Explanation of the Calendar Pages.

At the head of the respective pages for each month are given the ordinary Tables of the Changes and Quadratures of the Moon. These Tables— together with the three first vertical columns of each page—it is presumed need no explanation.

The fourth and fifth columns shew the mean times of the rising and setting of the sun. The quantities are only set down to the nearest minute. The uncertainty of the *observed times* of the rising or setting of Heavenly Bodies, on land; caused by the varying amount of Horizontal Refraction, and the general liability to the intervention of terrestrial objects in such observations, renders a closer approximation unnecessary for ordinary practical purposes.

In the sixth column, marked "*Sun South*," are given the times which should be shewn by a well regulated clock or watch when the Sun is on the Meridian.

The seventh column contains the Moon's place in the signs of the Zodiacs.

The eighth column contains the mean times of the rising or setting of the Moon. These quantities are only set down to the nearest minute, for the reasons mentioned above in respect to the Sun.

Eclipses.

In the year 1846 there will be only two Eclipses, both of the Sun.

I. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, April 25th, partially visible at Montreal, as follows :

Beginning of Eclipse,.....	0h. 54m.	} Mean time in the Evening.
Greatest Phase,.....	1 21	
End of Eclipse,.....	1 47	

Duration of visibility=53 minutes. Magnitude of the Eclipse (Sun's Diameter=1) 0.23 on the Southern Limb. The path of the Central and Annular Eclipse will first touch the Earth in Longitude 135° 51' West, and Latitude 2° 11' South, and taking a north-easterly course will traverse Guatamala, the West India Islands, and the Atlantic Ocean, and reaching Africa, will terminate near the Southern part of Morocco.

II. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, October 20th, invisible at Montreal. Conjunction in Right Ascension at 56 minutes after 2 in the morning. This Eclipse of the Sun will be visible in Africa, Australia, the Indian and great Southern Oceans.

Venus will be Evening Star until the 22d day of March, thence Morning Star till the 15th day of December, thence Evening Star the remainder of the year.

And so on, adding two rates for every additional ounce. After the first ounce, fractional parts are not noticed; thus, if a letter exceed 1 oz. it becomes liable to four rates, and if it exceed 2 oz. to six rates.

4—Letters to and from the United Kingdom are subject to a uniform charge of 1s. 4d. currency, per half oz. They are sent through the United States to Boston, under the charge of an officer appointed for that purpose by the British Government.

NEWSPAPERS.

Colonial Newspapers not exceeding 2 oz. sent by the post to any other place within the British North American Provinces, pay one halfpenny, to be prepaid or not at the option of the sender.

If sent to any British Colony beyond sea, (not intended to pass through the United Kingdom,) or to any foreign country, except U. States—one halfpenny—to be prepaid.

If sent to any part of the United States—one penny—to be prepaid.

Newspapers sent from the United States, are liable, on delivery, to a Provincial rate of one penny, in addition to U. S. postage.

Colonial Newspapers sent to the United Kingdom, by way of Boston, and British newspapers from the U. Kingdom to any part of Canada, are rated at one half-penny, payable on delivery.

With the exception of these last, (which are not limited as to weight,) a newspaper to pass under the foregoing regulations, must not exceed 2 oz. otherwise it becomes liable to pamphlet postage, *i.e.* one penny per oz.

2.—British and Colonial Newspapers may be sent *by Packet* between any of Her Majesty's Colonies, without passing through the United Kingdom—free of postage for sea conveyance, and *by private Ship* at a Sea-rate of one penny each, to be prepaid.

3.—British Newspapers may be posted in Canada for any place in British North America, at a charge of one halfpenny each, to be prepaid or not, at the option of the sender.

4.—Newspapers may be sent from Canada by Mail Packet, and through

5.—British or Colonial Prices Current and Commercial Lists may be sent by Mail Packet between Canada and any other of Her Majesty's Colonies, —if passing through the United Kingdom, at a postage of 3½d. Currency,— and if not passing via England, at a Postage of 2½d. Currency each: the prepayment of these postages will be optional.

6.—Prices Current and Commercial Lists, whether British, Colonial or Foreign, may be sent by Mail Packet from Canada to any Foreign Port at a Postage of 3½d. Currency each, to be prepaid.

7.—The Prices Current and Commercial Lists above described must contain simply the names and prices of articles, excluding the names and addresses of the parties interested or dealing in the same—and no Newspaper, Price Current or Commercial List can be conveyed under these regulations unless the same shall be sent without a cover, or in a cover open at the sides, and unless there be no writing or mark upon it or upon the cover of it except the name and address of the person to whom sent,—nor any paper or thing enclosed in or with the same.

8.—As regards the transmission from Canada, the expression used in this Circular, "by Mail Packet," is to be understood to mean the Canada Mails despatched from Montreal for the Royal Mail Steamers sailing from Boston.
