REOPEN BLOOR STREET EXTENSION. Extend East Bloor-street by means of a high level bridge to join Danforth-avenue and there will be opened up for building purposes two thousand acres of the best land in the County of York.

HE DWELT at some length upon the work of the technical schools, and the advantages they brought to a student in equipping him for important executive positions. It was good for academic men to meet with men of practical business, he said.
