Nunicipal Drainage Act. The Hon, Mr. McKellar has intro-dneed a bill—a copy of which we have before us—entitled an Act to authorise the investment of certain moneys in debentures to be issued for the construction of drainage works for municipalities. The Act provides that in case municipal Coun-cits, after procuring the report of competent engineers, are of opinion that the drainage of certain localities is necessary, they may pass by laws providing for the some, and borrow the necessary funds, on the credit of the municipality, by issuing debentures in sums of not less than one-hundred dollars each, and payable within fif-teen years from date, with interest at a rate of not less than five per centum per annum, the property be-nefited by such improvement to be taxed for the payment of the same. Before the final passing of the by-law it shall be published four weeks in some newspaper within the muni-cipality, or some other newspaper, together with a notice that any one intending to apply to have it quash-ed, must, within ten days of the pas-sing thereof, serve a notice in writ-mg upon the Reeve and Clerk of the municipality of his intention to make application for that purpose. Should it be deemed necessary to continue the drainage into adjoining municipality of his intention to make application for the cert y off the way for a laws in repair the same within its own limits. The Lieu-tenant Governor in Council may in-vest any surplus of the Consoliaited Remute Fund in the purchase of de-bentures issued under by-laws.so passod. We think that the Bill is .just and

The importance of draining lands is be-coming better appreciated as the good results are known, and thous-ands of acres would have been thus improved ere this had the oyners of the soil been in a peemiary position to do so. We are glad for the sake of these interested, that the Bill in-troduced by Mr. McKellar make such amplé provision for many poor settlers. The utility of land drain-age cannot be overestimated.






