholic Churches. There are also a new County Court House, Market House, Bank, Gas-works, Foundry, and three Steam Saw-Mills. The inhabitants have formed various useful societies and institutions, including Agricultural, Horticultural, and Floricultural Societies; also, Bible, Church, Missionary, Masonic, Temperance, and Saint Andrew's Societies, a Fire Insurance Company, and a Branch Society for the Propagation of the Gospel. The County has the usual Bench of Magistrates, Sheriffs' Court, etc.

Fredericton is the Head-Quarters of the British troops stationed in this Province, and contains, near the margin of the river, barracks for both officers and privates, with spacious squares in their front — the latter are capable of accommodating about one thousand men, though there have lately been only one hundred and fifty stationed there. The Artillery Barracks, also spacious and convenient, are in the rear of the city, and will contain about the same number.

The situation of Fredericton, on the western bank of the River St. John-which winds its way past its streets and numerous handsome edifices, and ornamented towards the west by the residence of the Lieutenant Governor, is one of the most beautiful in the Province; nor is the surrounding scenery less worthy of notice; the whole must, exclusive of its being the nominal capital, and the Seat of Government, be looked on with deep interest both by the settler and occasional tourist.

The second is called Saint Ann's Ward, and is bounded on the northeast and southwest by the limits of the City, on the northwest by Wellington Ward, and on the southeast by a line drawn along the centre of York Street, and its prolongation.

The third is called Carleton Ward, and is bounded on the northeast and southwest by the limits of the City, on the northwest by Saint Ann's Ward, and on the southeast by a line drawn along the centre of Regent Street and its prolongation.

The fourth is called Queen's Ward, and is bounded on the northeast and the southwest by the limits of the City, on the northwest by Carleton Ward, and on the southeast by a line drawn along the centre of Church Street, and its prolongation.

The fifth is called King's Ward, and is bounded on the northwest by Queen's Ward, and on the northeast, the southeast, and the southwest, by the limits of the City.
