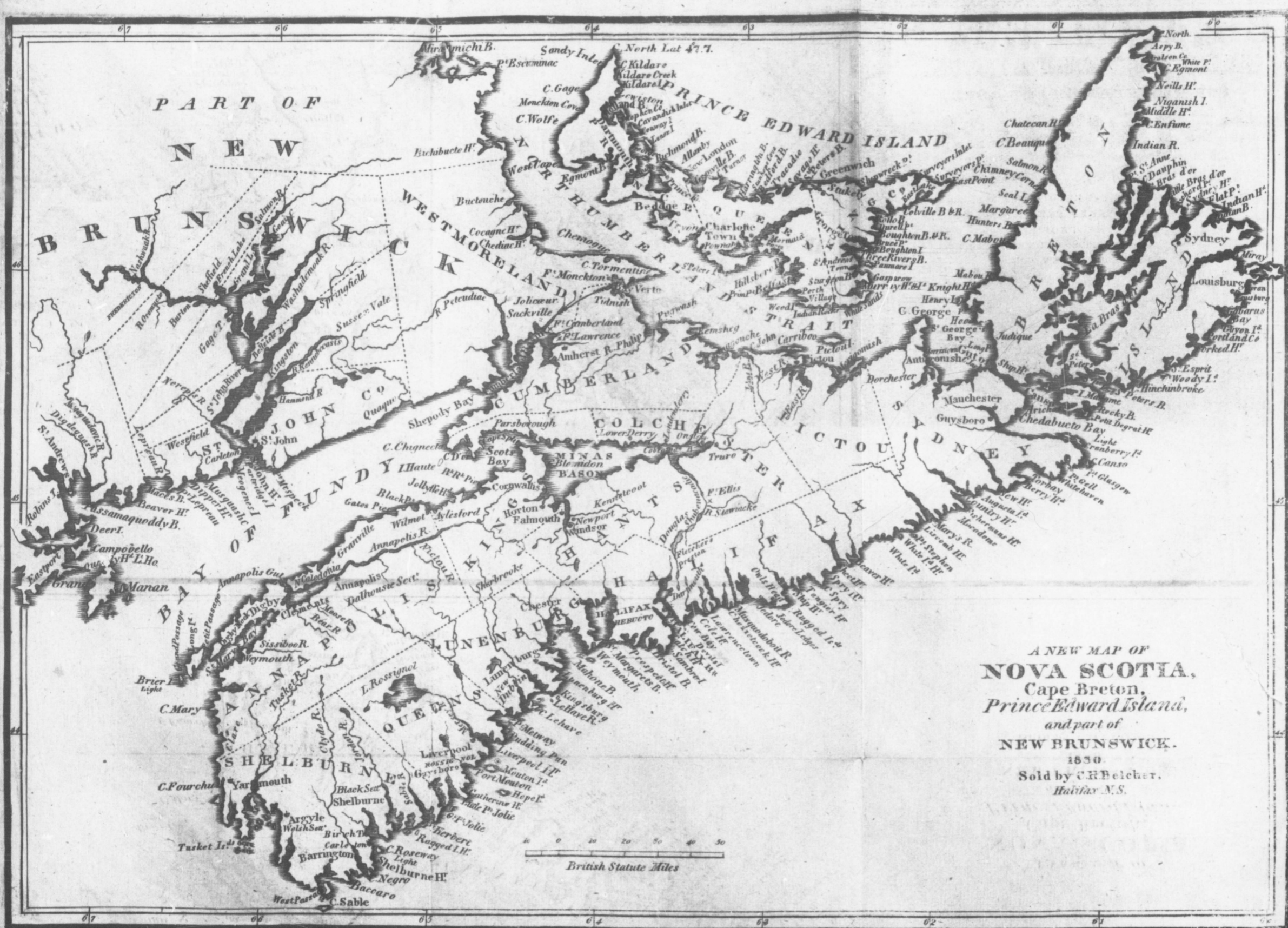

ORIENTAL AND OCCIDENTAL STARS.

The planet VENUS (♀) will be Evening Star till July 25th, when she will be in inferior conjunction with the Sun; after that, she will be Morning Star through the year. She will be invisible, a few days before, and after her conjunction, on account of nearness to the sun.

JUPITER (♃) will be in opposition ♄ to the sun on the 2d of January; after that he will be Evening Star till July 19th, then Morning Star to the end of the year.

MARS (♂) will be Morning Star the whole of this year.

SATURN (♄) will be Morning Star till April 21st. when he will be in opposition to the Sun; thence Evening Star till October 30th; then again Morning Star.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

First column contains the days of the month—*second*, days of the week—*third*, Holy-days, Weather, &c.—*fourth*, Rising of the Sun—*fifth*, Setting of the Sun—*sixth*, Sun's declination in hours and minutes, taken from the Nautical Almanack—*seventh*, Rising and Setting of the Moon—*eighth*, Moon's Southing, and time of high water at Windsor, Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, &c—*ninth*, Moon's place in the signs—*tenth*, high water at Halifax.

