

HIS HIGHNESS AT PESTH

HUNGARIAN DEMONSTRATION IN PRINCE ALEXANDER'S HONOR.

Turn Severin, Sept. 8.—Prince Alexander, Stambuloff, Karaveloff and nearly all the Bulgarian ministers arrived here this morning in a yacht. Roumanian troops received the Prince at the landing and lined the route along which he passed to the railway station. Alexander took leave of his ministers and officers here. The farewell was very affecting. A Bulgarian aide de camp will accompany the Prince from here. He will leave this afternoon and proceed direct to Darmstadt.

The Prince at Pesta.

Pesta, Sept. 9.—The train bearing Prince Alexander made a brief stoppage here. An finnense crowd had gathered at the railway station awaiting the Prince's arrival. Many members of the Hungarian nobility were present. The students of the university, carrying banners, marched to the station in a body. The Prince was accorded an enthusiastic reception.
