A Horrible Tragedy.

ONE HUNDRED AND SHVENTY-BIGHT London, June 17.—A terrible calamity in-

London, June 17.—A terrible calamity involving the death of one hundred and soventy-eight children, occurred in the town of Sunderland, in the county of Durham, last evening. From details thus far received it appears an entertainment had been given in Victoria Hall by a conjurer, which was attended almost altogether by children. The accident occurred at the close of the performance, the body of the hall being entirely cleared of its occupants, when some 1,200 little ones came rushing down stairs from the gallery. At the top of the first flight of stairs was a door, which opened only about 20 inches permitting but one child to pass through at a time. At this point, while the crowd of children were pushing forward, one fell and was unable to arise owing to the others crowding on. The result was a crowd of chasters on the conference of the others crowding on. The result was a great number were pushed down, and trampled on and suffocated. No effort could stop the mad rush of the affrighted children. They came on pell-mell, and soon 178 of them were knocked down and suffocated by them were knocked down and suffocated by others trampling upon them. The greater number of the bodies, which were badly mangled from the trampling, lay 7 or 8 deep. Many of the victims, and others who were not killed, had the clothes torn from their bodies and, together with the bleeding bodies of the unfortunates, show the terrible nature of the translate.