The top of the columns of each month, shows the Moon's phases, or the times of new and full Moon, and of the first and last quarter, or two quadratures with the Sun.

To find the length of the day, add 12 hours to the time of the Sun's setting, and from the sum subtract the time of rising.

When the moon comes to the meridian of any place, or twelve o'clock hour-line, she is then due south with respect to that place, and this is termed the moon's southing. The time of New Moon's southing is 12 at noon; and from the new to the full moon, the southing is after noon, or sometime between noon and midnight, but every day about 49 minutes later than the former.—The time of the full moon's southing is 12 at midnight; and from the full to the new moon, the southing is in the morning, or sometime between midnight and the noon next following; but every day about 49m. later than before.

Apogee means that a planet is at its greatest distance from the Earth, and tides low. *Perigee*, that it is at the nearest point, and the tides high.

THE FOOLS' PENCE; OR, TRANSMUTATION.*

Though *Transmutation* is a long word, and to some readers may seem a hard word, I have chosen it because it exactly expresses my meaning; and when the meaning of the word is given in a few words of good, old, common English, it will soon appear to have little or no difficulty about it. *Transmutation* means the change of a thing into another nature or substance. If silver could be converted, or turned into gold, or iron into copper, the change would be called, as the famous Bacon has said, "for distinction's sake, *Transmutation*."

No matter what may be the original materials of the man; his figure may possess every grace of the sculptor; his mind may be imbued with every art and science; he may be fit to command at the head of armies; his heart may be the seat of every virtue—but ardent spirits will strip him of the whole and convert him into a demon. Need I tell how?—Need I point out the change that ebriety produces in the moral and social affections? It was in a drunken revel that the infuriate Alexander slew his best friend, and most beloved companion, Clytus. And it was in a drunken revel that he proclaimed himself a god, and died. At the last Annual Meeting of the "British and Foreign Temperance Society" held in London on 19th May 1835, the Bishop of London, the President

The tracts issued during the year, amounted to more than half a million, making a total since the formation of the Society of 3,832,800. During the year, 197 medical men had signed a declaration to the effect, that distilled spirits as an article of diet, was not only unnecessary, but positively injurious to health. The whole number of British medical men who had signed the declaration was now 782. The report then adverted to ships carrying spirits on board, and stated that the number of American vessels who took none, except in the medicine chest, was increasing. Interesting intelligence had been received from various foreign parts, of the progress which the principles of the Society were making. The number of societies in England and Wales on 1st May 1835, was 557; the number of members 115,782, being an increase of 114 Societies, and 28,311 members during the year. The Rev. H. Stowell, in seconding one of the resolutions, said that he rejoiced that the chair had been that day occupied by the Right Rev. prelate, and he trusted the time was not far distant when his noble example would be followed by every bishop on the bench. back doors to the place of woe. —In the town of Preston, there were formerly 76 commitals in one quarter session, but after the establishment of the Temperance Society the number was reduced to 30, and at the last session but one, the magistrates met, went through the forms of the Court, and separated, for there was not a single committal. The Rev. gentleman then went on to observe, that in the Temperance Societies of Lancashire a great improvement had taken place.—They had now two pledges, the ordinary one, and one which had been humourously called (in consequence of the name having been given it by a poor man,) the *teitotal* pledge; and which was simply this—an agreement to abstain from whatever would intoxicate, except when prescribed by a medical man. He followed in the length and breadth of that agreement, but far should he be from urging it. It could not be borne out by scripture; the moderate use of wine being there sanctioned. When persons applied to sign the pledge, they could subscribe to either. Rev. Dr. Humphrey furnished an interesting detail of the progress of Temperance Societies in America. He stated that there were now more than 7000 Temperance Societies in that country, there were twenty two state societies, a congregational society, embracing one million and a half of members—that upwards of 3000 distilleries had been suspended; 7000 merchants, at least, had ceased to sell the poison, 1100 vessels were now navigated to all parts of the world, without any ardent spirits on board, except in the medicine chest; that 5000 drunkards had been reclaimed; and that in New-York and Boston the different Assurance Offices had agreed to make an allowance of 5 per cent. in favour of temperance ships on the assurance. The statesmen and judges of their courts had, to a very great extent, throughout the land, cordially engaged in this great and good work. The Rev. gentleman then concluded by remark-

As some evil-minded persons have of late slandered his character, and tried to injure his business, he takes it upon himself to say, that he has always courted observation, and is ready at all times to present his license from government, to wound, maim, beggar, and kill, just as many as the public good requires. He earnestly hopes that they who have permitted their minds to be prejudiced against him, will come and judge for themselves, especially on Sunday, and late on every night of the week. N. B. The most satisfactory references may be obtained at the Alms' Houses, in the Potter's Field, at the State Prison, and the gallows."
