them, we propose in this article to blow that the interests of the local lusurance agents, who are the deputy assessors and collectors of these taxes, are too often directly contrary to those of the persons who pay the tases and at the same time are destructive of the reputations and welfare of tho Companies they mis-represent.

When a local insurance agent or a broker by earelessness - or induced by greed of commissions allows a policy of fire insurance to become the property of a man who is of bad reputation or is dishonest or is careless, or who does ${ }^{3}$ not keep proper books of account-he directly and indirectily commits a breach of thrust and tempts or incites to the commission of a fraud - even if his laches do not cause premeditated urson and false swearing.
Although the cases of loss form only a small percentage of the cases of fire insurauce and the disputes are only a small percentage of the losses, yet in ainetyrnine cases out of a hundred these disputes and law-sults are the direct and unaroidable consequence of misconduct upon the part of the Insurance Agent or Broker; yet he is vearly always the loudest in his vociferations and the most strenuous in his criorts to preveny proper iaquiry and real idjustment of the loss.
Here again however it is in the power of every person who pays a fire fusurance premium to be properly represented in the future assessment of the fire insurance tiax: because it is in his power to refuse to place, insurances with agents who are so unfaithful to their trust. This would incritably be the result if cill'who pay preminmis were to respect and fuliy comprohend the fact that they, and they alone pay all the losses and all the expenses of the fire insurùuce companies.

It would appear to be absurd thint it should be necessary to reiterate this
obvious fact, but so long as people are deceived by a false liverality on the part of the companies," a liberallty which consists in liberal payments of moncys Which do not belong to them but to the people who patronise them, they will ned instruction in one of the first principles of fire insurance, viz.- They who pay the premiums, pay the losies and expenses also.
What method then can the general public adopt by which the cost of fire insurance can be reduced? Surely it must follow that the refusal of patronage to the carcless agent, the greedy agent, the dishonest agent and the company he represents is the most effectlve of all methods. It is the effective method of adm:nistering a rebuke and a punishment, and at the same time as none of us can afiord to be withould fire insurance, it would be encouragements and rewards to the agents, and companies who conduct their business in the interests of the general public. Set it be thoroughly understood that proper care willl be taken inp proportiouing the amount of insurance to the value atit aisk, so that it will always be the interest of the assured to use every efort to preserve the property from loss and damage. That in the event of unavoidable calamity an adjustment will be made on business prinetples without any show of false liberadity and with-. out either delay or difficulty; but based upon properly kent records and accounts. Then there will be such an immense decrease in the number of fires and amounts of claims as will proporbionately decrease the cost of fire int surance:
If in every connunity the peopio winf be curefut to provide proper fire appliances inclusive of salvage organizations, will see that alleys and back. shops are kept fye from combustities, and at the same time will diselplint the agents who for greed of commissions
issue five thousaid dollar policles upon:s. two thousand dollar risks, they will soon be in $a$ position to demand $a^{-}$ decrease of fifty ner cent upon the present rates of fire Insurance premlums.
The fire insuronce companjes can atford to avoid all places whle produce. extraordinary losses, or in which disputes and law-suits are consequent up on fraudulent or excessive clatms, or they can afford to trike all the risks and pay all the losses and expenses-impos ing rates of premium to cover them. But the peonic cannot afford to do without fire insurance; this may be asserted indisputably; and the assertiones must be repeated until it is thoroughly understood. When it is understood then will the losses and expeuses be greatly decreased, aud the decrease of these will proportionately decrease the wates of premium to be pald"by thio... public.

The so enlled philantrophy of the person who aceepts a high salary for distributing the contributions of the charitable is akin to the "liberality", of the fire insurance Agent or Manager whose payment of exeessive clalms"fors loss is based upon excessive rates cof: premium wrung from the honest, careful and conscientious person' who dare not be without the protection of fre msurance policies whatever there cost: may be.

Coning the averuge for the ten yenrs 840, the 492,13 of new popilation might be sald to carry $\$ 19,685,240$ of insuranice leaving $162,899,660$ for the
population of 1881 , which is equivalent to alu increase for them at the present time of $\$ 40,108,725$ of insurance:
Fire insurance has been regarded as an ordinary business expense: life insurance as a luxury not to be indulged in until after all other outlays have been made: therefore this increase of insurance carried by our older fnhabitants in evidence of improvement in their condition even more forcible than that indicated by the growth of their savings deposits, from which necesiary expenses are met.

