



BOYS' HOME.

THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL MEETING

The thirty-fourth annual meeting of the Boys' Home was held in the Home in George St., Tuesday, February 13th, 1894.

Among those present were :—His Honor the Lieut.-Governor, Sir Casimer Gzowski, Hon. G. W. Allan, Hon S. H. Blake, Dr. Thorburn, Revs. G. W. Wallace, D. J. Macdonnell, Dr. Thomas, Mr. R. S. Baird, Principal Mac-Murphy, Mr. Gartshore, Mr. David Fotheringham and others.

Letters of regret were read from His Worship the Mayor, Lieut.-Colonel Davidson, Rev. Arthur Baldwin and others.

His Honor the Lieut.-Governor occupied the chair, and the Rev. G. W. Wallace opened the meeting with prayer.

The Chairman then asked the Hon. G. W. Allan to read the Secretary's Report.

THIRTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
BOARD OF MANAGEMENT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

In presenting their Annual Report, the Board of Managers would desire to record once more, as in past years, their thankfulness to the many friends who have given such liberal support to, and taken such a warm interest in, the Boys' Home.

The Managers can look back over the past year with feelings of satisfaction and gratitude. We have once more been enabled, owing to the generosity of our friends, to shelter, feed, clothe and educate many a lad who otherwise would either have wandered homeless on the streets, or grown up in surroundings where the influences were anything but elevating. On account of the great distress that prevails amongst the poorer classes, there has been a large number of applications for admittance, and the Home has been very full during the year; so much is this the case, that we feel as if it were almost a necessity to enlarge our borders in order to shelter the number of little fellows under the required age, who need so much extra care from the Matron and her helpers.

It is a matter for much thankfulness that the health of the boys has been specially good during the year. None have been removed by death, no serious illness of any kind has broken out, and we would refer our friends to the medical officers' report for details of the boys' health. We

cannot express too warmly our gratitude to Dr. Thorburn, who for so many years has taken such a deep interest in the health and welfare of the boys; also to Dr. W. P. Caven and Dr. J. D. Thorburn, who are always most prompt and kind in responding to any call that may be made upon them. Owing to press of professional duties, Dr. Caven, much to the regret of the Board, has been obliged to resign his position as one of our physicians—we tender to him our grateful acknowledgment of his services, especially in connection with the Infirmary, now fortunately closed. Dr. J. E. Elliott has kindly undertaken the duties of assistant medical officer.

The largest number in the Home at any one time during 1893, was 125; of these, 11 were sent to situations in the country, 37 were removed by parents or friends, 2 who showed a decided talent for military music were sent to Stanley Barracks to be trained for the band. There are at present 64 boys serving their terms with farmers; 13 have completed their terms of apprenticeship during the past year. Some have withdrawn the amount they have earned, saved for them by the Managers; others have left all or part at interest in the Savings Bank. The largest sum withdrawn by any boy was \$160. The sum of \$1,383.57 has been paid to boys during the year, in full and on account, upon the expiration of their terms. Some of our lads remain with the farmers to whom they have been indentured, earning good wages; some take to railway life, some learn trades, others go to the lumbering camps, often returning to the Home before entering on their different paths in life, and the Managers are cheered and encouraged by their respectable and healthy appearance, and feel stimulated to go on with the good work of trying to fit these boys to earn an honest livelihood and to make them God-fearing and law-abiding citizens of our fair Dominion.

Careful enquiry is made and good references required before any boy is sent out from the Home, and the following letters written to, different members of the Board, are a few specimens of many received, showing how happy the boys are and how soon they feel a sort of proprietorship in all the belongings of their new homes.

"Dear Madame, — It is quite a while since I got your letter, and we had no writing paper and I could not answer it. I was very glad to get a letter from you and I think a great lot of my book, and Mrs. B. thinks it is a good one. I have nine books now of my own, and I was going to Sunday School all summer. We had a fine Christmas tree this fall and it was for the boys and girls for going to the Sunday School all summer, and I got a nice book off the Christmas tree, and Mrs. Brown gave me a nice book too for a Christmas box, and I was away all day on Christmas and I had good fun. I am going to school every day now, and Mrs. Brown's two little girls help me to do the chores at the barn, and there are six of us here now. Mr. Brown gave me a nice pair of long boots this year and they were \$2.25. And we have a little boy here and he is 16 months old, and he is all the time climbing on the table and chairs, and I think he likes me. We had a good dry summer for to get the crop off, and Mr. Brown and I can take the crop off ourselves now we have a self-binder. I go to the church sometimes, and sometimes the road is blocked and I can't very well go then. We have not been having very much snow now for quite a while and we are getting some now. I guess there won't be very many boys in the Home that I knew when I was there, and I would like to see the Boys' Home again. I think I will close now.

"Dear Ladies,—I received your letter Saturday, and was much pleased to get the book, it is such a pretty story, and am much pleased to hear there is no sickness in the Home now. I like my place very well, they are all very kind to me. I followed team all last spring. I clean out the stables, carry milk to the calves, feed the cows. I have a ride on horseback every Saturday to the post-office. We only get our mail once a week. I was going to the Home to spend Christmas, but my boss took the gripe, and good-bye, this is all I have to say just now. Good-bye.

"Dear Mrs. G.—I hope you are well. I am well. I thank you very much for the book you sent me for a present. I am in the third book, and I am getting along very well at school, and I go to Sunday school and church every Sunday. I got a book from my first master and \$2 from his brother, and I got an ink-bottle and a penknife off Louth Christmas tree; and I got a knife and 75c. in my stocking on the night before Christmas. I hope that all the boys are well in the Home. I like my new home very much, and I have lots of fun with the boys who are with me. When I hear of any more news I will write you again. Will you please write back to me and tell me if you got the letter.

