SLIGHT OF HAND MAN WORKED THE MACHINE

118 Ballots Went Into the Box and 123 Came Out, and There You Are!

JAMES FARR HAS SKIPPED

But Witnesses Tell How This Man Did the Trick at Poll No. 3, Goderich, in West Huron.

A BALLOT MARKED FOR M'LEAN

Picked Up Off the Floor—Farr Tore It Up and Said: Oh, Hell! That's Nothing.

Ottawa, Aug. 2.—(Special).—There were two sittings of the Committee on Privileges and Elections to-day, morning and afternoon, and the evidence adduced with reference to the doings at poll No. 3, Goderich, over which Mr. James Farr acted as deputy returning officer, was of the most damaging character.

In the first place the poll clerk's books showed that 118 ballots were found in the box, eleven ballots were not installed by the deputy returning officer in his pocket, and had space marked for McLean was picked up in the hall by one of the when Farr's attentions were called to it, and said: "Oh, Hell! That's nothing."

There were plenty of them about town yesterday. One witness swore that Farr told him he had been instructed the night before the election how to manipulate the ballots, and another witness swore that Farr had shown him a railway ticket for \$500 to keep out of the way. This was the day after Mr. Borden made his motion in the House for an investigation of the conduct of the deputy returning officer at the West Huron case. Taken altogether to-day's evidence strongly supported the contention that the "Machine" was in full working order, and nearly everybody seemed to "buy" it.

Ministers Stay Away.
The morning proceedings opened with a "wrap" owing to the committee being kept sitting nearly an hour because there was not a Minister present. There are four Ministers on the committee, Messrs. Blair, Davies, Mulock and Sifton, but this morning Sir Louis Davies was unwell, Mr. Blair was in the Wallway Committee, and it was a quarter to twelve before Mr. Sifton turned up. Mr. Borden protested vigorously against the committee being kept waiting in this manner. But his protest was of no avail.

Slight-of-Hand Man Worked This.
Henry Armstrong, poll clerk at poll No. 3, Goderich, Mr. James Farr's poll, being sworn and examined by Mr. Powell, said that 118 electors voted there, 40 voted for McLean and 72 for Holmes. There was one rejected ballot and two destroyed ballots.

"I think they were destroyed before the poll opened, I heard Mr. Farr say they were misprinted."
"Then there are 10 blank ballots?"
"Yes, they came out of the box after it was opened."
"And this one rejected ballot was voted?"
"Yes, it came out of the box, certainly. I think it was because we couldn't tell when it was marked."
"I want to get out of that box. How many ballots came out of that box. How many counted?"
"There were 123 came out of the box."

"After some hesitation witness answered, 'according to the statement.'"

MONTREAL PANIC IS NOW AT AN END

Financial Matters Have Resumed Their Normal Condition in the Metropolis

ALL QUIET AT THE BANKS

Hochelaga Weathered the Storm in Grand Style and Has "Bars" to Spare.

JACQUES CARTIER LOOKING UP

That Bank Likely to Resume Business Shortly—Nobody Will Lose Anything.

Montreal, Aug. 2.—(Special).—The panic is over, and matters financial have resumed their former state. In fact, some of the stocks showed more life than before the storm. Everything, too, is quiet at the banks. The Hochelaga weathered the storm in splendid style, that institution having called to pay out only a quarter of a million, when their own resources alone gave them two millions for immediate use. To-day a New York house visited President St. Charles to draw for any amount, but, of course, no assistance was required, either at home or abroad. At the bank there were a few people from the country talking over their deposits to-day, but the back of the run had been broken before 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon, and to-day it was not visible to the naked eye. Things also look better at the Jacques Cartier Bank, and it now looks as if that institution would resume business in a few days. One thing is certain: there will be no loss to anyone.

FEELING AT OTTAWA

Depositors in Jacques Cartier Bank's Branch at the Capital Feel Easy Over the Matter.

Ottawa, Aug. 2.—There are no developments to-day in the financial trouble of La Banque Jacques Cartier, in so far as the local branch of the institution is concerned. With the assurances given yesterday by the bank, as well as the exceptional circumstances under which it was compelled to suspend, the depositors feel confident the difficulty is only of a temporary character.

Mr. Arthur Charbonneau, the local manager, returned from Montreal to-day. He states that matters have calmed down considerably in that city, and the bank expects very shortly to reopen its doors and be prepared to meet all of its obligations. Among the depositors there is a feeling of sadness, and very few were at the branch this morning. Business is being carried on as usual, except the paying out of money.

The manager of La Banque Nationale states that there has been no run on his agency, but that several accounts will be transferred to the bank, owing to the suspension of the Ville Marie and Jacques Cartier Banks.