It now costs amually about two dollars' per head of population to mainthin life jusurance in the Dominion. The nverage insurance carred for the ten yous having beei about $\$ 150,000$ 000 , hud the avorage piemiun ncome of sane about $\$ 5,500,000$, we place the cost of the $\$ 4,108,728$ to ate atabout $\$ 20,000,000$ exclusive of interest, which ninst we taken to represent the surplus wealth of older residents Witinin the

The need not recite the suilent feintifes: of the table which appenas above, but to the statistician there as an areeable ninount of satisfaction afordefoby tomparison of tlie figures with those of former yeurs', and to one interestedr. in insurance it is pleasant to consider that widows and orphans are by the instrumentality of these life companies so well provided for: We congiatulate our Camadian compantes on the ever increasing miogress of thelr operations.

## OUR MINERAL RICHES.

Although barely touched, it is well known that the mineral resources of this provinee, and in fact', of the whole Dominion are of inmense value, and only await enterprise and capital, ajded by judicious laws, ito become one of our chicf sources of wealth. The fact was fully recognized . $n y$ the - members of the International Mining Association, reeently assembled in convention in this were: Hon. T. Guilford Smith, of Buffalo; Mr. Raymond, of Cooper, Hewvitt \& Co., New Tork; Dr. Howe, president of the American Institutu; Dr. H. B. Nason, professor of chemistry in the Reussalaer Polytechuic Institute of Troy, and chemist of the Ständard Oil Compmay; Dr. Torrey, chief assuyer to the United States Assay office, New York; Israel Pardee, of Stonhopo furnace, Dover, N. J.; Dr. Kerschoff, editor of the "Iron Age," James Archbald, consulitiang engineer of the D. L. \& W; railway; James MeNaughton, of Albany, and August J. Rossi, New York. After a mosti interesting and instructive series of meetings, during' which a number of carefully brepared papers were read and discussed, a pleasant surprise awnited the convention in the shape of an invitation to visit the Radnor forges at Three Rivers. This excursion, which was planned by our enterprising young business men, Messrs. Geo, E. Drummond, Thos. J. Drummond, Jas. TV. MeCall and J. J. Drummond, of the Canada Iron Furuace company, was an unqualified treat and a suitable termination to the recent proceedings at old MeGill. The excursionists, umbering 200, were taken to the works in a special train, and were greatly interested in what they saw. The smelter of the company has a capacity of about fifty tous per day, aud their iron is used by many of the lending foundries of Canndd, This iron is of special value in the casting of car wheels, but it is used for almost every other puppose The ore, which is of a yellowish brown color, is foum in all Borte of fantastie shapes. It is gathered from the surrounding country, where in-
mense deposits:- exist! The St.e Maurice, with its tributanes above Grinde Piles, drains decouitity of oyers two hundred. thousand siaño nilesecoved with mngr: nificeatwoods, ändars. P: HaGriffin, prese: ident orathe counpany; estimates thatijit containg invalunble beds ol bog and nat:mel ores. The bog ore district; ho says, exteids, roughily speaking, from northenst of Quebec eilty to the west of Ottaiwn, a distance of say four hundred miles long by sixty deep, and even this does not exhaust the range. The company lind it outirely practicable to collect ore over a finige of seven'ty or one hundred miles by establishing depots for the accumula. tion of stock, from which shipments may be fade by rail in large quaritities. Some pleasunt specehes were made hy thie excursionists, for which, unfortunately, we "are unable to find apace, bet we are tempted to give a brief summary of the words dropped by Dr. Raymond, the ex-president and secretary of the Amerienn institute. The doctor pointed out that neither mining or agriculture could subsist well alone. Here he was glad to see they worked together. Mining came to the rescue of agriculture. It was another illustration of the principle of the fact that to overlook the progress of mining was to overlook the interests of all industry. As in biblienl history they found one tribe annihilated and turning up very mueh alive a few chapters further on, so thoy often heard of some new diseovery that was going to amibilate some established industry. There 'was no annihilated industry, ovo product simply took the place of another. He iwent on to point out that the young men of Megill, whose new college buiddings they had assisted in opening, and the young mon of Canadn, had the greatest privitige mann ever had, to stand by and sec and assist a young empire grow to lusty istrength and power. There never could nor never would be a greater privilege. It was the heritage of young Can. ada.

We ber to acknowledge to the shareholders the good services rendexed to our administration by the fidelity and attentive work of our officers.

