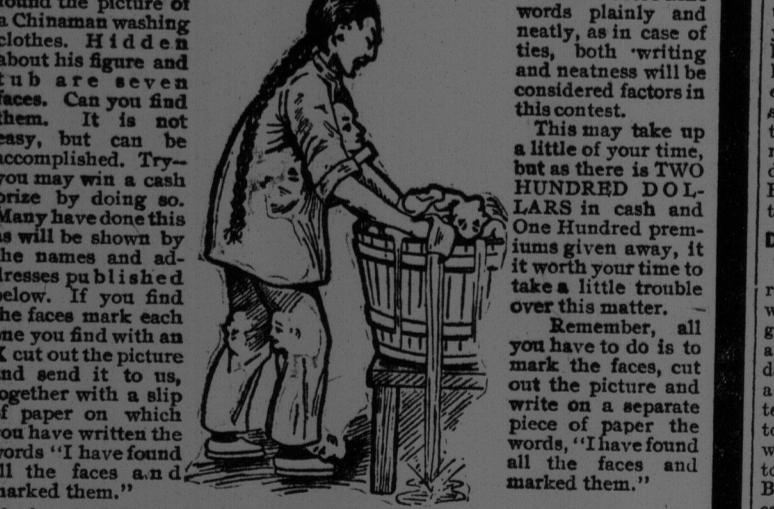

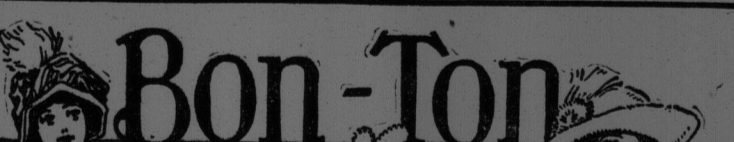

SAVING YOUTH AT STARTING OF LIFE OF CRIME

Active Work Is Being Done Quietly in Great Britain

NO REFORM IN PRISON

Doctrine is That Jail is Criminal Manufactory—Probation Method Being Carried Out and Reports Are Justifying This Course

(Times Special Correspondent.) London, Oct. 26—Practically unknown to the general public there are actively at work in Great Britain at the present time certain systematic methods which, it is hoped, will in the course of a few years reduce the number of habitual criminals to an almost negligible quantity.

The Method. The primary method which is so successful in saving the young man from prison, it has at last been seen that a prison is no moral hospital.

Even more successful and even more successful has been the result achieved by the Probation of Offenders Act, so far as it deals with what is called the juvenile adult criminal.

This is the work then, which is drying up the sources of the habitual criminal class, and to this it is mainly due that year by year the number of prisoners is decreasing, and that already suggestions are being made for another use for some of the prison establishments.

REINFORCED CONCRETE. FOR FACTORY AND WAREHOUSE CONSTRUCTION

The last decade has witnessed some remarkable progress in all kinds of building construction, perhaps one of the most noticeable being the introduction and use of reinforced concrete buildings.

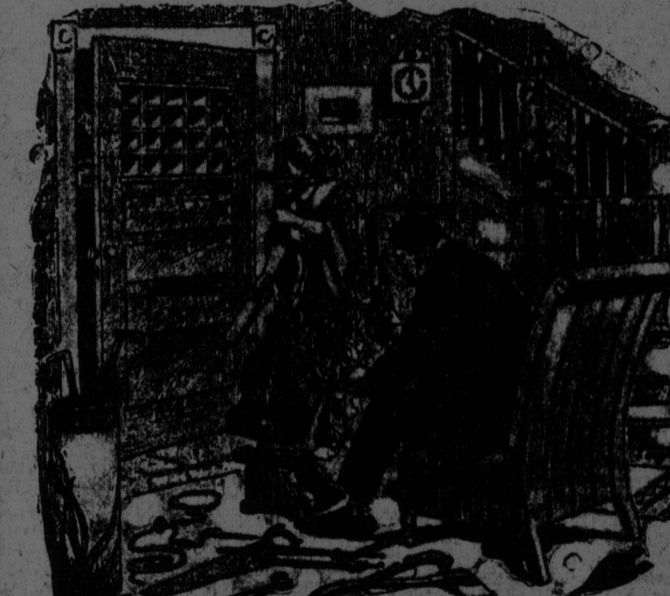