"Dear Friend,—I will try and write you a few lines to tell you I am well and am getting along very well at my place. I received the letter and book you sent me on Christmas night as we were going to a Christmas tree belonging to the Sabbath school. We had a good time and I got quite a few things off the tree. We had quite a

long programme. I said a recitation entitled, 'Boys Rights,' and was in a dialogue called 'Too late for the train,' but I was hardly able to say my pieces on account of a bad cold, but I spoke as loud as I could, and I was forgiven.

"Well, I must not forget to say something about the book you sent me. I have not read much in it, but I think it is a good one, and when I read it I will write and tell you how I like it. Now, I told you I got quite a few things off the tree, so I did. Mr. and Mrs. P. put a mouth organ on it for me, and Mrs. P. put a large candy heart on for me, and then my Sunday school teacher gave me a book for saying Catechism questions, and then I got another little book from the school. I was at Sunday school every Sunday last year; wet or dry I went, and the year before I only missed one Sunday all year. I started school today, and I hope to get along pretty well. We have the same teacher this year as we had the last two years, and I like her very well. She is a nice teacher, she is not a bit cross, although there are some of the scholars you know who are pretty hard to suit, and don't like her. Is Miss Cowan teaching in the Home yet? I suppose all the big boys have gone away and others taken their places. And I suppose there was a big time at the Home on Christmas. I often think I would like to go back to the Home to see the folks, but I guess it will be a while before I can do so. Is Mrs. Robertson in the Home yet, and the laundress, Kate O'Neil? If they are, I wish you to remind me to them and the rest of the ladies. Now, we had a nice little party at our house on New Year's, and we had a good time, but it was pretty late when we got to bed. It was the fifteenth anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. P.'s wedding, so you see the reason we had the party. Mr. and Mrs. P. wish me to remember them to you, and they say they would like to see you, but it is so seldom

Mr. Kilgour and Mr. Brush, with their earnest band of assistants, still faithfully labor in the Sunday school for the spiritual welfare of the children. Special thanks are due to Miss Maggie Reid for her untiring labors in the musical training of the boys. We warmly appreciate their unselfish work, and feel that owing to their instruction many a boy has his feet early turned into the paths of righteousness.

Miss MacKay continues in charge of the Home and car-

ries out her duties as Matron in a kind and highly satisfactory manner. The school is under the charge of Miss Hodgetts, who, with her assistant, Miss Kerr, is most pains-taking and thorough in instructing the boys, who show marked progress under their teaching.

Our grateful thanks are due to Dr. J. G. Adams, dentist, who free of charge kindly attended to the boys teeth; also to Mr. A. Taylor, barber, who gives his services gratuitously.

To all our generous friends who have at different times kindly provided excursions, pic-nics and treats of various kinds we return thanks, especially to Mr. E. B. Osler, who is a good friend to the boys, and with his usual generosity gave each of them a new ten cent piece at the Christmas dinner. To the various tradesmen who gave such liberal contributions, to Messrs. Slight, Tidy, Skinner and Cottrell, florists, who have encouraged the boys' love of gardening by presenting them with plants, seeds, etc. We extend a cordial invitation to the general public to visit the Home, feeling that any who may enter its walls will not leave them without having their hearts touched and their sympathies aroused by seeing something of this work of rescuing the homeless and helping those who cannot help themselves.

In closing our report, we would thankfully acknowledge the goodness of God, who has shielded the Home from sickness and death and blessed our labors during the past year.

The Treasurer's Report, which will be found annexed, was then read by Sir Casimer Gzowski.

The Medical Officer's report was then read by Dr. Thorburn:

MEDICAL OFFICERS' REPORT.

The health of the inmates of the institution during the past year has been good. Twenty boys required medical treatment, and only three of these could be considered serious cases: one, a complicated fracture of the thigh bone; another, acute pneumonia; the third boy suffered from a grave form of inflammation of the throat. These all made perfect recoveries.

Ringworm of the scalp, a former enemy to the health and comfort of the Home, threatened us with another epidemic. Five boys contracted the disease within a very short interval. By prompt isolation and vigorous treatment the disease was arrested and finally eradicated.

Here it may be mentioned that the Infirmary is absolutely useless during the winter months—at a time when epidemics are most prevalent. This is owing to the fact that there is no adequate means of heating the building, and we are obliged to seek other quarters for isolation.

The lady managers promptly placed one of the attic rooms at our disposal; no other cases have since appeared.

The question as to the best system of heating the Infirmary should be enquired into at once. We would find ourselves in a very awkward position should any contagious disease break out amongst the boys. The sanitary arrangements are not all that could be desired. I would suggest that they be thoroughly overhauled during the summer months.

This report would be incomplete without adding our thanks to the Lady Managers and Matron for their constant ready attention to the wants of the sick boys.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken or dissolute parents ; the object of this Institution being the prevention of Juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year ; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses ; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of the preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution and also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all correspondence of the Society ; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose ; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation shall visit the "Home" daily, each week; inspect the house; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Secretary, Treasurer, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The General Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at 11 o'clock a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the preceding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes, and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the direction of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys; to conduct the household affairs generally; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has

been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., dinner at 12, and tea at 5.30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning, or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School and Divine Service in a Protestant church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friends gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