The president then arose and suid:-Gentlemen-Until Saturday last the directors and shareholders could have congratulated themselves on our report, which, I believe, is better than over bofơre. . I sny: "until Saturday last," because it was on that day thant we lost our suit in England. When I mention this it is not in nuy way to depress you, for our report, in spito of that, is still good, because we have provided, not the Whole amount, but a certain sum to meet that emergeney, and you will agree with us that! we were justified in doing so. TWo suceeded in that suit in the court hereit is true it was ouly three judges against two-and, necording to our legal adviser, We had reasonable hope to expect we should win, on the other side, but we were disappointed. The judgment is for $\$ 35,000$ and with the costs, I believe the whole will amount to about $\$ 45,000$. We thought that' a sum of $\$ 20,000$ should be put aside for this; and $a$ small sum of $\$ 5,000$ 'to the credit of the profit and loss fie tccount. - It was the opinion off the di--r-rectors that a sum of one-hali of our loss the shoutd :lie put to that fund.. If yoí look at ithe progress we have made, $I$ am satisfied youswilhagree with we, that:shonld
fir we dozas well uext yent as wo lave this We must wot suppose :our business will diminish, we intend to make it progress ye-re Fhould certainly be satisfied. Our --Ieserre. fund would be 50 per cent. of our chpital, becnuse it ouly- wauts to be a
anm of $\$ 50,000$ to put it at that, and if

We blould do as well next year cas we liave done this, we shall have no diffit culty iii putting $¢ 50,000$ to the reserve Iund; and $\$ 20 ; 000$ or $: \$ 20,000$ to meet the differenco on the looss we have just. sustained. We are-certainly.justified inc hoping it will be so; unless some uniore-: seen circunstances occur, for wo cinn assure you that so far as the directors can see just now there is no henvy: loss: for the future. This unfortunate tyansaction was not the fault of this office, but was made by one of our agencies in Quebec. I do not think the directors can reproach themselves with the transaction, for wo were adrised by legal gentlemen that the transaction was periectly correct, and that the party who discounted the note was responsible, too. But this is a thing of the past. Let us speak of the future, tho the past. Let us spenk of the futare, tho
outlook for which is bright, and I hope that next year we shall be ablo to pay a heavier dividend. It is not my desire to increase the reserve fund more than 50 per cent, but to give the benefit to the stockholders by paying them a dividend of 7 or $S$ per cent:, and $I$ am in hopes that the second dividend of next year, after meeting all emergencies and making our reserve fund 60 per eent. of our capital, will be 31-2 instead of 3 per cent for the six months. I have now a matter of great importance to bring before juu. You have noticed the location of the bank, and you must admit that for the amount of business we are now doing the premises are not large enough. Many of you are awaro that we have aequired the next two stores and have had a plan prepared and given out the principal contracts for the building maxt jear. I hope every stockholder will look at the building and will say that 'it will be a credit to the jnstitution. It will also bring revenue to the stock. holders. The building, including the cost of this bank; will cost in the vicinity of $\$ 200,000$, and as we shall have at least thirty offices to let, we expect to derive at least four or five per cent. dividend, and have the location of the bank free. The cashier will address you on the progress made by the bauk during the last few years. If any of you rentlemen linte any questions to put afterwards we shall be glad to answer them.

During the closing months of the scason of inland navigation there were also some exceptiounlly heny losses to lake shipping, which materially reduced the-profit of that brauch of the busizess.
Taking into accoint, therefore, the fact that these unfavornble experiences have made the year a trying one generally to companies engaged in fire and marine underwriting your directors feel that the results of the business of 1892 to the "Western" must be eminently satisfactory to the shareholders. In former years an Act of Parliament has been necessary, but under the law of last sanson the Goyernment may extend the privileges to American fisherm:n at will. Whether the Cleveland Administration will revive the fishery treaty of 1888 . of which the modus forms a part remains to be seen; The treaty has been endorss by Canada, and it is in the power of the United States Senate to give it life if so disposed. Under the modus vivendi the American fisherneen are lieensed to frequent Canadian ports for the purchase of supplies and bait. The cost of the license is besed upon the fegistered tonnage of their vessils, the fate heing $\$ 1.60 n^{21}$ ton. The charge is naminal, and is levied to assist' in covertigg the expens? of protecting the three-mile limit. During the past few years the number of license issued has been increased, until last year they rached 108. The revante was $\$ 13,410$.
